“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Carlinghow in the new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

“Whereas at extremities of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill, of the new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the parish of Batley in the same county and diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such cures respectively.

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill of the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe and of the said parish of Batley should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Carlinghow as aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Gateward Davies the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Batley, and as such vicar or incumbent the patron both of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill and also of the vicarage of the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe and with the consent of the Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Wilton as the alternate patron of the said vicarage of the parish of Batley aforesaid and with the consents of Barwell Ewins Bennett of Marston Trussel Hall in the county of Northampton Esquire, and of the Honourable Algernon William Fulke Greville of number 52 Great Cumberland-place in the county of Middlesex, late a Captain in your Majesty's First Regiment of Life Guards surviving Trustees acting under the will (which has been duly proved) of the Right Honourable James Thomas Earl of Cardigan deceased as the other alternate patron of the said vicarage of the parish of Batley aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed

this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill of the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe and of the said parish of Batley which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Carlinghow aforesaid and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist Carlinghow.’”

“We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“SCHEDULE.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Carlinghow, being:—

“All those several contiguous portions of the new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill of the new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe and of the parish of Batley all in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the south-western side of White Lee-road at the south-western end of Smithies Moor where the boundaries of the Parliamentary borough of Dewsbury of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill of the new parish of Saint James Heckmondwike in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe aforesaid all meet and extending thence first southward and then south-eastward along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Heckmondwike from the new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe aforesaid for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts (thereby passing along the western side of White Lee Common and following in part the course of Waste-lane) to the point at Dale-lane Top where the said Waste-lane is joined by a road which connects it with White Lee-road aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said connecting road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said White Lee-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed ‘C. St. J. C. C. 1880 No. 1,’ and placed at or near to the junction of the said White Lee-road with the road which leads to the house or houses called or known as White Lee that is at the southernmost of the two angles made by the sides of the roads thus joining and extending thence that is from the said boundary-stone in a south-easterly direction and in a straight line for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts (thereby crossing Coal Pit-lane) to a boundary-stone inscribed ‘C. St. J. C. C. 1880 No. 2,’ and placed on or near to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe from the parish of Batley aforesaid at the point at or near to Oldroyd's-buildings where the footpath leading from Healey to Carlinghow leaves the footpath leading from Healey to Batley and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary-stone still eastward along the middle of the last-described footpath for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed ‘C. St.

J. C. C. 1880 No. 3,' and placed at or near to the point where the same footpath strikes the south-western boundary of the Batley Cemetery and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts across the said cemetery (thereby passing a little to the north-west of the cemetery chapel) to a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. St. J. C. C. 1880 No. 4,' and placed on the north-eastern side of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the same cemetery at a point opposite to the middle of the south-western end of Upton-street and extending thence, that is from the last-mentioned boundary-stone still north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of five and three-quarters chains or thereabouts to its junction with North-street and extending thence south-eastward for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts along the middle of the last-named street and along the middle of Blake-ridge-lane to the junction of the last-named lane with Melton-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of five and three-quarters chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thomas-street and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bradford-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said Bradford-road for a distance of thirteen and three-quarters chains or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria-street and extending thence in a direction due north-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of three and a half chains or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'C. St. J. C. C. 1880 No. 5,' and placed on the south-western side of the line of the Birstal Branch of the London and North Western Railway at a distance of five chains or thereabouts (measured in a direct line) to the south-east of the centre of the bridge which carries the same branch line of railway over Carlinghow Hill-lane and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary stone north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point at the centre of the last-described railway bridge upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Batley from the new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill aforesaid and continuing thence still north-westward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through or by the Carlinghow Station on the same branch line of railway and passing Carlinghow Corn Mill) to the point where the boundary where the Parliamentary borough of Dewsbury before-mentioned crosses the middle of the same branch line of railway and extending thence south-westward along the said Parliamentary borough boundary for a distance of sixty-seven chains or thereabouts to the first described point on the south-western side of White Lee-road where the boundaries of the said Parliamentary borough of Dewsbury of the said new parish of Saint Saviour Brownhill of the said new parish of Saint James Heckmondwike and of the said new parish of Christ Church Staincliffe all meet as aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in

law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the third day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the Library in the Palace of the Archbishops of Canterbury at Lambeth.

"Whereas by the seventh section of the above-mentioned Act after reciting that the public had for a long period had access to the said library at certain periods and under certain restrictions and that the cost of the custody and maintenance thereof had been theretofore defrayed out of the gross revenues arising from the estates of the See of Canterbury and that such estates had become transferred to us it was enacted that the cost of the maintenance of such library and of the custody of the books therein might if we should think fit by the authority of a scheme passed by us and of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same be defrayed out of the rents and profits of such estates.

