The Peterhead Harbour Authorities have given further notice, that on 12th July, 1880, the light at the entrance of Peterhead South Harbour will be re-exhibited during the herring fishing season, until 15th September, 1880, when it will be discontinued.

Also, that on 12th July, 1880, Peterhead South Harbour will be opened to shipping until 15th September, 1880, when it will be again closed.

NOTE.—The works of excavating and deepening the entrance to the harbour are still in progress but a channel about 30 feet wide, and 4 feet in depth at low water has been formed, leading into the harbour basin. Mariners must, however, use the utmost caution in approaching it.

*Reported Danger Southward of Pulo Sapatu.*

THE French Government has given notice, of the reported existence of a sunken danger lying southward of Pulo Sapatu, China Sea, close to the usual track of vessels from Singapore to Hong Kong:—

This danger, the northern extremity of which is said to have been passed by the French ship "Veteran" at a distance of a quarter of a mile in January, 1880, is reported to lie S.S.E. of Pulo Sapatu, distant 13 miles.

The breakers on this shoal were observed to extend for a mile in a N.N.E. and S.S.W. direction.

*Light-vessel and Buoy marking Wreck.*
