## REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentleman who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is

Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

**W**HEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) enacted, that where the Board of Trade, upon the application of any Local Authority from time to time represent to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter the fees taken in respect of the verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such authority under the said Act (whether specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act, or in any Order previously made under the 47th section of the said Act), or for the purpose of adapting those fees to the local standards provided by such authority, to add to the said fees, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to alter or add to the said fees:

And whereas the Board of Trade have, upon the application of the Local Authorities for the counties, boroughs, and burghs named in Schedule A hereto annexed, represented to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter and add to the scale of fees taken in respect of such verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such Local Authorities in the manner set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the alterations and additions contained in the last-mentioned schedule are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to alter and add to the fees heretofore taken by the Inspectors of the Local Authorities for the coun-

ties, boroughs, and burghs named in Schedule A hereto annexed in the manner set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed; and the fees specified in the last-mentioned schedule shall be taken accordingly in lieu of the fees specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme having reference to the parish of Malpas situate partly in the county of Chester and partly in the county of Flint and wholly in the diocese of Chester.

"Whereas the said parish of Malpas is a parish in which both the profits and the spiritual charge are divided between two incumbents each having a mediety of the benefice, that is to say, of the benefice and rectory of Malpas.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester in pursuance of the Act firstly hereinbefore mentioned, has submitted to us a plan bearing date the twenty-second day of January in this present year one thousand eight hundred and eighty for constituting the said two medieties (known respectively as the Upper Mediety and the Lower Mediety) of the said benefice of Malpas into separate benefices as from the next avoidance of the said Lower Mediety of the same benefice by the names in the said plan appearing and for making certain other arrangements which are likely in the opinion of the said Bishop and in our opinion to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the said parish of Malpas that is to say within the same parish as it now is and also within two cures called respectively the Holy Trinity Bickerton and Saint Chad Malpas now otherwise known as and hereinafter called Saint Chad Tushingham which said cures were formed out of the same parish of Malpas.

"And whereas the said plan (as by the same appears) has the consent of the patrons of the Upper Mediety of the said benefice of Malpas, and of the patron of the Lower Mediety of the same benefice and also has the consent of the rector or incumbent of the said Upper Mediety and of the rector or incumbent of the said Lower Mediety which said two rectors are (as by the said plan appears) joint patrons as such of the said cure of the Holy Trinity Bickerton and of the said cure of Saint Chad Tushingham.

"And whereas the said plan is in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England.

"I William Lord Bishop of Chester under and by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty chapter 113 have, with the consent (testified as hereinafter is mentioned) of the Most Honourable William Henry Hugh Marquess of Cholmondeley and Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake of Sharncliffe in the county of Buckingham Esquire alternate patrons of the Upper Mediety of the benefice and rectory of Malpas situate partly in the county of Chester and partly in the county of Flint and wholly in my diocese of Chester and of the said Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake patron of the Lower Mediety of the said benefice, framed the following plan for constituting the said two medieties into separate benefices and for making other arrangements such as I judge likely to promote the efficient discharge of pastoral duties in the ancient parish of Malpas that is to say both in that portion of the said ancient parish of Malpas wherein the two rectors of the same parish still jointly possess exclusive cure of souls and also in those portions of the same ancient parish of Malpas which have been formed into separate ecclesiastical districts and which are now become new parishes for ecclesiastical purposes which said plan being a plan framed so as not to prejudice the interests of any existing incumbent I do hereby submit for consideration by you the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and request that the same may be carried into effect as in the said Act is provided whereas the said benefice of Malpas hath from time immemorial been divided into and is now held in two medieties being the said Upper and Lower Medieties hereinbefore referred to and the rector of each mediety hath from time immemorial had joint cure of souls in and over the said parish of Malpas with the rector of the other mediety and whereas the said parish of Malpas contains two churches one being the parish church of the said parish of Malpas and the other being a chapel of ease thereto situated at Whitewell in the township of Iscoyd in that part of the said ancient parish of Malpas which is situate in the county of Flint aforesaid which said chapel of ease was consecrated in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two by the name of 'The Church of Saint Mary Whitewell' and is distant from the said parish church five miles and upwards. And whereas the said church of Saint Mary Whitewell hath a churchyard or burial ground adjoining or belonging thereto which hath been duly consecrated as a churchyard or place of Christian burial of the dead. And whereas the endowments of the said Upper Mediety of the benefice of Malpas consist of a glebe house and glebe lands situate at Malpas aforesaid comprising altogether ninety-four acres two roods and thirty-seven perches, and one moiety of a commuted tithe rent-charge of one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one pounds