"And whereas a scheme was duly passed by us under the provisions of the said recited Act on the twenty-ninth day of July one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine and approved by an Order of your Majesty in Council made on the tenth day of August in the same year and by the said Order provision was made for executing such repairs of the fabric of the said library as we might consider necessary or desirable and also for placing the books and manuscripts in the said library in a proper state of repair at our expense and under our direction and it was by the said Order also provided that there should be paid by us to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being the annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to be expended by him in providing for the custody of the books and manuscripts contained in such library, in maintaining the same when repaired as aforesaid in a fitting condition and in rendering the same accessible to the public at such times and subject to such restrictions as we should have previously approved provided that, subject to such restrictions, access to the said library should be secured to the public during a period of nine months in every year on three days (at the least) in every week for not less than three hours on each day and that all the payments aforesaid should be made out of the rents and profits of the estates formerly belonging to the See of Canterbury which had been transferred to us.

"And whereas since the date of the said Order of your Majesty in Council the said annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds has been paid

by us to the said Archbishop in the manner and subject to the provisions expressed in the said Order and the said library has accordingly since the same date been made accessible to the public in the manner set forth in the said Order.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the present Archbishop of Canterbury and we are of opinion that it is desirable to provide increased facilities for the use by the public of the said library and with that view to make arrangements for the said library being open to readers during a greater number of hours in the day than heretofore and also for its being opened more frequently than heretofore in order that books may be conveniently borrowed therefrom under such regulations and restrictions as may seem to be necessary.

"And whereas in order to secure the provision of such increased facilities as aforesaid it appears to us to be reasonable and proper to increase the amount now annually paid by us to the said Archbishop as aforesaid and that such annual payment should be accordingly increased from one hundred and fifty pounds to two hundred and fifty pounds.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that there shall be paid by us to the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year the annual sum of two hundred and fifty pounds and that the first of such half-yearly payments or a proportionate part thereof calculated from the day on which the intended new regulations shall have come into operation shall be made on the first day of July next Provided always that no payment to be made by us for or in respect of any one half-year as aforesaid shall exceed in amount the sum which shall have been proved by certificate from the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being or otherwise to our satisfaction to have been actually expended by the said Archbishop for the time being in respect of the same half-year in providing for the custody of the books and manuscripts contained in such library, in maintaining the same in a fitting condition and in rendering the same accessible to the public at such times and subject to such restrictions as we shall have previously approved Provided also that subject to such restrictions, access to the said library shall be secured to the public during a period of nine months in every year on four days (at the least) in every week for not less than six hours on each such day and that the payments aforesaid be made out of the rents and profits of the estates belonging to the See of Canterbury which have been transferred to us.

"And we further recommend and propose that the provisions contained in the hereinbefore mentioned Order of your Majesty in Council relative to the repair of the fabric of the said library and to the repair of the books and manuscripts therein shall continue in force as heretofore.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in conformity with the said hereinbefore recited Act or any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Ma-

esty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas the Right Reverend John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool has proposed to us and has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that a new archdeaconry should be constituted within the diocese of Liverpool and should comprise and consist of that portion of the same diocese which is described in the schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposal of the said bishop should be carried into effect in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the average net annual income of the said proposed archdeaconry from fees dues and emoluments will be of nominal amount.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (in testimony of which consent he hath set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order there shall be created within the said diocese of Liverpool one new archdeaconry to be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Warrington' and to comprise and consist of those rural deaneries now portion of the same diocese the names of which are set forth in the said schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and inhabitants of the said Archdeaconry of Warrington shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of Warrington for the time being and that the said Archdeacon of Warrington shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of his archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorized to pay yearly and every year out of the common fund created by the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen to the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Warrington hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be created and to

his successors in the same archdeaconry the sum of two hundred pounds per annum such yearly payment to be made upon the first day of January in every year in respect of the twelve calendar months ended that day Provided always that the first payment so to be made by us as aforesaid shall be proportional to the period which shall have elapsed between the date of the institution of the first archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Warrington and the first day of January next following the date of such institution and that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be apportionable between the archdeacon (or as the case may be the representatives of an archdeacon) who has resigned or otherwise avoided the said Archdeaconry of Warrington on any day other than the first day of January in any year and the archdeacon who shall next thereafter be instituted to the same archdeaconry and that every such yearly payment shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon who applies (or whose representatives apply) for it has during the previous year complied with the conditions as to residence which at the date of such application are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing hereinafter contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The Archdeaconry of Warrington comprising and consisting of the following three Rural Deaneries namely:—

The Rural Deanery of Liverpool, South.
The Rural Deanery of Prescot, and
The Rural Deanery of Winwick."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, late one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with certain modifications:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twentieth day of April last, to give notice, of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order, animals brought from Her Majesty's Possessions in North America to the port of Liverpool may be transhipped in the River Mersey from the vessel in which they are brought into another vessel for conveyance to a dock, quay, wharf or other place of landing within the port of Liverpool, approved by the Privy Council under article 102 of The Animals Order, subject to the following conditions:

First. That the owner, agent, or charterer of the landing-vessel has received the special

permission of the Privy Council and of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

Second. That the landing-vessel is not without the permission of the Privy Council to be used for carrying any animals other than animals which have been brought from Her Majesty's Possessions in North America to the port of Liverpool, and have not been landed there.

3. Animals transhipped under this Order shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs; and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the dock, quay, wharf or other place of landing.

4. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that dock, quay, wharf or other place of landing, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

5. Animals so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the master of the landing-vessel, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878. *C.
