No. 1. Weir, and terminating at the south-west side of the weir, known as the Grass Weir, at the junction of the said river with the Union Canal.

No. 6. A new cut or channel for the river Soar, wholly in the parish of St. Mary, commencing from and out of the said river, at the south-west side of the Grass Weir, and terminating by a junction with the said river on the northern side of Braunstone Gate Bridge, Dunn's-lane, and to alter and extend the said bridge so as to adapt the same to the capacity of the said new cut or channel.

No. 7. The widening and straightening on the east side, and the deepening and improving of the Bow Bridge branch of the river Soar, in the parishes of St. Mary and Augustine Friars, commencing at the northern side of Braunstone Gate Bridge, and terminating at the junction of that branch with the Leicester Navigation, and in connection therewith a new cut to carry the said Bow Bridge branch under the Midland Railway, commencing in and out of the said branch at a point about 20 yards south-west of the said railway, and terminating by a junction with the said navigation about 44 yards north-east of the same railway.

No. 8. The widening on both sides, deepening and improving in the said parishes of Saint Mary, Saint Margaret, Black Friars, and the extra parochial place of the Leicester Abbey Lands or Lordship and the altering of the water level of the river Soar, commencing at the south-west corner of the weir, known as Mr. Evan's Weir, and terminating at the said brickwall boundary of Mr. Hitchcock's garden.

No. 9. The reconstructing, in the parishes of Saint Mary and Black Friars, of the said weir, known as Mr. Evan's Weir, and the extending of the same in a westerly direction to the western bank of the river Soar, as so proposed to be widened, and, if necessary, the removing of the existing sluices in that weir, and the constructing of new sluices.

No. 10. An overfall weir, in the parish of Saint Margaret, and the extra parochial place of the Leicester Abbey Lands or Lordship, between the Leicester Navigation and the river Soar, commencing at a point in the west bank of the said navigation about 130 yards north of the north side of Soar-lane Bridge, and terminating in the said bank about 90 yards north of its point of commencement.

In connection with the foregoing works to abandon, stop up, and fill in the portions of the said river, canal and navigation, and the streams and backwaters connected therewith, which lie between the following points, namely: The portion of the said canal and backwater lying between the said viaduct and the Castle Mill Weir, except where the new Cut No. 1 will pass through the said canal; the portion of the river Soar between the stone weir and the proposed new Cut No. 1; the junction cut

between the river Soar and the said canal alongside of the said Grass Weir, and the portion of the river Soar between that weir and Braunstone Gate, and to remove the Stone Weir and Grass Weir, the Castle Mill Weir, the weir near Mr. Hitchcock's mill, the Swans' Mill Lock, and the Castle Mill Lock, and to fill in those locks.

2. To extend the time for the completion of the new lock on the Leicester Navigation, and (subject to the abandonment of a portion thereof as hereinafter mentioned) the widening and deepening of such navigation authorised as work D in the "Leicester Improvement Act, 1874," and for the completion of the widening and deepening of the Willow Brook, and for the making of the new cut therefor, being works B and C, authorised by Section 5 of "The Leicester Improvement Act, 1876."

3. To repeal, alter, or amend, and extend the provisions of Section 18 of "The Leicester Improvement Act, 1874," and to authorise the Corporation and the said Company of Proprietors of the Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Union Canal and the Leicester Navigation Company to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements for and in relation to the alteration of certain of the works by that Act authorised, and the construction of the said intended new works, and to confirm any such contracts and agreements which may have been or which during the progress of the Bill may be entered into, and particularly to confirm an agreement or heads of an agreement made between the Leicester Navigation Company and the Corporation, dated the 28th day of September, 1880, and for the purpose of carrying any such agreement into effect to authorise the Corporation to exercise the following or some of the following powers, and to make and maintain the following or some of the following works, viz:—

No. 13. To abandon the alteration, improvement, or reconstruction of the Belgrave Lock, in the parish of Belgrave, and the widening and deepening of so much of the Leicester Navigation authorised by subsection D of Section 13 of the said Act of 1874, as lies between Belgrave Mill and a point $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains south-west of the southern end of Swan's Nest Weir, and to stop up and fill in the said lock and the said portion of the Leicester Navigation.