twelve shillings and ten pence a year exclusively charged upon specific lands in the ancient parish of Malpas and of one half of the surplice fees at the said parish church and at the said chapel of Whitewell which fees upon an average of the last three years have together amounted to the sum of nine pounds two shillings and four pence and two-thirds of one penny per annum. And whereas the endowments of the said Lower Mediety of the benefice of Malpas consist of a glebe house and glebe lands also situate at Malpas aforesaid comprising altogether thirty-two acres three roods and twelve perches and of the other moiety of the said commuted tithe rent-charge of one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one pounds twelve shillings and ten pence a year and one half of the said surplice fees and whereas the concurrent jurisdiction of the said rectors of the said Upper and Lower Medieties of the benefice of Malpas over the said parish of Malpas hath for a long time been found to be most inconvenient and it is desirable that each of the said two medieties shall be constituted a separate benefice with separate and exclusive cure of souls and whereas part of ancient parish of Malpas aforesaid was in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three assigned as a particular district to the church of the Holy Trinity Bickerton within the said ancient parish and the said particular district hath since become a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes and whereas other part of the said ancient parish of Malpas was in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty formed into a district chapelry by the title of 'The District Chapelry of Saint Chad Malpas' and the same district chapelry has since become a new parish for ecclesiastical purposes and is commonly known as and is hereinafter alternatively called by the name of 'Saint Chad Tushingham' the church of the same new parish and benefice being situate in the township of Tushingham and whereas it is desirable to make better provision for the spiritual duties of the said new parishes of the Holy Trinity Bickerton and of Saint Chad Malpas otherwise Saint Chad Tushingham which said new parishes respectively contain a large population and are ill endowed and whereas the said rectors of the said Upper and Lower Medieties of the said benefice of Malpas are jointly as such rectors the patrons of the said new parishes and of the benefices thereof and they have with the consent of the said William Henry Hugh Marquess of Cholmondeley and with my consent agreed with the said Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake that the patronage of the said new parishes shall in consideration of the better provision hereinafter proposed for their endowment out of that portion of the tithes of the said parish of Malpas which belongs to the said Lower Mediety be vested in the said Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake in manner hereinafter expressed and whereas it is proposed that this present plan shall not take effect until the said next avoidance of the Lower Mediety of Malpas of which the Reverend Charles William Cox Clerk in Holy Orders is now the rector or existing incumbent and he and the Honourable and Reverend William Trevor Kenyon Clerk in Holy Orders the rector or existing incumbent of the Upper Mediety of Malpas aforesaid are satisfied and admit by their signing and sealing this plan that the same will not prejudice or affect the interests of such existing incumbents respectively.

"Now I the said William Bishop of Chester with the consent as well of the said William Henry Hugh Marquess of Cholmondeley and Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake testified by their respectively signing and sealing this present plan as of the said

William Trevor Kenyon and Charles William Cox also testified as aforesaid do propose:—

“That from and immediately after the next avoidance of the Lower Mediety of the said benefice of Malpas the same benefice (now held in medieties as aforesaid) shall be divided into two separate benefices and rectories. That one of such two benefices and rectories shall be called the benefice and rectory of Malpas and shall consist of all that part of the ancient parish of Malpas which is described in the first schedule hereunder written (all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed and entitled ‘A map of the benefice and rectory of Malpas’ and is therein coloured green) and that the said parish church of Malpas shall be the parish church of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas in the same manner in all respects as it now is the parish church of the ancient parish of Malpas it being the intention of this plan that that part of the said ancient parish which as aforesaid is described in the said first schedule hereunder written shall so far as may be continue to be or to represent the same ancient parish of Malpas.

