WHEREAS by section 18 of "The Extradition Act, 1870," it is among other things enacted, that if by any Law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such Law or Ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by a Law enacted by the Legislature of the Transvaal Province, the short title of which is "The Extradition Law, Transvaal, 1880," it is provided that "all powers vested in" and acts authorized or required to be done by a "Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace" in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals "in the United Kingdom under 'The Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873,' are thereby vested in" and may in the Province be exercised and done "by any Landdrost in relation to the surrender "of fugitive criminals under the said Acts":

And whereas it is further provided by the said Law that the said Law shall not come into operation until Her Majesty shall, by Order in Council, direct that the said Law shall have effect within the Province as if it were part of the "Extradition Act, 1870, but that the said Law shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been publicly made known in the Province.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of "The Extradition Act, 1870," and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, direct that the

said Law shall have effect in the Transvaal Province without modification or alteration, as if it were part of "The Extradition Act, 1870."

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Kimberley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *C. L. Peel.*

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and forty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in

Council a scheme for providing such a rent-charge as is contemplated by the eleventh section of that Act.

"Whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of June one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and published in the London Gazette on the eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and ratifying a scheme prepared and submitted by us the benefice of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey with Saint Nicholas Olave and Saint Mary Somerset with Saint Mary Mounthaw in the city of London and the benefice of Saint Benet Paul's Wharf with Saint Peter Paul's Wharf in the same city were united into one benefice as in the same Order is mentioned and the union of the same two benefices has taken effect and consequently all the property constituting the endowments of the said two benefices has by virtue of the same Order been transferred and annexed to the united benefice by the same Order created which united benefice as by the same Order appears is styled the united rectory of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey Saint Nicholas Olave Saint Mary Somerset and Mary Mounthaw with Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf.

And whereas by the scheme ratified by the same Order it was provided that by means of a scheme or schemes to be prepared by us under the Act and section hereinbefore mentioned we should or might after the cesser or determination of the pension (if any) which might be payable to a retiring incumbent by virtue of the same Order recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the property so transferred and annexed to the said united rectory as the endowments thereof should by virtue of any Order or Orders of your Majesty in Council ratifying such scheme or schemes be subject in perpetuity firstly to the payment of one annual rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds in favour of some one benefice in the metropolis or the vicinity thereof which benefice should at the time of the creation of such rent-charge be in the patronage of the Bishop of London and should be designated to us in writing by the said Bishop of London as the recipient of the same rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds per annum and secondly to a certain other rent-charge.

"And whereas no such scheme as is last aforesaid has yet been prepared by us.

"And whereas it is the fact that no such pension as aforesaid has been or is or will be payable because there is not and has not been such a retired incumbent as by the said Order is contemplated.

"And whereas the benefice of Saint John the Evangelist Holborn in the county of Middlesex is a benefice in the metropolis and is in the patronage of the Bishop of London.

"And whereas by a certain writing under his hand bearing date the thirteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of London has designated to us the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Holborn, in the county of Middlesex, as the recipient of the said annual rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Very Reverend Richard William Church Doctor of Civil Law the Dean of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London and of the chapter of the same church which said Dean and Chapter are the patrons of the said united rectory of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey Saint Nicholas Olave Saint

Mary Somerset and Saint Mary Mounthaw with Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, and in testimony of which consent they have affixed to this scheme the common or capitular seal of the same chapter and with the consent of the joint vestry of the four parishes of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey Saint Nicholas Olave Saint Mary Somerset and Saint Mary Mounthaw and of the joint vestry of the two parishes of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, in testimony of which consent this scheme is signed in the case of each of the said joint vestries by the chairman of a meeting of the same joint vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent and also with the consent of the said John Bishop of London in testimony of which consent he has set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and as from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such gazetted Order such of the permanent endowments of the said united rectory of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey Saint Nicholas Olave Saint Mary Somerset and Saint Mary Mounthaw with Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, as are in the schedule to this scheme described and set forth shall be subject in perpetuity to one annual rent-charge of two hundred and fifty pounds the same rent-charge to be payable and paid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Holborn, in the county of Middlesex, and to be apportionable between any outgoing incumbent of the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Holborn, or the representatives or representative of any deceased incumbent thereof on the one hand and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand.

"And we further recommend and propose that the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Holborn, shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent-charge (that is to say) power if and whenever any part of the said rent-charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof) to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent-charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the nonpayment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as under and by virtue of the Act of the forty-fourth year of the reign of King George the Third chapter eighty nine hereinafter mentioned are or shall be vested in the incumbent for the time being of the said united rectory.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in

accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to the foregoing Scheme annexed showing the particulars of the endowments which by the same Scheme are proposed to be charged with the annual rent-charge in the same Scheme mentioned.

