WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four ; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine ; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following ; that is to say :

“ We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty chapter forty-nine ; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Christopher situate within the limits of the township and antient chapelry of Pott Shrigley in the parish of Prestbury in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester.

“ Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Christopher situate within the limits of the township and antient chapelry of Pott Shrigley aforesaid.

“ Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Prestbury which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the township and antient chapelry of Pott Shrigley aforesaid all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Christopher situate within the limits of such township and antient chapelry as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Christopher Pott Shrigley.’

“ And with the like consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Christopher situate within the limits of the township and antient chapelry of Pott Shrigley as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being Provided always that so long as the Reverend Stephen Lea Wilson Clerk in Holy Orders the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Prestbury shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of the publication of banns of matrimony and of the solemnization or performance of marriages at the said church of Saint Christopher situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to