“That the other of the said two benefices and rectories shall be called the benefice and rectory of Whitewell and shall consist of all that part of the ancient parish of Malpas which is described in the second schedule hereunder written (all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed and entitled ‘A map of the benefice and rectory of Whitewell’ and is therein coloured red, and that the said church of Saint Mary Whitewell shall be the parish church of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell.

“That each of the said two separate benefices shall be deemed to be a benefice and a rectory and the spiritual persons serving the same respectively shall be rectors and shall have respectively exclusive cure of souls within the limits of their respective benefices and shall be subject to the laws, provisions, and regulations as to presentation and appointment and as to institution collation and induction (save as hereinafter is expressed and provided) and as to holding benefices and to all such jurisdiction of the bishop or other jurisdiction as are by law now applicable to the said two medieties of the said benefice of Malpas aforesaid.

“That the endowments of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas shall be the said glebe house and glebe lands, comprising altogether ninety-four acres two roods and thirty-seven perches, of the said Upper Mediety of Malpas and the commuted tithe-rent charges now payable out of the several townships in the ancient parish of Malpas to the rectors of Malpas mentioned and specified in the third schedule hereunder written amounting altogether to nine hundred and sixteen pounds sixteen shillings, and all the said endowments shall be held and enjoyed by the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas as fully and freely and with the same rights privileges and beneficial interest therein as the endowments of the said Upper Mediety of Malpas now are held and enjoyed by the said William Trevor Kenyon the present rector of the said Upper Mediety.

“That banns of matrimony shall be published and baptisms churchings marriages and burials shall as heretofore be performed and solemnized in the church of the said benefice and rectory of Malpas being the present parish church of Malpas and that the fees for all such offices performed and solemnized within the limits of that part of the said parish of Malpas which is des-

cribed in the said first schedule hereunder written and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the rector of the said intended rectory and benefice of Malpas.

“That the advowson of or right of presentation of a minister or incumbent to the church of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas shall be vested in the said William Henry Hugh Marquess of Cholmondeley and Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake the alternate patrons of the said Upper Mediety of Malpas as aforesaid as alternate patrons thereof and their respective successors in title and assigns to be held and enjoyed in the same right and for the same estate and estates as the said advowson or right of presentation of the Upper Mediety of Malpas now is or would have been held if this plan had not been made and so that the said advowson of or right of presentation to the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas shall be considered and taken to represent and be in place of the advowson or right of presentation to the said Upper Mediety of the rectory of Malpas to and for all intents and purposes whatsoever.

“That the said William Trevor Kenyon or other the rector for the time being of the said Upper Mediety of the benefice of Malpas shall immediately upon the next avoidance of the said Lower Mediety of the said benefice of Malpas being the date at which the division of the said benefice of Malpas into two benefices and rectories is intended to take effect as aforesaid become and be the first rector or incumbent of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas without any presentation admission institution or induction or process of law or other process whatsoever subject nevertheless to all engagements and liabilities (if any) affecting him as rector or incumbent of the Upper Mediety of the rectory and parish church of Malpas aforesaid which engagements and liabilities (if any) shall attach and belong to him as rector or incumbent of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas in like manner and as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as if he had remained rector or incumbent of the said Upper Mediety of the said present benefice of Malpas.

“That the inhabitants of that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the said first schedule hereunder written shall be exonerated from all liability (if any) to repair the said church of Saint Mary Whitewell or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the said second schedule hereunder written.

