

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**In the London Bankruptcy Court.**

In the Matter of Frederick Fletcher, of 97, Globe-road, Mile End, London, and Billingsgate Market, London, Fish Salesman, Bankrupt.

Before Mr. Registrar Hazlitt, sitting as Chief Judge.
