THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby declare the park known as Stockwood Park, the property of John Sambrook Crawley, situate in the borough of Luton, in the county of Bedford, to be a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The area described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, being an area wherein is situate the place infected with foot-and-mouth disease described in Part II of that Schedule, is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The fair for animals which would in ordinary course be held in Park Street and Park Square, in the borough of Luton, in the county of Bedford, on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, shall not be held.

3. The market for animals which would in ordinary course be held in Park Square, in the said borough, on Monday in each week shall not be held except with the licence of the Privy Council.

4. No auction, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the said borough except with the licence of the Privy Council.

5. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

6. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

PART I.

Area Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.
An area comprising the whole of the borough of Luton, in the county of Bedford.

PART II.

Place Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease situate within the foregoing Area.
The park known as Stockwood Park, the property of John Sambrook Crawley, situate in the borough of Luton, in the county of Bedford.
