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Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech, delivered by the Lords Commissioners, to both Houses of Parliament, on Tuesday, September 7, 1880.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

IT is with satisfaction that I find myself at length enabled to release you from your arduous labours.

I continue to receive assurances of the most friendly character from all Foreign Powers.

The failure of the Sublime Porte to execute, according to its engagement, a plan which was agreed upon in April last for the determination of the Ottoman frontier lying towards Montenegro has caused unfortunate delays in the settlement of that question, and the Treaty of Berlin has not yet taken effect in other points of importance which remained open at the commencement of the Session.

The Governments which were parties to that Treaty have communicated to the Sultan their judgment on the means of bringing to a satisfactory settlement the Greek and Montenegrin Frontier Questions, on the administrative organization of the European Provinces of Turkey, and on the principal reforms required in the Asiatic Provinces inhabited by Armenians.

For the attainment of the objects in view, I continue to place reliance on the fact that the concert of Europe has been steadily maintained in regard to the Eastern Question, and that the Powers which signed the Treaty of Berlin are pressing upon the Sublime Porte, with all the authority which belongs to their united action, the measures which in their belief are best calculated to ensure tranquillity in the East.

I have not been unmindful during the few months which have elapsed since I last addressed you of the considerations which I have stated would guide my policy on the North-Western Frontier of my Indian Empire. Measures have already been taken for the complete military evacuation of Northern Afghanistan, and some progress has been made towards the pacification and settlement of the country.

A renewal of hostilities by the Afghans, under Ayoub Khan, has rendered necessary further military operations in Southern Afghanistan. The prompt measures taken by the Government of India for the relief of the garrison of Candahar, and the conspicuous ability and energy displayed by my officers and troops in the execution of those measures, resulting in the brilliant victory recently gained by the gallant force under the command of Sir Frederick Roberts, will, I trust, speedily bring to

an honourable termination the war in that division of the country.

I regret that it has not hitherto been possible to give you such information on the general state of Indian Finance, and the recent miscarriages in presenting the accounts of military expenditure, as you would justly require before entering on a practical consideration of the subject. You may, however, rest assured that I shall redeem my pledge to supply you with this information at the earliest period in my power.

No advance has recently been made in the project of a South African Confederation, nor could advantage arise from endeavours to press it forward, except in proportion to the favourable movement of public opinion in that portion of the Empire. The general state of affairs in South Africa is, however, on the whole, satisfactory, except in Basutoland, where I trust that a moderate and conciliatory policy may allay the agitation caused by the enforcement of the Disarmament Act.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I tender to you my thanks for the liberal provision which you have made to meet the charges of the public service.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

I acknowledge, with thankfulness to the Almighty, the happy continuance, during several weeks, of fine weather for securing a harvest which gives in many places a reasonable promise of abundance. I am thus enabled to anticipate both a further revival of trade and some addition to the revenue of the country for the year; and I dwell with especial pleasure upon the probable improvement in the condition of the people of Ireland, who have so seriously suffered from previous failure of the crops.

I rejoice also to observe that, notwithstanding the lateness of the period at which you began your labours, your indefatigable zeal and patience have enabled you to add to the Statute Book some valuable laws.

I refer particularly to your settlement of the long-contested questions relating to the subject of Burials, to the Education Act, and the Act for the better determining the Liability of Employers, and to these I would add the Act relating to Ground Game, the repeal of the Malt Duty, the Savings Banks Act, and the Post Office Money Orders Act, and the measures for bettering the condition of Merchant Seamen, and providing for the safer carriage of Grain Cargoes.

I trust that these measures may, under Divine

Providence, contribute to the welfare and prosperity of my people.

Then a Commission for proroguing the Parliament was read; after which the Lord Chancellor said:

My Lords and Gentlemen,

By virtue of Her Majesty's Commission, under the Great Seal, to us and other Lords directed, and now read, we do, in Her Majesty's name, and in obedience to Her commands, prorogue this Parliament to Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of November next, to be then here holden; and this Parliament is accordingly prorogued to Wednesday, the twenty-fourth day of November next.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances, tithings, hamlets, chapeltries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapeltry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapeltry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid,

"by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the Assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," after reciting the provisions hereinbefore recited, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That any such scheme or modification may be drawn up according to the regulations and directions in such Act contained, subject to the consent, in writing, of the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, under his or their hands, notwithstanding the vacancy of such benefice or benefices, and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council thereupon to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect, and such Order being registered in the registry of the diocese, as directed by the said Act, shall come into operation, and shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, notwithstanding such vacancy or vacancies."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Exeter hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend Frederick Lord Bishop of Exeter do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the county of Devon and my diocese of Exeter the parish of Brentor which is a vicarage in the patronage of the Most Noble Francis Charles Hastings Duke of Bedford and is now vacant.

"2. The said parish which is shown on the map hereto annexed and is thereon coloured blue has its own church and by the census of 1871 had a population of 120 persons.

"3. The gross annual income of the said vicarage is £66 14s. 10d. or thereabouts and there is no residence house belonging thereto.

"4. The parish of Brentor adjoins and intersects the parish of Lamerton in the county and diocese aforesaid and separates that portion of the parish of Lamerton which is coloured pink on the said map (hereinafter referred to as 'the District of North Brentor') from the other portion of the same parish which is thereon coloured green. The district of North Brentor has well known and defined boundaries.

"5. The population of the parish of Lamerton aforesaid was by the said census 1333 persons and that part of the same parish which constitutes the district of North Brentor is estimated to contain a population of about 300 persons.

"6. The parish of Lamerton has its own parish church and there is also within that portion of the same parish which is herein called the district of North Brentor a chapel of ease to the same parish church for the accommodation of persons residing within that district together with a house of residence for the minister of such chapel and the said chapel has also a separate endowment which amounts annually to £71 19s. 0d. or thereabouts.

"7. The gross annual value of the vicarage of Lamerton aforesaid is £460 arising partly from rent-charges in lieu of tithes partly from glebe and partly from surplice fees and of such annual

value the sum of £30 Os. 3d. per annum or thereabouts arises from the rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of the lands situate within the district of North Brentor numbered respectively 1325, 1425, 1434, 1435, 1451, 1479 to 1482 both inclusive 1485, 1497, 1499, 1505, 1912, 1913, 1914, 1917 to 1950 both inclusive 1953 to 1996 both inclusive 1998 to 2003 both inclusive 2018, 2019, 2036, 2045 to 2053 both inclusive, 2059 and 2060 on the tithe apportionment of the parish of Lamerton aforesaid and the map relating thereto and there is a residence house belonging to the said vicarage of Lamerton besides the said residence house within the district of North Brentor.

"8. The incumbent of the parish of Brentor aforesaid has for many years past been in the habit of serving the said chapel within the district of North Brentor as curate thereof and has resided in the minister's house belonging thereto.

"9. The Reverend Henry John Phillipotts is incumbent of the said vicarage of Lamerton and John Tremayne of Heligan near Saint Austell in the county of Cornwall Esquire is the patron thereof.

"10. The said parish of Brentor also adjoins that portion of the parish of Mary Tavy in the county and diocese aforesaid which is delineated on the said map and therein coloured yellow hereinafter referred to as 'The District of North Black Down.'

"11. The District of North Black Down is situate at a distance of three miles from the parish church of Mary Tavy aforesaid and within one mile and a quarter of the aforesaid chapel of ease and is estimated to contain a population of 100 persons or thereabouts. It is bounded on the west and north partly by the parish of Brentor and partly by the district of North Brentor and from its south-western extremity as far as a boundary-stone fixed in the eastern hedge of Wortha Farm it is bounded by Black Down. Thence the boundary runs in a straight line eastward across Black Down to a boundary-stone in the south-west corner of Henscott Plantation and thence to the point where the district joins the North Brentor District it is bounded by Black Down.

"12. The said parish of Mary Tavy contains altogether by the said census a population of 1035 persons and the gross annual value of the rectory thereof is £267 arising partly from rent-charges in lieu of tithes partly from glebe and partly from surplice fees and the rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of that portion of the same parish which is herein called the district of North Black Down is £8 15s. 8d.

"13. The Reverend Walter Champernowne is incumbent of the rectory of Mary Tavy aforesaid and John Francis Buller of Morval in the county of Cornwall Esquire is the patron thereof.

"14. It appears to me that the district of North Brentor and the district of North Black Down may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty cap. 106 and the second and third years of Her said Majesty cap. 49 be advantageously separated from the said parishes of Lamerton and Mary Tavy respectively and be united to the said parish of Brentor to which they may respectively be more conveniently annexed.

"15. Pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I have drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon

such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the aforesaid patrons of the said benefices respectively and of the aforesaid incumbents of the said parishes of Lamerton and Mary Tavy to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this fifteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

"F. Exon."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the said parishes of Lamerton and Mary Tavy respectively those portions of the same parishes which are respectively coloured pink and yellow on the map hereto annexed respectively hereinbefore called the district of North Brentor and the district of North Black Down and to unite the same to the said parish of Brentor to which they may be more conveniently annexed.

"The said chapel within the district of North Brentor together with the endowments and emoluments thereof and the house of residence with its appurtenances belonging thereto shall become and be a chapel of ease to the said parish church of Brentor and shall cease to be a chapel of ease to the parish church of Lamerton and the vicar of Brentor aforesaid shall have all the same rights in the said chapel and in the endowments and emoluments thereof and in the house of residence with its appurtenances belonging thereto as are now enjoyed by the vicar of Lamerton whose rights therein respectively shall cease.