“That the endowments of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell shall be the said glebe-house and glebe-lands, comprising altogether thirty-two acres three roods and twelve perches, of the said Lower Mediety of Malpas and the commuted tithe rent-charges now payable out of the several townships in the ancient parish of Malpas to the rectors of Malpas mentioned and specified in the fourth schedule hereunder written amounting altogether to three hundred and ninety-nine pounds, and all the said last-mentioned endowments shall be held and enjoyed by the rector or incumbent for the time being of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell as fully and freely and with the same rights privileges and beneficial interests therein as the endowments of the said Lower Mediety of Malpas now are held and enjoyed by the said Charles William Cox, the present rector of the said Lower Mediety of Malpas.

“That banns of matrimony shall be published and baptisms churchings marriages and burials shall be performed and solemnized in the church of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell being the church of Saint Mary Whitewell aforesaid and that the fees for all such offices performed and solemnized within the limits of that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the said second schedule hereunder written and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the rector of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell.

“That all persons being inhabitants of that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the second schedule hereunder written whose relatives shall have been buried in vaults or graves existing in the said parish church of Malpas or in the present churchyard thereof at the time when this plan shall take effect, shall and may notwithstanding the division of the said benefice of Malpas into two benefices and rectories as aforesaid be buried in such vaults or graves so far as the same are available for the purposes of burial and the like dues only shall be payable in respect of such burials to the rector, parish clerk, and sexton of the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas as if the persons so buried had been parishioners of the ancient parish of Malpas but in all other cases in respect of burial and the right of burial at the said parish church of Malpas the persons being inhabitants as last aforesaid shall be and be considered as non-parishioners of Malpas.

“That the advowson or right of presentation of a minister or incumbent to the church of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell shall be vested in the said Thomas Tyrwhitt Drake the patron of the said Lower Mediet of Malpas aforesaid and his successors in title and assigns to be held and enjoyed in the same right and for the same estate and estates as the said advowson or right of presentation to the Lower Mediet of Malpas now is or would have been held and enjoyed if this plan had not been made.

“That as soon as conveniently may be after the said division of the said present benefice of Malpas into two benefices and rectories shall have been made as aforesaid all practicable steps shall be taken to effect a sale, under the provisions of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 57 or other statutory authority in that behalf then existing, of the glebe lands situate at Malpas aforesaid, of the said Lower Mediet of Malpas which as aforesaid are to become and form part of the endowments of the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell and for applying the proceeds of such sale in and towards the provision of a house of residence and glebe lands at Whitewell aforesaid.

“That the persons being inhabitants of that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the second schedule hereunder written shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said parish church of Malpas or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected within that part of the said parish of Malpas which is described in the said first schedule hereunder written.

“That the first fruits and tenths and all other outgoing and payments if any now charged upon the Upper Mediet of the said present benefice of Malpas shall from and immediately after the said division of the said present benefice of Malpas into two benefices and rectories shall have been

made as aforesaid be charged upon the said intended benefice and rectory of Malpas.

“That of the sums of forty-four pounds nineteen shillings and two pence first fruits and four pounds nine shillings and eleven pence tenths respectively charged upon the Lower Mediet of the said present benefice of Malpas the sum of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings and nine pence first fruits and the sum of one pound nineteen shillings and eleven pence tenths respectively from and immediately after the said division shall have been made as aforesaid shall together with all other outgoing and payments if any other than first fruits and tenths charged upon the Lower Mediet of Malpas aforesaid be charged upon the said intended benefice and rectory of Whitewell.

“And that the remainder of the said first fruits and tenths respectively charged upon the Lower Mediet of the said rectory of Malpas shall be charged and paid as hereinafter is provided.

“That from and after the next avoidance of the Lower Mediet of Malpas aforesaid the commuted tithe rent-charges payable to the rectors of Malpas out of the townships in the ancient parish of Malpas which are mentioned and specified in the fifth schedule hereunder written amounting altogether to two hundred and ninety-five pounds six shillings and ten pence shall belong and be paid and payable to the vicar or other incumbent for the time being of the said church and benefice of the Holy Trinity Bickerton and his successors in augmentation of the endowments of the said benefice and for improving the value and making better provision for the spiritual duties of the new parish and benefice of the Holy Trinity Bickerton aforesaid.