No. 14. A new cut or channel commencing in the said parish of Saint Margaret at a point in the Leicester Navigation $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains south-west of the south end of Swan's Nest Weir, and terminating in the parish of Belgrave at a point in the said river Soar 4 chains to the north-east of the said south end of the said weir, and in such cut to construct, continue, and maintain a lock, commencing at or near the south end of the Swan's Nest Weir, and extending for a length of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains along the said cut in a north-easterly direction.

No. 15. A new road in the parish of Belgrave, commencing at the northern end of Holden-street and terminating at a point 40 yards to the south of the footpath crossing the Belgrave Mill Leat.

No. 16. The diversion of the footpath in the parish of Belgrave, leading from Holden-street to Belgrave Lock, such diversion to commence at a point about 11 yards north of the southern end of the bridge carrying that footpath over the Mill Leat of the Belgrave Mill, and to terminate at

the end of the Towpath Bridge across the river Soar, near Belgrave Lock.

4. To authorise the Corporation to construct and maintain the following works:—

No. 17. The widening (in the parishes of Belgrave and Saint Margaret) on the north-eastern side thereof, and the deepening and improving of the bed and channel of the Willow Brook, commencing at the north side of the bridge on the Humberstone-road, crossing the said brook and terminating on the east side of the bridge or culvert, by which the said brook passes under Ash-street, and again commencing at the north-west face of the arch, which carries the Midland Railway over the said brook, and terminating about 20 yards (measured in a north-westerly direction along that brook) from the said north-west face of that arch, and in connection with that work the reconstructing and lengthening the said Ash-street Bridge or Culvert, and the Forest-street Bridge or Culvert, so as to adapt them to the brook as widened, and the embanking of the said brook on the said north-eastern side, between the said points, except at the places where the Forest-street and Ash-street cross the said brook.

No. 18. A new cut in the parishes of Saint Margaret and Belgrave, commencing at the western face of the said Ash-street Bridge or Culvert, and terminating at the south-east face of the said arch, which carries the Midland Railway over the said brook.

No. 19. The deepening and underpinning of the culvert which carries the said brook underneath the said railway. This work will be wholly in the said parishes of Saint Margaret and Belgrave.

No. 20. A covered bye pass or cut for the flood waters of the Willow Brook, wholly in the said parish of Saint Margaret, commencing at and adjoining the present arch over that brook on the south-east side of the Belgrave road, and proceeding to and along Wood-street and terminating by a junction with the new cut for that brook, authorised by the "Leicester Improvement Act, 1876," through the Little Leroe (being work C by that Act authorised) at a point in that cut about 60 yards south-west of the Sidney-street or Lady Bridge.

No. 5. To authorise the Corporation to execute, construct and maintain all such excavations, banks, embankments, dams, piers, abutments, retaining walls, fences, gates, towpaths, roads, approaches, cuts, channels, watercourses, drains, sluices, weirs, locks, bridges, arches, culverts, machinery, piling appliances, conveniences, and works in connection with or auxiliary to the foregoing works, or any or either of them as may be convenient for facilitating the passage of storm and flood waters, and the navigation of the said river, canal, and navigation and the forming communications between severed lands.

6. To authorise the Corporation to deviate in the construction of the works to be authorised by the intended Act, both vertically and laterally to the extent prescribed by the Bill.

7. To enable the Corporation to acquire compulsorily or by agreement lands, houses, and property for the purposes of the Bill, and to vest in the Corporation the bed and channel of the River Soar, as altered by the Bill, and of the new cuts to be made under the powers thereof, and to provide for the alteration and rectifica-

tion of boundaries consequent on the altered course of the said river, canal, and navigation, and the appropriation of the portions thereof respectively which may be filled up by reason of such alteration.