"There shall be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of Brentor all the vicarial rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of the lands situate in the district of North Brentor numbered respectively 1325, 1425, 1434, 1435, 1451, 1479, to 1482 both inclusive 1485, 1497, 1499, 1505, 1912, 1913, 1914, 1917 to 1950 both inclusive 1953 to 1996 both inclusive 1998 to 2003 both inclusive 2018, 2019, 2036, 2045 to 2053 both inclusive 2059 and 2060 on the tithe apportionment of the parish of Lamerton aforesaid and the map relating thereto.

"There shall also be assigned and attached to the said vicarage of Brentor all the rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of all the lands situate within the district of North Black Down.

"The fees for churchings marriages burials and all other ecclesiastical offices performed within the parish of Brentor and the said districts annexed thereto and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising from or in respect of the same parish and districts (save and except the rent-charges in lieu of tithes other than those herein before annexed to the vicarage of Brentor) and usually payable from the incumbent of a benefice shall belong to the incumbent of the parish of Brentor with the said districts annexed.

"Except as herein otherwise provided the respective incumbents of the benefices of Lamerton and Mary Tavy as respectively separated from the said districts shall retain all the tithe rent-charges glebe lands hereditaments endowments dues offerings and emoluments now belonging to the same benefices respectively.

"The said parish of Brentor with the said districts annexed shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Brentor was subject to before such annexation and the incumbent of the said parish of Brentor with the said districts annexed shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same parish and districts.

"The incumbent of the parish of Lamerton shall be discharged from all cure of souls within the district of North Brentor and the incumbent of the parish of Mary Tavy shall be discharged from all cure of souls within the district of North Black Down.

"The whole of the first fruits tenths and other ecclesiastical dues now payable by the incumbent of Lamerton with the district of North Brentor shall continue payable by the incumbent of Lamerton as separated from the same district.

"The whole of the first fruits tenths and other ecclesiastical dues now payable by the incumbent of Mary Tavy with the district of North Black Down shall continue payable by the incumbent of Mary Tavy as separated from the same district.

"The inhabitants of the parishes of Lamerton and Mary Tavy as respectively separated from the said districts shall respectively be exclusively liable for the maintenance of the parish churches thereof respectively and the inhabitants of the parish of Brentor with the said districts annexed thereto shall be liable for the repairs of the parish church of Brentor and the said chapel of ease annexed thereto and the inhabitants of the said districts respectively shall be discharged from the repairs of the parish churches of Lamerton and Mary Tavy respectively.

"From and after the proposed separation shall take effect the patronage of each of the said benefices as altered by this scheme shall remain and be vested in the same person or persons in whom the patronage of such benefices as at present constituted is now vested and for the like estate or estates interest or interests.

"We consent to the above scheme,

"*Bedford*, Patron of Brentor.

"*John Tremayne*, Patron of Lamerton.

"*John F. Buller*, Patron of Mary Tavy.

"*Henry John Phillpotts*, Incumbent of Lamerton.

"*Walter Champernowne*, Incumbent of Mary Tavy."

And whereas the said Bishop of Exeter hath transmitted the said scheme to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme, hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 16th day of July 1880; which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Reverend Frederick Lord Bishop of Exeter has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Devon and diocese of Exeter the parish of Brentor which is a vicarage in the patronage of the Most Noble Francis Charles Hastings Duke of Bedford and is now vacant.

"That the said parish is shown on the map annexed to the said representation and is thereon coloured blue.

"That the parish of Brentor adjoins and intersects the parish of Lamerton in the county and diocese aforesaid and separates that portion of the parish of Lamerton which is coloured pink on the said map (hereinafter referred to as 'the District of North Brentor') from the other portion of the same parish which is thereon coloured green.

"That the Reverend Henry John Phillpotts is incumbent of the said vicarage of Lamerton and John Tremayne of Heligan near St. Austell in the county of Cornwall Esquire is patron thereof.

"That the said parish of Brentor also adjoins that portion of the parish of Mary Tavy in the county and diocese aforesaid which is delineated on the said map and therein coloured yellow hereinafter referred to as 'the District of North Black Down.'

"That the Reverend Walter Champernowne is incumbent of the rectory of Mary Tavy aforesaid and John Francis Buller of Morval in the county of Cornwall Esqre is the patron thereof.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the district of North Brentor and the district of North Black Down may be advantageously separated from the said parishes of Lamerton and Mary Tavy respectively and be united to the said parish of Brentor.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the said benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this sixteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty."