“That of the said sums of forty-four pounds nineteen shillings and two pence first fruits and of four pounds nine shillings and eleven pence tenths respectively charged upon the Lower Mediet of the rectory of Malpas aforesaid, the sums of fourteen pounds nineteen shillings and nine pence first fruits and of one pound and ten shillings tenths shall from and after the next avoidance of the said Lower Mediet be charged upon the said benefice of the Holy Trinity Bickerton and shall be paid by the vicar or incumbent thereof.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew situate in Monton-lane in the parish of Eccles in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Eccles and of the district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, within the original limits of the parish of Eccles aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and district chapelry respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Eccles and of the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew situate in Monton-lane as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the perpetual curacy of the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Hugh MacCalmont Earl Cairns Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting on behalf of your Majesty as the patron in right of the Crown of the vicarage of the said parish of Eccles (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in

our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Eccles and of the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Andrew situate in Monton-lane as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eccles.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Eccles, being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Eccles in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by the district chapelry of Saint Catherine Barton-upon-Irwell within the original limits of the said parish of Eccles or in other words for the most part by the River Irwell on the west by the district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, also within the original limits of the parish of Eccles aforesaid and upon all other sides that is to say on the north and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, from the parish of Eccles aforesaid at a point where the road called or known as Clifton-road joins Slack-lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Monton-lane and with Half Edge-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as 'Abbey-grove' and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six and three-quarters chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wellington-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lower Albert-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of six and a quarter chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing over the line of the Liverpool and Manchester Branch of the London and North-Western Railway) to the point where the said last-named street is joined by Russell-street and by Peel-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eleven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Barton-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with George-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as 'Irwell Grove' and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named

road for a distance of nearly two chains to its junction with Gipsy-lane and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its south-eastern end and continuing thence still south-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the boundary in the middle of the River Irwell aforesaid which boundary divides the said parish of Eccles from the district chapelry of Saint Catherine Barton-upon-Irwell aforesaid.

"And also all those two contiguous portions of the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, which are speaking generally bounded on the north partly by the new parish of Saint Mark, Worsley, and partly by the new parish of Saint Peter, Swinton, both in the county and diocese aforesaid on the south-east by the parish of Eccles aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say on the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Eccles from the district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, aforesaid at the point where Trafford-road (formerly called 'Back-lane') is joined by Robert-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fourteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Liverpool-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction on the eastern side of the building called or known as the 'Patricroft Police Station' with the footpath which leads past the eastern end of Cromwell-road to the eastern end of the road called or known as 'Hampden Grove' and extending thence that is from the said Liverpool-road northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of eleven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the point on the southern side of the line of the said Liverpool and Manchester Branch of the London and North Western Railway aforesaid where at the eastern end of 'Hampden Grove' aforesaid the same footpath joins the footpath leading into Ellesmere-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described footpath for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to a point at the southern end of the bridge which carries the said lastly-mentioned footpath over the said branch line of railway and also over the Manchester Eccles Tyldesley and Wigan Branch of the London and North Western Railway aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, from the parish of Eccles aforesaid and extending thence northward along the said boundary (that is along the middle of the said bridge) for a distance of thirty-five yards or thereabouts to a point in or over the middle of the last-named branch line of railway and extending thence that is from the said boundary north-westward along the middle of the last-named branch line of railway for a distance of sixty-five and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the boundary at Folly Brook which boundary divides the said district chapelry of Christ Church, Patricroft, from the new parish of Saint Mark, Worsley aforesaid."

Sanitary Rules of the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana, regulating Shipping in the Port of New Orleans.

Circular No. 3.

Office Board of Health, State House,  
Corner St. Louis and Royal-streets,  
April 22, 1880.

