A^T the Court at Balmoral, the 6th day of September, 1880.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by an Act passed in the first **VV** session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding "of benefices in plurality, and to make better "provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances, tithings, " hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts " may be separated from the parishes or mother "churches to which they belong, with great " advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial "may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are " contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes " for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to " his own diocese it shall appear to the Arch-" bishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of " any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place or district within the diocese of such Arch-" bishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the " case may be, may be advantageously separated " from any parish or mother church, and either be " constituted a separate benefice by itself or be " united to any other parish to which it may be "more conveniently annexed, or to any other " adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or " district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that "any extra-parochial place may with advantage "be annexed to any parish to which it "is contiguous, or be constituted a separate " parish for ecclesiastical purposes ; and the said "Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme "in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be "transmitted to the said Archbishop for his " consideration) describing the mode in which it " appears to him that the alteration may best be "effected, and how the changes consequent on "such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and "other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, " and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties "interested; and if the patron or patrons of the * benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or " their hands to such scheme, or to such modifica"tion thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full "consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any "such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall "certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, "by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall "be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make "an Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-"tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament, passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to "make better provision for the assignment of "ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels " augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of "Queen Anne, and for other purposes," it is, amongst other things, further enacted "That "when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council " as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing " of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice " or benefices to be thereby affected, become a " perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister " thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, " and his successors, shall be a body politic and " corporate, with perpetual succession, and may " receive and take to himself and his successors all " such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and " hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or " them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth " have, within the limits of the district parish " formed under the Church Building Acts for the " church of such perpetual curacy, sole and exclu-" sive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be " subject to the control or interference of the in-"cumbent or incumbents of the benefice or " benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or " they shall have consented to such Order as afore-"said."

And whereas the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Salisbury hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say :--

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Salisbury, do represent to your Grace that to the vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke belongs the ancient parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke both in the county of Wilts and my diocese of Salisbury the 1 mits and boundaries whereof are well known and with Burr Chalke have offered to the Ecclesiastical defined.

"That according to the census of one thousand, eight hundred and seventy-one the population of the said parish of Broad Chalke is eight hundred and eleven and the population of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke is four hundred and sixty-four.

"That the annual value of the vicarage of Broad Chalke with Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke aforesaid exclusive of the annual value of the vicarage house and appurtenances at Broad Chalke aforesaid and of the glebe-house and appurtenances situate at Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke and hereinafter mentioned amounts to the sum of three hundred and eleven pounds or thereabouts arising from glebe and tithe rentcharge namely in respect of glebe the sum of seventy-one pounds and in respect of tithe rentcharge the sum of two hundred and forty pounds or thereabouts of which tithe rent-charge the sum of one hundred pounds arises and is payable in respect of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke.

"That there is in the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke a church or chapel which is distant from the church of the said parish of Broad Chalke two miles.

"That the church or chapel in the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke is kept in good repair by the inhabitants of the said parochial chapelry and that it is capable of affording sufficient accommodation to the said inhabitants who from time immemorial have resorted to the said chapel and have elected from amongst themselves exclusively chapelwardens as if the same were a distinct and separate benefice.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants of the said parochial chapelry have any right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any of the pews or sittings in the parish church of Broad Chalke nor does it appear that any persons other than the inhabitants of the said parochial chapelry have any right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any of the pews or sittings in the church or chapel of the said parochial chapelry.

"That there is a glebe-house or parsonage belonging to the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke and such glebehouse or parsonage is now usually occupied by the licensed stipendiary curate of the said parochial chapelry.

"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials have heretofore been and are now performed in the said church or chapel and the burial-ground thereto belonging.

"That the patronage of the vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke aforesaid with the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke is vested in the Provost of the King's College of the Blessed Mary and Saint Nicholas Cambridge and the Scholars of the same college.

"That the Reverend Cecil Gurden Moore, Clerk M.A. is now the vicar thereof.

"That the vicarage of Broad Chalke with Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke is discharged from the payment of first fruits and tenths.

"That in view of the proposed separation as hereinafter mentioned of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke from the said church and vicarage of Broad Chalke the said Provost and Scholars as such patrons as aforesaid and also as being owners of the rectorial tithe arising out of the said parish of Broad Chalke

Commissioners for England the capital sum of eighthundred and fifty-six pounds as a benefaction to the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise. Bower Chalke upon the same being constituted a separate benefice and the said Commissioners have undertaken on the condition that the severance of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke from the said parish of Broad Chalke be legally effected and that the vicarial tithe rent-charge together with the house and premises belonging to the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke be legally secured thereto to meet such benefaction with an annual grant of fifty pounds to be payable out of their common fund to the incumbent of the new benefice and his successors.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106, the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Broad Chalke and be constituted a separate benefice for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto of the patrons and incumbent of the said vicarage I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are as follows :----

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said ancient parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke and constituted a separate beneficc by the name or style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Bower Chalke."

