NOTICE is hereby given, that the Council of the Borough of Portsmouth did, at a Meeting held at the Guildhall, on the 7th September, 1880, make the following Bye-laws:—

Whereas by the virtue of "The Tramways Act, 1870," the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Portsmouth, acting by the Town Council of the said borough, as a Municipal Corporation, are the Local Authority within the district of the said borough of Portsmouth, and whereas subject to the provisions of the special Act authorizing any tramway, and of "The Tramways Act, 1870," the Local Authority of any district in which any tramway is laid down, may from time to time make regulations as to the following matters:—

The rate of speed to be observed in travelling upon the tramway.

The distances at which carriages using the tramway shall be allowed to follow one after the other.

The stopping of carriages using the tramways.

The traffic on the road on which the tramway is laid.

And for better enforcing the observance of all or any of such regulations, it is by "The Tramways Act, 1870," enacted that it shall be lawful for such Local Authority to make Bye-laws for all or any of the aforesaid purposes, and from time to time to repeal or alter such Bye-laws, and make new Bye-laws, provided that such Bye-laws be not repugnant to the laws of that part of the United Kingdom where the same are to have effect. And that any such Bye-laws may impose reasonable penalties for offences against the same not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, with or without further penalties for continuing offences not exceeding, for any continuing offence, ten shillings for any day during which the offence continues; but that all Bye-laws shall be so framed as to allow in every case part only of the maximum penalty being ordered to be paid.

Now, in pursuance of the power given by "The

Tramways Act, 1870," and of every other power enabling them thereto, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough of Portsmouth, acting by the Town Council of the said borough, as the Local Authority in that behalf, do make and ordain the following Bye-laws:—

1. No carriage using any tramway within the district of the said borough of Portsmouth shall driven on any such tramway at a greater speed than eight miles an hour.

2. No carriage using any tramway within the district of the said borough of Portsmouth shall follow another carriage using any such tramway at a less distance from such other carriage than fifty yards, and no carriage shall be standing, or stop, or remain at one time at any terminal station of a public thoroughfare for a longer space than fifteen minutes.

For any breach of either of the two foregoing Bye-laws the driver of a carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

3. Carriages shall not run on any tramway within the district of the said borough of Portsmouth on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, and any day set apart for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving, before one o'clock in the afternoon, and on those days no carriage shall run oftener than once every ten minutes from any terminal station, or any intermediate point.

For any breach of the last-foregoing Bye-law the Company authorized to construct the tramway on which any such breach shall have occurred, or any Company or person licensed or entitled by contract to use any such tramway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
