Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech, delivered by the Lords Commissioners to both Houses of Parliament, on Wednesday, March 24, 1880.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

AS the time assigned by law for the termination of the present Parliament is near at hand, I am induced, by considerations of public policy and convenience, to select this period of the session for releasing you from your legislative duties, with a view to an immediate dissolution, and the issue of writs for a general election.

I cannot part from you without expressing my deep sense of the zeal and ability which, during more than six years, you have consistently displayed in exercising your important functions, nor without tendering to you my warm acknowledgments for the useful measures which you have submitted for my acceptance, and especially for the manner in which you have upheld a policy the object of which was at once to defend my Empire and to secure the general peace.

My relations with Foreign Powers are friendly, and favourable to the maintenance of tranquillity in Europe.

I entertain the confident hope that the measures adopted in Afghanistan will lead to a speedy settlement of that country.

I have had much satisfaction in assenting to the Acts you have passed for the relief of the distress unhappily prevalent in parts of Ireland, and trusting that these measures will be accepted by my Irish subjects as a proof of the ready sympathy of the Imperial Parliament, I look forward with confidence to the restored prosperity of their country.

I rejoice to observe the indications of a general improvement in trade, and that the commercial depression which I have had to lament appears to be passing away.

I have witnessed with the greatest sympathy the heavy losses sustained by the various classes connected with the cultivation of the soil, and have viewed with admiration the patience and high spirit with which they have contended against an almost unprecedented series of disastrous seasons.

I trust that, with the blessing of Providence, a more favourable harvest may be looked for, and that, from the Commission which I issued to inquire into the causes of agricultural depression, suggestions may come which will lead to the more profitable use of agricultural land, and to a higher development of this branch of national industry.

The electors of the United Kingdom will be called upon forthwith to choose their Representa-

tives in Parliament, and I fervently pray that the blessing of Almighty God may guide them to promote the object of my constant solicitude—the happiness of my people.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read; after which the Lord Chancellor said:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

By virtue of Her Majesty's Commission, under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do, in Her Majesty's name, and in obedience to Her commands, prorogue this Parliament to Tuesday, the thirteenth day of April next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Tuesday, the thirteenth day of April next.

WHEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of April next ensuing the date hereof; in order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Friday, the sixteenth day of April next, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the sixteen Peers, to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament, by open election, and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law), and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the names of the sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the Electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said city, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof, during the time of the said election, and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever. And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days, at least, before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

THE following Statute, made on the 20th day of March, 1880, by the University of Oxford Commissioners, appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, concerning a Readership in Roman Law, founded and endowed by All Souls' College, every part whereof is to be deemed a Statute both of the University of Oxford and of All Souls' College, has been submitted for the approval Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the said Act.

A STATUTE made by the University of Oxford Commissioners for the University of Oxford, and also for the College of the Souls of All Faithful People Deceased of Oxford, commonly called All Souls' College, as to a Readership in Roman Law founded and endowed by All Souls' College.

WE, the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in this behalf enabling us contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do by this present instrument, in writing, under our seal, make the following Statute for the University of Oxford and for the College of the Souls of All Faithful People Deceased of Oxford, commonly called All Souls' College, every part whereof is to be deemed a Statute both of the University and of the College;—

Inasmuch as the Warden and Fellows of All Souls' College have offered to pay annually the sum of four hundred pounds, so long as the Regius Professorship of Civil Law is held upon its present conditions, to be applied by the University to the endowment of a Readership in Roman Law, it is hereby provided that—

1. Until the Regius Professorship of Civil Law shall fall vacant, or until the existing Regius Professor shall, by his own consent, become subject to any Statutes for the future regulation of that Professorship and the duties of the Professor which may be made by the University of Oxford Commissioners, a Reader in Roman Law shall be appointed from time to time for successive periods of three years.

2. Any such Reader shall retain his office and be entitled to his stipend (unless he shall sooner resign the same) until the end of the period of three years for which he shall have been appointed, although in the meantime the Regius Professorship of Civil Law may have become vacant, or subject to any such Statutes to be hereafter made as aforesaid. And if any Statute shall be hereafter made by the University of Oxford Commissioners inconsistent with the continuance of such Readership no further appointment thereto shall be made after such Statute shall come into operation.

3. The Reader shall be elected by—

The Regius Professor of Civil Law;

The Chichele Professor of International Law and Diplomacy;

The Corpus Professor of Jurisprudence.

The Chairman for the time being of the Council of Legal Education appointed by the Inns of Court in London;

A person to be nominated by the Warden and Fellows of All Souls' College, with a view to each election.

No election shall be invalidated on account of any of the Professorships, the holders of which are Electors to the Readership being vacant at the time of the election.

Those Professors shall be Electors, notwithstanding any change in their titles or duties to be hereafter made by Statute.

4. Subject to any general Statute to be hereafter made by or for the University as to the residence of University Readers, the Reader shall be required to reside within the precincts of the University for six months in each year, between the tenth day of October and the first day of July next following.

5. Subject to any such Statute as aforesaid, as to the Lectures to be given by University Readers, the Reader shall lecture during seven weeks of each term (Easter and Trinity Terms being counted as one), twice at least in each week, on separate days. He shall take as the subject of his Lectures Roman Law and the Sources and History thereof. He shall also, during the period in each term over which his Lectures shall extend, be ready to give private instruction to the students attending his Lectures.

6. If any general statute, applying to all Readers, shall be hereafter made by or for the University on the subjects provided for by the two last preceding clauses, or either of them, the Reader shall be subject thereto.

7. The Reader shall receive annually the sum of four hundred pounds, to be paid to him by the Warden and Fellows of All Souls' College.

8. In case of misconduct or neglect of duty on the part of the Reader, the Vice-Chancellor and the Delegates of Appeals in Congregation, or the majority of them, shall have power to admonish him, or, if need be, to remove him from his office.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Wandsworth, in the County of Surrey;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said Parish of Wandsworth, held at the Vestry of All Saints Church, Wandsworth, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 19th day of September, 1878, it was resolved,—

“That the Poor Law Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vic., c. 57), entitled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force within this parish as regards that portion of it only which relates to the providing of accommodation for holding Vestry Meetings.”

“That the Churchwardens and Overseers be and they are hereby authorized, on obtaining the sanction of the Local Government Board, to purchase a piece of land on the north side of the High-street, having a frontage of about 68 feet, and a depth of about 154 feet, for the sum of £2,000, and to erect suitable buildings thereon for the purpose of holding any Vestry and other Meeting for the transaction of any business of or relating to the Parish, at a cost not exceeding £8,000.”

“That the Local Government Board be requested to allow the Poor Rates of the Parish to be charged with the repayment of the sum of £10,000, and interest thereon, by equal half-yearly instalments spread over a period of 30 years.”

And whereas application having been made to the Local Government Board in writing, pursuant to the above Resolutions, the said Board by an Order dated the 14th day of November, 1878, directed that so much of the Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings, should be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish, and directed the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish to purchase certain Land as a site for the erection of a suitable building for the purpose of holding any Vestry or other Meeting for the transaction of the business of or relating to the said Parish, and to borrow for that purpose a sum not exceeding Two Thousand Pounds; and the said Churchwardens and Overseers have purchased such Land accordingly:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order that the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall, for the purpose of erecting on the Land above referred to suitable buildings for holding Vestry or other Meetings, borrow a sum not exceeding Eight Thousand Pounds, and charge the Poor Rates of the said Parish with the repayment of such sum by equal annual instalments, together with the interest which shall from time to time accrue on the respective balances.