"That such new benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Broad Chalke and the incumbent of the said new benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same respectively.

"That all or so much and such part of the tithe rent-charge or other payments or composition for or in lieu of tithes belonging to the said vicarage of Broad Chalke as arise and accrue or are or may be payable within or in respect of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke and also the said glebe-house or parsonage with the appurtenances within and belonging to the said parochial chapelry and also all the surplice fees and all dues offerings and other emoluments arising within or in respect of the same parochial chapelry and usually payable to an incumbent of a benefice shall respectively belong and be attached to the said proposed new beuefice of Bower Chalke for ever and be held received and enjoyed by the perpetual curate for the time being thereof accordingly.

"That the patronage or right of nominating a minister to the said proposed new benefice of Bower Chalke from time to time as and when the same shall become vacant shall be vested in the Provost and Scholars of the said College for the time being.

"That the inhabitants of the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke shall subject to the provisions of the Church Rates Abolition Act continue and be liable to the repairs and maintenance of the church or chapel of the said proposed separate benefice and shall not be liable to contribute to the repairs and maintenance of the parish church of Broad Chalke nor any church or chapel now or hereafter built or elsewhere than within the limits of such parochial chapelry nor shall the inhabitants of the same parish be entitled as inhabitants to any pews or sittings within the said mother church of Broad Chalke.

"Given under my hand this fourteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty. "George Sarum.

" CONSENT above referred to.

"We the Right Worshipful Richard Okes, Doctor in Divinity, Provost of the King's College of Blessed Mary and Saint Nicholas of Cambridge and the Scholars of the same College the patrons of the said vicarage of Broad Chalke with Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke and the Reverend Cecil Gurden Moore, Clerk, Master of Arts the vicar thereof do hereby signify our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the said ancient parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke from the said vicarage and parish or mother church of Broad Chalke and constituting such parechial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke:a separate benefice and perpetual curacy. In witness whereof we the said Provost and Scholars have hereunto set the common seal of our said College and I the said Cecil Gurden Moore have set my hand and neal this tenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And whereas the said Bishop of Salisbury hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme, hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid, by his report, to Her Majesty: in Council dated the 27th day of August, 1880., which report is in the words and figures fellowing :--

in the words and figures fellowing :--"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent in Majesty in Council.

""We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council. ""That the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop

"That the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Salisbury has represented unto us (amongst other things):

"That to the vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke belongs the ancient parochial chapelry of Burr.Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke both in the county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is in the said parochial chapelry a church or chapel which is distant from the church of the said parish of Broad Chalke two miles and is capable of affording sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of the said chapelry. "That the patronage of the vicarage and parish

"That the patronage of the vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke aforesaid with the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke is vested in the Provost of the Kings College of Blessed Mary and St. Nicholas of Cambridge and the Scholars of the same College.

"That the Reverend Cecil Gurden Moore is the present vicar thereof.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that

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the said parochial chapelry of Burr Chalke otherwise Bower Chalke may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Broad Chalke and be constituted a separate benefice for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the saïd Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may be best effected which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbent of the said benefice has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to domake and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme.into effect.

".As witness our hand the twenty-seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty. ".A. C. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said scheme of the Lord Bishop of Salisbury be carried into effect. C. L. Peel.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty chapter forty-nine and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints situate at Langton Green in the parish of Speldhurst in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints situate at Langton Green aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Speldhurst which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of All Saints situate at Langton Green as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints Langton Green.'

"And with the like consent of the said Archibald Campbell Archbishop of Canterbury (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of All Saints situate at Langton Green as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend John James Saint the present rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Speldhurst shall continue to be such rector or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of the performance of church offices in the church of All Saints situate at Langton Green as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to him the said John James Saint; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of All Saints Langton Green being :----

"All that part of the parish of Speldhurst in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Peter Fordcomb in the county and diocese aforesaid partly by that detached portion of the parish of Ashurst in the same county and diocese which comprises within its limits the mansion house known as Ashurst Park and partly by the boundary which divides the portion of the said parish of Speldhurst which is within the hundred of Washlingstone from that portion of the same parish which is within the hundred of Somerden upon the south by the new parish of Eridge Green in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester, upon the east by the district chapelry of Saint Paul Rusthall in the county of Kent and diocrese of Canterbury aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Speldhurst from the district chapelry of Saint Paul Rusthall aforesaid at the point in the middle of Workhouselane a little to the north of the house called or known as Rusthall Lodge where such boundary diverges from the said lane in a north-easterly direction, and extending thence, that is, from the last-described point, north-westward along

the middle of the said Workhouse-lane for a distance of twenty-one and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction near the house called or known as the Hole with the lane which leads towards Gipps Cross and which is called or known as Hole-lane and extending thence first southward then westward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned lane for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Gipps Cross past the houses called respectively Speeds, Little Farnham, and Waterfrets to Burnt House, and extending thence first north-westward then north-eastward and then again north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twentynine chains or thereabouts to its junction at Burnt House aforesaid with the road leading from Speldburst to Langton Green and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction near Quintain Cottages with the lane leading to Fordcomb and called Leggs-lanc, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of fifty-seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Speldhurst from the new parish of Saint Peter Fordcomb aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said.Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twelfth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following, that is to say :

