(PORT OF LONDON—THAMES HAVEN.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 1st day of October, 1880.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London, as a foreign animals quarantine station (in this Order called the Quarantine Station) :

All that space at Thames Haven, in the parish of Fobbing, in the county of Essex, the property of the Thames Haven Company Limited, situate on the banks of the River Thames, including No. 2 Landing-Pier, which Landing-Pier extends from the river front in a northerly direction for a distance of two hundred feet or thereabouts, also including a six-foot-way sixty-five feet long or thereabouts extending in a north-easterly direction from the northern end of the said No. 2 Landing-Pier to the roadway approaching No. 2 New Bullock Shed, also including the said roadway from the bottom of the said six-foot-way and running in an easterly direction parallel to the sea wall for a distance of one hundred and forty feet or thereabouts, and also including the whole of No. 2 New Bullock Shed which is two hundred feet long and forty-four feet wide or thereabouts, all which space is coloured blue on the plan of the landing piers and cattle lairs at Thames Haven deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex.

And do hereby prescribe as follows :

1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in No. 2 New Bullock Shed and shall be

there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 98 of The Animals Order.

2. When and so soon as an Inspector of the Privy Council shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to No. 2 New Bullock Shed have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than No. 2 New Bullock Shed, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this Order, No. 2 New Bullock Shed shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at the Bute Docks, in the borough of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, situate on the east side of the Roath Basin, bounded by a line commencing at a point at the water edge of the said Basin three hundred and forty-one feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said Basin, thence running at a right angle from the said Basin in an easterly direction for ninety-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence continued in an easterly direction for one hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a north-easterly direction for two hundred and eighty-one feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for one hundred and sixty-eight feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a south-westerly direction for two hundred and eighty-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction for ninety-six feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a westerly direction for ninety-two feet or thereabouts to the edge of the water of the said Basin and bounded by a temporary wooden fence, thence in a southerly direction along the edge of the said Basin for ten feet or thereabouts to the point aforesaid, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of the Bute Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which

is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Cardiff.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow, in the county of Lanark, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the port and burgh of Glasgow, being part of the wharf and depôt of the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation, known as Yorkhill Wharf, situate on the south-east side of the road leading from Pointhouse to Partick, called the Ferry Road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-east side of the said Ferry Road where the same is intersected by the water edge of the said wharf, thence passing in a south-easterly direction for a distance of three hundred and thirty-seven feet six inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water edge of the said wharf, thence running north-east on a line at right angles to the said coping for a distance of one hundred and seventy-five feet or thereabouts, bounded by a wooden fence, to a point on the south side of the Pointhouse Road, thence two hundred and seventy-two feet or thereabouts along the north-east face of the wooden fence forming the south-west boundary of the said road to a point where it meets the wooden fence forming the south-east boundary of the Ferry Road, thence south-west along the north-west face of the said fence for a distance of one hundred and eighty-six feet ten inches or thereabouts to the point of departure first described, and all which space is coloured pink on the plan thereof deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Glasgow.
