PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice; or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may

approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent, in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Worcester hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester do hereby represent to your Grace that to the vicarage and parish church of Longdon in the county and my diocese of Worcester belongs the chapelry of Morton Castle, commonly

known as Castlemorton, the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That according to the last census the population of the parish of Longdon exclusive of the said chapelry of Castlemorton is six hundred and forty and the population of the said chapelry of Castlemorton amounts according to the same census to eight hundred and fifty-six.

"That there is in the said chapelry of Castlemorton a church long since erected and dedicated to Saint Gregory distant from the parish church of Longdon about four and a half miles wherein Divine service is performed by the vicar of Longdon or his resident curate and which church or chapel affords sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants of the said chapelry or parish of Castlemorton usually attending Divine service there.

"That the said chapelry of Castlemorton is a separate and distinct parish for all civil purposes, and baptisms, marriages, churchings, and burials have been for a very long period and are now solemnized and performed in the said church and the burial-ground thereto belonging.

"That the gross annual value of the vicarage of Longdon with the said chapelry of Castlemorton calculated on the average of the last seven years is five hundred and ninety-eight pounds or thereabouts of which one hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts arises from rent-charges in lieu of vicarial tithes within the limits of the parish of Castlemorton.

"That the rates and taxes on the income of the said benefice are about forty-nine pounds sixteen shillings and seven pence per annum.

"That there is a good and sufficient house of residence at Longdon belonging to the said vicarage and also a house with lands adjoining thereto at Castlemorton annexed to the vicarage in the year 1866 by the Dean and Chapter of Westminster, the patrons of the said vicarage, as and for a vicarage house, in which the curate officiating at Castlemorton resides.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or landowners of Longdon possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the church of the said chapelry of Castlemorton or that any of the inhabitants or landowners of the said chapelry of Castlemorton possess any such legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in the parish church of Longdon.

"That the patronage and right of presentation of and to the said vicarage and parish church of Longdon with the said chapelry of Castlemorton is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, and that the Reverend Anthony Cottrell Lefroy is the present incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church with the said chapelry.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and in the second and third years of the same reign chapter 49 the said chapelry of Castlemorton may be advantageously separated from the vicarage and parish church of Longdon and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act I have prepared the following scheme which with the consent thereto of the said Dean and Chapter of Westminster as patrons and of the said Anthony Cottrell Lefroy as incumbent of the said

vicarage with the said chapelry of Castlemorton I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if upon full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consent as aforesaid by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said chapelry of Castlemorton shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Longdon and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice under the style of the Perpetual Curacy of Castlemorton of which the church within the said parish shall be the parish church.

"That such proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Longdon and that the incumbent for the time being of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That two churchwardens shall be annually chosen for the said separate parish and benefice in the customary manner and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted and shall do all things pertaining to the office of churchwarden as to ecclesiastical matters within the said separate parish and benefice.

"That the rent-charge including vicarial tithes belonging to the said benefice of Longdon and arising or accruing within the parish of Castlemorton amounting in the whole to one hundred and fifty-five pounds six shillings and four pence shall henceforth belong and be attached to the said separate parish and benefice of Castlemorton and be held received and enjoyed by the incumbent thereof for the time being for ever.

"That the messuage and lands at Castlemorton annexed to the vicarage and parish church of Longdon by the patrons thereof by a deed dated 23rd March 1866 be annexed to the said separate parish and benefice of Castlemorton and shall belong to and form part of the endowments thereof.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall as heretofore be performed in the church of the said separate parish and benefice of Castlemorton and the burial-ground thereto belonging and that all the fees and payments for such offices and all such other ecclesiastical dues, offerings, and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said separate parish and benefice of Castlemorton shall henceforth belong to and be received by the incumbent thereof for the time being.

"That the patronage or right of nomination of or to the said separate benefice of Castlemorton shall belong to and be vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, their successors and assigns.

"That the parishioners of the said separate parish and benefice of Castlemorton shall not be entitled henceforth to any accommodation in the parish church of Longdon nor shall the parishioners of Longdon be entitled henceforth to any accommodation in the church or chapel of Castlemorton.

"Given under my hand this twenty-seventh day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty. "H. Worcester.

" CONSENTS.

"We the Reverend Arthur Penrhyn Stanley, Doctor in Divinity, Dean of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, and the Chapter of

the same church the patrons or persons entitled to present to the vicarage of Longdon with the chapelry of Castlemorton in the county and diocese of Worcester in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Anthony Cottrell Lefroy Master of Arts vicar of the said vicarage do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed and to all matters and things therein mentioned.

"Dated this fifteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And whereas the said Bishop of Worcester hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme, hath certified the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, dated the 20th day of August 1880, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Henry Lord Bishop of Worcester has represented unto us (amongst other things).

"That to the vicarage and parish church of Longdon in the county and diocese of Worcester belongs the chapelry of Morton Castle commonly known as Castle-Morton the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That the patronage and right of presentation of and to the said vicarage and parish church of Longdon with the said chapelry of Castle-Morton is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter Westminster and that the Reverend Anthony Cottrell Lefroy is the present incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church with the said chapelry.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry of Castle-Morton may be advantageously separated from the vicarage and parish church of Longdon and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbent of the said vicarage of Longdon with Castle-Morton has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this twentieth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the said scheme of the Lord Bishop of Worcester be carried into effect.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Guayaquil, Republic of Ecuador, enclosing the following translation of a Government Circular on the subject of the production of the original signed Manifests of the cargo by Masters of all vessels arriving at Ecuadorian Ports.

(Translation).

Government of the Province of Guayas.

No. 55. Circular.

Guayaquil, 13th August, 1880.

To the British Consul.

THE Supreme Government in its official letter No. 501, dated the 4th instant, has resolved that the captains of every vessel shall bring the original signed manifest of all the cargo they have on board, and failing to comply with this regulation the Collector of Customs will proceed against them in accordance with Articles Nos. 92 and 93 of the Custom House Law, and Article No. 362 of the Penal Code.

The above is communicated to you for your

information and for that of the captains whom it may concern.

Custom House Law.

Article No. 92. Those who commit any infraction of the present law, whether native or foreign merchants, masters of vessels, or government servants, will be liable (in addition to the penalties defined in the Revenue Laws) to those imposed by the Penal Code, sec. 7, cap. 1, Book 2, in every instance where they may be applicable.

Article No. 93. The master of every vessel on receiving the Custom House visit must deliver to the Chief of the Coast Guard the manifest in duplicate of all the cargo which may be on board.

(Translation.)

Penal Code FF, Cap. 1, Book 2, Article No. 362. Those are smugglers—

1st. Who import or export merchandise, produce, or other articles subject to duties without making proper entry of same in the Customs with intent to evade payment of the established duties.

2nd. Who introduce through the Ports of the Republic merchandise, produce, or goods the importation of which is prohibited, or export goods of which the exportation is prohibited.

3rd. Who in the same manner import goods through ports not open to commerce.

4th. Those who manufacture or sell articles the manufacture or sale of which cannot be carried on without first obtaining a licence and paying the duties established by law, or of which the manufacture or sale is prohibited to private individuals.

MEMORANDUM.

The penalties inflicted for smuggling by the laws above referred to are as follows:—

Confiscation of the smuggled goods, and in some cases of the vessels conveying same when they are of a class which can be legally imported.

Confiscation in like manner and imprisonment from two to three years when the goods are of a class the importation of which is prohibited.