8. To exempt the Corporation from the provisions of Section 92 of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," in respect of all or some of the properties to be acquired by them, under the powers of the intended Act, and make special provisions in lieu of those contained in the said Lands Clauses Consolidation Act for or with respect to the entry upon and taking of lands required for the purposes of the said deepening of the Willow Brook, authorised by "The Leicester Improvement Act, 1876."

9. To break up, and also to stop up, alter, divert, and interfere with, either temporarily or permanently (and if permanently to appropriate the site of and extinguish all rights of way over), and to cross over, under, or upon all such streets, roads, highways, towpaths, bridges, thoroughfares, railways, tramways, rivers, navigations, canals, streams, brooks, watercourses, sewers, drains, gas and water pipes, and telegraph apparatus as it may be necessary or convenient to break up, stop up, alter, divert, interfere with, or cross for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to extinguish all rights of way and other rights in, over, or upon any lands to be acquired under the powers of the Bill, and particularly to stop up and appropriate the site and soil of and extinguish all rights of way over the footpath leading from the Stone Weir to Castle Mill Lock, and the footpath leading from Swan's Nest Weir to Belgrave Mill.

10. To take and divert by means of the said intended works, or some of them, and to alter the level of the waters of the river Soar, the Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Union Canal, and the Leicester Navigation.

11. To authorise the Corporation to sell, exchange, demise on building or other leases, let for building purposes or otherwise dispose of, and to improve lands and buildings, and to sell or dispose of, any annual rentcharge reserved in respect of, and the reversion in lands or buildings, and to provide for the appropriation of the moneys resulting from the dealings aforesaid.

12. To provide for the alteration of privies to the one or other of the systems known respectively as the Ash or Earth Closet and the Pail system, and for the proper maintenance and repair of the privies so altered, and of Ash or Earth closets and Pail closets, and of the fittings and appliances connected therewith respectively, and to enable the Corporation to provide and maintain the same and to charge and recover the cost thereof, and of such maintenance.

13. To prohibit the use of any privy, ash or earth closet, pail or other place or appliance for the deposit of foecal matter or the fittings thereof respectively, unless certified by the Corporation as fit for the purpose, and to prohibit the deposit in privies or in such closets, pails or appliances, of other than foecal or scavenging refuse.

14. To alter and amend, and if thought fit, to repeal and re-enact, with alterations, the regulations scheduled to "The Leicester Improvement, Drainage and Markets Act, 1868," and particularly such of those regulations as relate to the following matters, and to confer additional powers on the Corporation in relation thereto. The following are the matters specially referred to, that is to say—The width, construction, level and direction of new streets, the

definition of new buildings and buildings abutting on streets. The height of buildings. The prohibiting the letting for human habitation of insanitary buildings, or buildings not constructed for such purpose or otherwise unfit for human habitation. Party walls. Foundations of buildings to prevent the rising of damp and of noxious or offensive gases. Open spaces about buildings, size of courts, and means of entry thereto. The approval, disapproval, and alteration of plans and sections of new streets and buildings, including existing buildings, and the attaching by the Corporation of conditions to such approval. Inspection of buildings and their foundations during progress. Approval of materials. Compulsory alteration of buildings not in conformity with regulations or bye-laws. Penalties for breach of regulations or bye-laws.

15. To enable the Corporation to improve the means of communication between various parts of the borough separated from one another by the said river, canal and navigation or any or either of them, and to provide for the sewerage and draining and improving of such parts, and especially of the Bede House Meadows, and other lands of the Corporation, and to enable the Corporation to enter into and to carry into effect contracts and agreements with the owners, lessees, and occupiers of lands, houses, and property for and in relation to such improved communication, and the construction thereof, and of sewers and drains by the Corporation solely or jointly with such owners, lessees, and occupiers.

16. To constitute the giving of short weight or measure in the sale of any article an offence punishable by fine.

17. To alter any existing tolls, rates, and charges now authorised to be levied within the borough or any part thereof, and to authorise the Corporation from time to time to make and levy new tolls, rates and charges general and special for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, and to confer, vary and extinguish exemptions from the payment of any existing or future tolls, rates and charges.