"(1.) The annual sum of two hundred pounds payable under the Act passed in the forty-fourth year of the reign of King George the Third chapter eighty-nine for the relief of certain incumbents of livings in the City of London as the annual certain tithes or sums of money in lieu of tithes of and for the parish of Saint Benet, Paul's Wharf, and Saint Peter, Paul's Wharf, or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain payable in respect thereof in case of and after the redemption under the London (City) Tithes Act 1879 of any tithe rate rate assessment or payment payable for raising such annual sum.

"(2.) The annual sum of two hundred and sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and four pence payable under the said Act of the forty-fourth year of King George the Third chapter eighty-nine as the annual certain tithes or sums of money in lieu of tithes of and for the parish of Saint Nicholas Cole Abbey and Saint Nicholas Olave or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain payable in respect thereof in case of and after the redemption under the London (City) Tithes Act 1879 of any tithe rate rate assessment or payment payable for raising such annual sum.

"(3.) The annual sum of two hundred pounds payable under the said Act of the forty-fourth year of King George the Third chapter eighty-nine as the annual certain tithes or sums of money in lieu of tithes of and for the parish of Saint Mary Somerset and Saint Mary Mounthaw or so much thereof as shall from time to time remain payable in respect thereof in case of and after the redemption under the London (City) Tithes Act 1879 of any tithe rate rate assessment or payment payable for raising such annual sum.

"(4.) The annual income to arise from the consideration or considerations or the investments of the consideration or considerations of any such redemption or redemptions as hereinbefore mentioned."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London: *C. WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act, 1878, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Bishopricks Act 1878: have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the Bishoprick of Liverpool.

"Whereas the Bishoprick of Liverpool aforesaid was founded by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of April following which Order was made in pursuance of the fourth section of the above-mentioned Act, and which Order as appears by the terms thereof came into operation on the said ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty:

"And whereas by the same Order it is ordered that the diocese of the bishoprick of Liverpool shall consist of the West Derby Hundred of the county of Lancaster with the exception of so much of the said hundred as is now in the diocese of Manchester and shall include the whole of the ancient parish of Wigan as is provided in the schedule to the said Act.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty bearing date the nineteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty and published in the London Gazette on the day following the town and borough of Liverpool in the county of Lancaster was erected into and declared to be a city.

"And whereas by the said firstly mentioned Order the parish church of Saint Peter in the town and borough (now the city) of Liverpool aforesaid was assigned (subject to the rights of the patron and incumbent of the same church) to the Bishoprick of Liverpool as a cathedral church.

"And whereas by the same Order the Bishop of Liverpool was constituted a body corporate and was invested with all such rights privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York.

"And whereas by the seventh section of the said Act it is enacted that whenever a certain certificate shall have been given to your Majesty by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with respect to the endowment fund of any new bishoprick in the said Act mentioned we shall lay before your Majesty a scheme for all or any of the matters which in the same section are mentioned.

"And whereas the said certificate has been given by us in the case of the Bishoprick of Liverpool as by the said Order of your Majesty in Council of the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty appears.

"Now, therefore, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose as follows; namely, that:—

"(1.) The Bishop for the time being of the diocese of Liverpool shall have all such courts and officers and all such jurisdiction as are at present or were at the time of the passing of the said Order of your Majesty in Council of the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty possessed by the Bishop of the diocese of Chester within the area assigned by the same Order as the diocese of the Bishoprick of Liverpool and that all terriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other documents relating exclusively to any parish or parishes ecclesiastical districts or places situate within the diocese of Liverpool or otherwise relating exclusively to the said diocese (that is to say to the area or any part of the area thereof) shall be transferred from the custody of the registrar or other officer of the diocese of Chester in whose custody the

same now are and shall become and be in the custody of such registrar or other officer or officers of the diocese of Liverpool as the Bishop of Liverpool shall appoint in that behalf.

"(2.) All parishes ecclesiastical districts and places churches and chapels and all the clergy and others your Majesty's subjects within the limits of the diocese of Liverpool as the same diocese is defined by the said Order of your Majesty in Council of the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty shall be exempted and released from all episcopal jurisdiction authority and control of the Bishop of Chester and shall be under and subject to the episcopal jurisdiction authority and control of the Bishop of Liverpool and his successors.

"(3.) Until a Dean and Chapter of and for the said cathedral church of Saint Peter at Liverpool shall have been created the Bishop of the diocese of Liverpool may as to any and every matter with respect to which the confirmation or other agency of a Dean and Chapter is by law required for rendering effectual the action of a Bishop take action in such matter without any such confirmation or agency and his action so taken shall not be thereby made ineffectual or invalid.

"(4.) During any and every vacancy in the See of Liverpool whether such vacancy shall happen before or after the creation of a Dean and Chapter of and for the said cathedral church of Saint Peter at Liverpool the Archbishop of York for the time being shall have the custody and be the guardian of the spiritualities of the See of Liverpool.

