

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Lleian Gorslås, in the county of Carmarthen, and in the diocese of Saint David's, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same consolidated chapelry and benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Lleian Gorslås, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said consolidated chapelry and benefice, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Lleian Gorslås: Provided always, that the said yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds shall be and be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, which, subject to certain conditions, was granted by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the parish of Llanarthney, in the said county of Carmarthen (a portion of which parish has been included in the said consolidated chapelry and benefice of Saint Lleian Gorslås), towards a stipend for an Assistant-Curate, under the authority of an instrument sealed by us on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and published in the London Gazette of the twenty-first day of the same month and year: And provided also, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said consolidated chapelry and benefice, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of one thousand pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Wortley, near to Sheffield, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, and of a further benefaction, consisting of one acre or thereabouts of land, which has been permanently secured to the said benefice, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our
