Cape Mounted Riflemen	Sergeant (now Lieutenant) Robert George Scott	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion during an attack on Moirosi's Mountain, on the 8th April, 1879, in volunteering to throw time fuze shells, as hand grenades, over a line of stone barricades, from behind which, the enemy were bringing a heavy fire to bear on the Colonial Troops, and which it was impossible effectually to return. After causing all the men of his party to retire under cover, lest the shell should burst prematurely,—by which precaution many lives were in all probability saved,—Sergeant Scott advanced in a most deliberate manner under a heavy fire, and, having got under the wall, made two attempts to throw shells over it. At the second attempt, owing to some defect in the fuze, which he had just lighted, the shell exploded almost in Sergeant Scott's hands, blowing his right hand to pieces, and wounding him severely in the left leg.

Havre to Her Britannic Majesty's Consul at that place. A translation of the letter is annexed.

(Translation.)

Chamber of Commerce, Havre,

M. le Consul, *September 11, 1880.*

BY your letter of the 7th instant, you ask me to inform you whether a reduction has recently been made in the dues levied by the Chamber of

Commerce, and, if so, what is the amount of that reduction.

A Decree of the 2nd August, 1880, published in the Journal Officiel of the 7th of the same month, reduces to 55 and to 30 centimes the dues originally fixed at 75 and at 45 centimes.

I beg to draw your attention to the tenor of the following paragraphs contained in the said Decree:—

ART. 2. The special tonnage duty, established at the Port of Havre in virtue of the laws of the 12th July, 1865, 22nd July, 1870, and 5th August, 1854, is modified and fixed as follows:—

	Per ton measurement.
French and foreign vessels coming from all countries (other than coasting vessels)	frs. 0.55
This duty for ships of all flags laden with cereals, coal, pine wood, or ice, wholly or in the proportion of nine-tenths is reduced to ...	0.30

Exemption from these duties is accorded to French vessels employed in the coasting trade, to vessels of all flags calling and leaving without having loaded, unloaded, or transhipped, and to vessels which having entered in ballast shall leave in ballast.

I beg to add that the new taxes will be levied from the 10th August, 1880.

Alderney Harbour—Directions.

THE following information relating to Alderney Harbour is derived from a recent report made by Commander Charles V. Anson, H.M.S. "Dasher," on the state of the eastern or seaward end of its breakwater :—

The breakwater is now broken away by the action of heavy seas for a distance of 400 feet from the extreme end. This damaged portion is nearly awash, with jagged heads and broken pieces of masonry protruding at low water.

From the strength of the west-going tide, espe-

cially at springs, which sets directly on the submerged end of the breakwater for about 9 hours out of 12, it is recommended on entering the harbour, so as to pass well clear of the dangerous portion, to keep the beacon (see Notice to Mariners, No. 83, of 10th June, 1879) on King's Battery well open of the beacon on Homet des Pies, until St. Anne Church spire comes in line with the old pier head, when this mark leading into the harbour should be kept on.

When the tide is running to the eastward, the shoal end of the breakwater may be safely passed by keeping on the line of the beacons erected for passing clear of this danger (the beacon on King's Battery in line with the beacon on Homet des Pies).

On account of the strength of the tides in the immediate neighbourhood of Alderney, a stranger should never attempt to enter the harbour at night; and, before entering by day, preparation for promptly anchoring should be made.
