THE Queen taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of Francis Jack, Earl of Kilmorey, on the 20th day of June last, the title and dignity of Earl of Kilmorey and Viscount Newry and Morne, in the peerage of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland, devolved upon Francis Charles, now Earl of Kilmorey, as the eldest son and heir of Francis Jack Needham, Esquire, commonly called Viscount Newry and Morne, who, whilst living, was eldest son and heir apparent of the said Francis Jack, late Earl of Kilmorey, and that according to the ordinary rules of honour the brothers and sisters of the said Francis Charles, now Earl of Kilmorey, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their father survived and succeeded to the Earldom of Kilmorey, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Henry Colville Needham, Esquire, late a Captain and Lieutenant-Colonel in Her Majesty's Regiment of Grenadier Guards, Edward Thomas Needham, Esquire, a Lieutenant in Her Majesty's Fleet, Lucy Jane, the wife of William

Drury Nathaniel Drury Lowe, of Locko Park, in the county of Derby, Esquire, Margaret, the wife of Algernon Charles Littleton, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Algernon Charles Littleton, Commander in Her Majesty's Fleet, and Frances Aline Catherine Mary Needham, Spinster, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father had survived his father, the said Francis Jack late Earl of Kilmorey, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Kilmorey:

And to command that the said Royal order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