I. Resolved by the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana that, in order to prevent the introduction and spread of contagious and infectious diseases, therefore the President of the Board of Health is empowered to inspect the shipping in the port of New Orleans, either in person or through the Sanitary Inspectors, and to enforce the following rules and regulations:—

II. All captains, masters, or medical officers of any water craft are hereby required to report:

within twenty-four hours to the President of the Board of Health, at the office of the Board of Health, all cases within their cognizance of Asiatic cholera, yellow fever, remittent and congestive malarial fevers, typhus or ship fever, scarlet fever, small pox, varioloid, measles, diphtheria, plague, leprosy, or any other case that may at any time be specified by the Board of Health, and in default or failure to so report such cases, such person so failing or in default shall be liable to a fine not to exceed fifty dollars; provided, however, that said Board may declare it unnecessary to report further cases when any disease shall have been pronounced epidemic.

III. Whenever it shall be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction and spread of contagious and infectious diseases, every vessel or water-craft, arriving from a foreign port, shall be visited by the President of the Board of Health, or his deputy inspectors, between sunrise and sunset, as soon as possible after such arrival; and the President or his deputy inspectors shall examine the bill of health, and inspect the ship or vessel, and require of the captain or master answers in duplicate to the following questions:—

Sanitary Rules recommended by the Board of Health of the State of Louisiana, to be observed by vessels during their stay in the Port of New

Orleans; and in other ports, and on their passage to and from New Orleans:—

(a.) Each ocean going steamship or sailing vessel should be provided with a competent medical officer versed in the sanitation and hygiene of ships sailing in tropical and semi-tropical waters.

(b.) Physicians attached to ships, steamships, or vessels of any description should be considered as the health officers, and should be charged with the duty of watching their sanitary condition, and with the conduct of those operations which will promote in the highest degree the health of the officers, crew, and passengers; and prevent as far as possible the introduction of contagious and infectious diseases.

(c.) As far as possible, the commerce of New Orleans, with insular, tropical, and sub-tropical America should be conducted by *acclimated* officers and crews. By the term *acclimated*, is understood those who have suffered at some period of their lives with yellow fever.

(d.) The attention of the captain, master, or medical officer shall at all times and under all circumstances be directed to the personal cleanliness of the crew, and to their food and drinking water.

(e.) None of the crew should be allowed to sleep on shore at night, or on deck, unless protected by an awning.

(f.) When in tropical and semi-tropical ports, the officers and men should hold as little intercourse with the shore as possible.

(g.) Unless when engaged in the reception or discharge of cargo, vessels should lie in the harbour as far as practicable from the shore.

(h.) Earth, sand, or soft porous rock should not be used as ballast. As far as practicable the ballast should consist of hard rock, iron, or other metals.

(i.) All vessels loading or unloading should pump out the bilge water and wash out with fresh water, until the bilge water shall be odourless. Then a solution of one part of carbolic acid (Calvert's No. V) to fifty parts of water, or the following compound should be introduced and allowed to remain:

Sulphate of iron (copperas) sixty pounds.

Carbolic acid (Calvert's No. V) two gallons.

Water, sixty gallons.

Every five days on the passage undiluted carbolic acid should be poured down the pump or sounding tube, and the entire hold and between decks sprinkled with one part carbolic acid (Calvert's No. V) to fifty parts of water.

When practicable it is especially recommended that the hold should be fumigated with sulphurous acid gas, or chlorine gas.

As far as practicable the hatches should be kept open, both while in port or at sea, and the largest possible amount of fresh air be introduced between and below decks, by the use of wind sails and ventilators. White-washing of the unpainted wood-work below and between decks is recommended.

(j.) At the close of each day, while in tropical and sub-tropical ports, all the crew should wash their entire persons, leaving off all the clothing worn that day (for washing), and dress in clean flannels and clothing throughout.

As soon as the weather will permit after leaving port, all mattresses, bedding, and similar material should be got up on deck and sunned and aired for several hours, this to be repeated every two or five days during the passage, if the weather permits.

(k.) All baggage and clothing of passengers should be exposed to the air, and disinfected or

fumigated as soon as possible after coming on board, and again before arriving at Quarantine Station and the harbour of New Orleans.

(*l.*) Baggage-rooms, water-closets, dirty linen, lockers, cabins, and berths, should be kept thoroughly clean and disinfected.

(*m.*) The quarters of the crew should be kept clean and disinfected.

The Captain and Medical Officer should direct their especial attention to the general hygiene of the crew and passengers.

#### Filey Harbour.

(Modification of the Filey Pier and Harbour Order, 1878, and the Act confirming same; Alteration and Extension of authorized Pier and Works; Extension of Limits of Harbour, and for Levying Rates; Dissolution of the Filey Fishery Harbour and Pier Company Limited.

**A**PPPLICATION will be made to the House of Commons by petition, as soon as the forms of the House admit, for leave to introduce a Bill in the present session for the following purposes:—

1. To dissolve the Filey Fishery Harbour and Pier Company Limited (hereinafter called "The Old Company"), to cancel the memorandum and articles of association of that Company; to reconstitute that Company by the name of the Filey Harbour Company, or such other name as may be defined in the intended Act; and to

incorporate the shareholders of the Old Company with others into the New Company.

2. To vest in the New Company all lands, works, rights, property, and powers of the Old Company, or some of them, with the benefit of all contracts and engagements entered into by or on behalf of the Old Company, and to empower the New Company to hold and avail themselves of the same.

3. To enable the New Company to alter and extend the works authorized by the said Filey Pier and Harbour Order, and to make and maintain instead thereof the works hereinafter described, namely:—(a) A solid pier or breakwater commencing near high water at ordinary spring tides, about 30 yards north of the boundary line between the North and East Ridings of the county of York, at the junction of such line with the sea, being the point at which the pier firstly

described in the said Order is authorized to commence and thence extending seawards in the same direction and situation as the said authorized pier, for a distance of about 820 yards, thence further extending seaward in the same (easterly) direction for about 530 yards, and thence curving in a north-easterly direction for a further distance of about 150 yards, and terminating in the sea about 275 yards southward of low-water line on Filey Brigg. The said pier as altered and extended being intended to be about 1,500 yards in length. (b) A solid pier or breakwater commencing at Carr Naze Point, extending in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the Brigg and Spittal Rocks for a distance of about 600 yards, and thence curving for about 100 yards in a southerly direction to and terminating at a point in the sea about 100 yards on the west side of the extremity of the said rocks, and about 180 yards eastward of the termination of the pier or breakwater firstly hereinbefore-described. The said pier being intended to be about 700 yards in length. The said works, so far as they will be situated upon land, being in the township and parish of Filey, in the North Riding of the county of York.

4. To make, in connection with the aforesaid works, shipping and landing places, quays, tramways, warehouses, and other buildings, cranes, lifts, buoys, moorings, and other works and conveniences, and to dredge and deepen from time to time the bed or shore of the sea within the limits of the harbour.

5. To enable the New Company to purchase by agreement and hold any of the lands referred to in the said Order and shown on the deposited plans therein mentioned, and to deviate in constructing the said works laterally or vertically.

6. To extend the limits within which the Old Company were authorized to levy rates by the said Provisional Order to the extent of one hundred yards southward and three hundred and fifty yards eastward of the limits as therein defined, and to transfer to the New Company the power to levy within the said extended limits the rates and dues authorized by the said Provisional Order.

7. To alter and repeal the said Order and the Act confirming the same (Pier and Harbours Orders Confirmation Act, 1878, No. 1) so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Bill.

Duplicate plans and sections describing the lines, situation, and levels of the proposed works, and the lands in or through which they will be made, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners and lessees, or reputed owners and lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands, and a copy of this notice will, before the 20th day of May instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the North Riding of the county of York, at his office at Northallerton, and with the parish clerk of the said parish of Filey, at his place of abode.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited at the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, if and as soon as leave be given to introduce the Bill, and may be obtained on and after the said 20th day of May, at the offices of the undersigned.