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of your Majesty chapter sixty-three and of the Acts therein mentioned have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Chester to be called 'The Archdeaconry of Macclesfield' and for endowing the same in manner and to the extent hereinafter mentioned, and also, for altering the area of the Archdeaconry of Chester within the same diocese (as the same area will be after the constitution of the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield) in manner hereinafter mentioned; and also for altering the names and areas of certain rural deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Chester, and within the said proposed Archdeaconry of Macclesfield, and also for creating one new rural deanery (to be called ⁶ The Rural Deanery of Congleton ') within the said proposed Archdeaconry of Macclesfield.

"Whereas the diocese of Chester has hitherto comprised and consisted of two archdeaconries and no more to wit, the said Archdeaconry of Chester, and the Archdeaconry of Liverpool.

"And whereas by an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March in this present year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of April following, the diocese of Liverpool was created, and comprises the territory which now constitutes the Archdeaconry of Liverpool, except the Rural Deanery of Wirral, and comprises also the territory which by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June in this present year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and published in the London Gazette on the second day of July following was constituted a new archdeaconry by the name of the Archdeaconry of Warrington the area whereof theretofore formed part of the said Archdeaconry of Liverpool.

"And whereas under the circumstances thus set forth the Rural Deanery of Wirral is not situate within the diocese of Liverpool but remains in the diocese of Chester.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester has proposed to us and has represented that it is in his opinion desirable that a new archdeaconry to be named the Archdeaconry of Macclesfield should be constituted within the diocese of Chester, and should comprise and consist of that portion of the same diocese and of the said Archdeaconry of Chester which is described in the first schedule to this scheme annexed, and has also proposed to us the other measures hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter more particularly recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposals of the said Bishop should be carried into effect in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the average net annual income of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Macclesfield from fees dues and emoluments will be of nominal amount.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Bishop of the said diocese of Chester (in testimony of which consent he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say,

"First, we recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order there shall be created within the said diocese of Chester one new archdeaconry, to be named 'The Archdeaconry of Macclesfield,' and to comprise and consist of those rural deaneries (including the area of the said proposed new Rural Deanery of Congleton hereinafter recommended to be created) which are now portions of the same diocese and of the said Archdeaconry of Chester and the names of which rural deaneries are set forth in the said first schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and other the clergy and inhabitants of the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal

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jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of Macclesfield for the time being and that the said Archdeacon of Macclesfield shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of his archdeaconry and we further recommend and propose that we be authorized to pay yearly and every year out of the common fund created by the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen to the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Macclesfield hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be created and to his successors in the same archdeaconry the sum of two hundred pounds per annum, such yearly payment to be made upon the first day of January in every year in respect of the twelve calendar months ended that day. Provided always that the first payment so to be made by us as aforesaid shall be proportional to the period which shall have elapsed between the date of the institution of the first archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield and the first day of January next following the date of such institution, and that every such yearly payment as aforesaid shall be apportionable between the archdeacon (or as the case may be the representatives of an archdeacon) who has resigned or otherwise avoided the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield on any day other than the first day of January in any year and the archdeacon who shall next thereafter be instituted to the same archdeaconry; and that every such yearly payment shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the archdeacon on whose behalf application for such payment is made has during the previous year complied with the conditions as to residence which at the date of such application are required by law.

"And secondly we recommend and propose that the said Rural Deanery of Wirral shall, upon and from the day of the publication of any Order of your Majesty in Council duly gazetted as aforesaid and without any other assurance in the law be added to and comprised within the area of the said Archdeaconry of Chester as then existing and arranged, and shall become and thenceforth be a part of the same Archdeaconry of Chester, and be subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority, and control of the Archdeacon of Chester for the time being.

"And thirdly we recommend and propose that a new rural deanery to be called as aforesaid 'The Rural Deanery of Congleton' shall as from the day last aforesaid, be created within the area which by the said first schedule to this scheme is proposed to be assigned to the said proposed Archdeaconry of Macclesfield and shall comprise and consist of the aggregate area of all the parishes or other cures set down under the name of the said proposed new Rural Deanery of Congleton in the said first schedule to this scheme.

"And fourthly we recommend and propose that there shall be hereby made and take effect forthwith all those alterations of name area and relative situation in regard to rural deaneries parishes ecclesiastical districts and cures which appear and are indicated in the said two schedules appended to this scheme.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from hereafter recommending and proposing any other matter or thing relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with t e provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

BARROW — Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Barrow, in the county of Suffolk, and in the churchyard, except in existing vaults and walled graves, every coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and except in earthen graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without coming to water, and without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, and none but the widows, widowers, parents, and children of those already buried to be interred therein.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-ninth day of October next:
