under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Barber Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Tynemouth Priory and of the said new parish of Cullercoats Tynemouth which are described in the schedule hereunder written (all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint George Cullercoats.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Algernon George Duke of Northumberland his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint George Cullercoats

"All that portion of the new parish of Tynemouth Priory in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Durham which is bounded on the east partly by the eastern boundary of the said new parish upon the seashore, and partly by the new parish of Cullercoats Tynemouth in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the north by the last-named new parish and upon all other sides that is to say on the south-west and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Cullercoats Tynemouth from the new parish of Tynemouth Priory aforesaid at a point at Marden in the middle of the road leading from Whitley to Tynemouth and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to the angle where the same road bends sharply towards the southwest, at which angle a boundary stone inscribed 'C. St. G. D. 1880, No. 1' has been placed on the eastern side of the same road and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts thereby passing close to the south-western side of Kennersdean House to a boundary stone inscribed C. St. G. D. 1880, No. 2 and placed at the point where the footpath leading from Cullercoats past the eastern side of Kenners- | your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of

dean House into the road leading from Whitley to Tynemouth aforesaid is joined by the footpath leading across Percy Park Tynemouth into Percy Park-road and continuing thence still south-eastward along the middle of the lastdescribed footpath for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Percy Park-road aforesaid and with the road leading past the houses called or known respectively as Prudhoe-terrace and as Lovaine-row and extending thence eastward along the middle of the lastmentioned road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Front-street into Percy-gardens and continuing thence still eastward and in a direct line, thereby passing along the northern side of Rock-Cottage and crossing the Short Sands, to the eastern boundary of the said new parish of Tynemouth Priory upon the seashore as aforesaid and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of Cullercoats Tynemouth aforesaid which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the main body of the township of Cullercoats.'

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the said new parishes of Tynemouth Priory and Cullercoats Tynemouth out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and whereas the patron of the said new parishes of Tynemouth Priory and Cullercoats, Tynemouth and the incumbent of the said new parish of Cullercoats Tynemouth have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme and the incumbent of the said new parish of Tynemouth Priory has offered certain objections to the same scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has notwithstanding such objections been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of C. L. Peel. the said diocese of Durham.
