BALTIC.—GULF OF RIGA.

(2.) *Fog Signal near Dome-Ness Lighthouse.*

The Russian Government has given notice, dated 30th January, 1880, that a fog-signal has been established near Dome-ness (Domesnäs) Lighthouse, at the extremity of the reef extending northward of Dome-ness Point, south side of entrance to Gulf of Riga.

The signal is a syren, and will be sounded during thick and foggy weather.

of Derby, and in the diocese of Lichfield one capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said consolidated chapelry and benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said consolidated chapelry and benefice.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Mary Magdalen, Southwark, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of two hundred and thirty-seven pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