"(5.) The archidiaconal supervision of all the parishes ecclesiastical districts and places comprised within the diocese of Liverpool shall for the present (that is to say unless and until any Order of your Majesty in Council shall have been passed for ratifying a certain scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty whereby we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council the formation out of the existing Archdeaconry of Liverpool of a new Archdeaconry of Warrington and in so far as may not be otherwise provided for by any such Order of your Majesty in Council as is lastly mentioned) remain and be with and in and be exercised by the archdeacon of the existing Archdeaconry of Liverpool as an officer of that diocese and the Archdeacon of Liverpool shall not be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Chester but shall be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Liverpool and the archidiaconal dignity of Liverpool shall be transferred from the cathedral church of Chester to the cathedral church of Liverpool that is to say to the aforesaid cathedral church of Saint Peter at Liverpool and all the endowments belonging to the existing Archdeaconry of Liverpool shall continue to belong to the Archdeaconry of Liverpool notwithstanding the transfer of the same archdeaconry from the diocese of Chester to the diocese of Liverpool.

"(6.) Any existing archdeacon in the diocese of Liverpool may reside in any place in which he is residing at the date of this scheme.

"(7.) From and after the next avoidance of the Bishoprick of Chester, the portion of the endowment or income of the said bishoprick which in the third section of the said Act and in the schedule thereto is mentioned (being such portion of the same endowment or income as will if no deduction were made for first fruits and tenths yield a net annual sum of three hundred pounds) shall be transferred from the Bishop of Chester

and from his successors and shall for ever thereafter become and be and form part of the Liverpool Bishoprick Endowment Fund so as to become part of the annual income of the Bishop of Liverpool for the time being and the said portion of the endowment or income of the said Bishoprick of Chester so to be transferred as last mentioned shall be subject to the payment of a proportionate part of the tenths and first fruits payable by the Bishop of the diocese of Chester for the time being.

"And with the consent of the Right Reverend William Bishop of Chester, in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal, we further recommend and propose all that is eighthly hereinafter set forth that is to say.

"(8.) The patronage of every ecclesiastical dignity or benefice being within the diocese of Liverpool of which dignity or benefice the patronage is now vested for any estate or interest in the Bishop of Chester shall forthwith to the extent of such estate or interest be without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same transferred from the said William Bishop of Chester and from his successors and shall become and be vested in the Bishop of Liverpool and his successors.

"And with the consent of the Right Reverend John Charles Bishop of Liverpool in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand and his episcopal seal we further recommend and propose all that is ninthly and tenthly hereinafter set forth, that is to say.

"(9.) Every officer who on the said ninth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighty held and who still holds any office of emolument under the Bishop of Chester or under the Dean and Chapter of Chester or under the Archdeacon of Liverpool and who derived and still derives any portion of the emoluments of his office from sources arising within the diocese of Liverpool shall during his tenure of such office perform such duties and receive such emoluments as an officer of or within the diocese of Liverpool as he has hitherto performed and received as an officer of or within the diocese of Chester and he shall during his tenure of such his office be one of the officers mentioned in the first clause of this scheme.

"(10.) Twenty-four honorary canonries shall be founded by the authority of this scheme, and of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same in the said Cathedral Church of Saint Peter at Liverpool and under the provisions of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen section twenty-three it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Liverpool to appoint as in that section is mentioned spiritual persons to such honorary canonries and so long as there shall be no Dean and Chapter of the said cathedral church to make without the consent of any Dean and Chapter regulations respecting the honorary canons so appointed Provided always that any non-residentary canons in the cathedral church of Chester who upon the foundation of the Bishoprick of Liverpool were holding benefices in the diocese of Chester and who by writing under their respective hands duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Liverpool shall direct shall consent to such transfer, shall (notwithstanding anything in the said last-mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become honorary canons in the said cathedral church of Saint Peter at Liverpool and shall thereupon (that is to say as to each of them upon his appointment to be such an honorary canon) cease ipso facto to be a non-residentary

canon in the cathedral church of Chester Provided also that in the first year after the passing of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme eight spiritual persons and no more (exclusive of any non-residentiary canons who may be transferred from the cathedral church of Chester as aforesaid) may be appointed to honorary canonries in the said cathedral church of Saint Peter at Liverpool."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the hereinbefore firstly-mentioned Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester, and by any Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool, to be appointed in pursuance of the said scheme.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five, and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul situate in Ashton-road, Oldham within the limits of the new parish of Saint Peter Oldham in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Peter Oldham, and of the new parish of Werneth in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such respective new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter Oldham and of the said new parish of Werneth should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said

church of Saint Paul situate in Ashton-road Oldham aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester as such Bishop and also as one of the alternate patrons (in right of his See) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Werneth with the consent of the Right Honourable William Ewart Gladstone the First Lord of your Majesty's Treasury acting as such on behalf of your Majesty as the other alternate patron (in right of the Crown) of the same vicarage and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Mildred Birch Canon of the cathedral church of Ripon the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Prestwich in the said county of Lancaster and in the said diocese of Manchester as the patron (in right of his incumbency of that rectory) of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter Oldham (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Peter Oldham and of the said new parish of Werneth which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Paul situate in Ashton-road Oldham as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Oldham.'

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.