18. To alter and enlarge the present borrowing powers of the Corporation, and to enable them to apply their corporate funds, and any moneys which they are already authorised to borrow, to the purposes of the Bill, and to consolidate their present mortgage debts, and to borrow further moneys by mortgage, annuities, or debenture stock, and to charge the moneys borrowed, or to be borrowed by the Corporation, or owing by them upon all or any one or more of the following securities, that is to say—the borough fund, borough rate, district fund, and general district rates, lands, tenements, hereditaments, gas, water and other undertakings, and property, and the rates, rents, tolls, and revenue of the Corporation, and to alter the present mode of charging moneys borrowed, and to alter or define the provisions now in force as to the repayment of moneys now owing, or to be borrowed by the Corporation.

19. The Bill will enable the Corporation to carry the provisions of the Bill into effect, under and subject to the Municipal Corporations Acts and other Acts, public and local, affecting the Corporation respectively, with such modifications as may be contained in the Bill, and for all or any of the purposes of the Bill, to make and enforce bye-laws and regulations, and to enter into and carry into effect agreements and con-

tracts, and the Bill will or may confirm, with or without alteration any such agreements and contracts which may have been or which may be entered into during the progress of the Bill.

20. The Bill will vary and extend or repeal, alter and consolidate, all or some of the provisions of, among other Local and Personal Acts, the following, that is to say:—"The Leicester Sewerage Act, 1851," "The Leicester Cattle Market, Townhall, and Improvement Act, 1866," "The Leicester Lunatic Asylum and Improvement Act, 1865," "The Leicester Improvement Drainage, and Markets Act, 1868," "The Leicester Lunatic Asylum Act, 1870," "The Leicester Improvement Act, 1874," "The Leicester Improvement Act, 1876," "The Leicester Corporation Act, 1879," and any other Act or Acts relating directly or indirectly to the Corporation, 33 Geo. III, c. 98, 45 Geo. III, c. 71 (Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Union Canal) 50 Geo. III, c. 122 (Grand Union Canal), 41 Geo. III, c. 71 (Grand Junction Canal), The Acts of 31 Geo. III, c. 65; 37 Geo. III, c. 51; and 11 and 12 Vic., cap. 5, relating to the said Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Union Canal, or to the Leicester Navigation, and the Bill will incorporate with itself in extenso, or by reference with or without alteration, such of the provisions as may be thought fit of the foregoing Acts, and of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Local Loans Act, 1875," "The Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847," "The Town Police Clauses Act, 1847," and "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," and the Bill will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects, and confer other rights and privileges.

21. Duplicate plans and sections describing the lines, situations, and levels of the proposed works, and the lands, houses, and other property in or through which they will be made, and plans showing the lands, houses, and other property which may be taken under the powers of the Bill, together with a Book of Reference to the plans containing the names of the owners and lessees, or reputed owners and lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands, houses, and other property, and a copy of this notice will, on or before the 30th day of November instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for Leicestershire, at his office at Leicester, and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans, sections and Book of Reference as relates to each parish, and extra parochial place, in or through which the intended works will be made, or in which any lands, houses, or other property are intended to be taken, and a copy of this notice will be deposited with the Parish Clerk of each such parish at his residence, and in the case of an extra parochial place, with the Parish Clerk of some Parish immediately adjoining such extra parochial place, at his place of abode.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, on or before the 21st day of December next.

(Construction by the Metropolitan Board of Works of New Bridges over the Thames at Putney and Battersea with Approaches, Removal of existing Bridges at Putney and Battersea and of Aqueduct of Chelsea Waterworks Company, Agreements with Chelsea Waterworks Company, Alteration or Reconstruction of Vauxhall and Deptford Creek Bridges, Dredging in River Thames, Compulsory purchase of Lands, Appropriation of Roadways, Temporary Bridges and Works, Protection and Repair of Bridges and Approaches, Abolition of Toll on East and West Ferry Roads (Poplar) leviable by the Poplar and Greenwich Ferry Company; Provisions as to the Approach Roads to and lighting of Hammersmith Bridge Agreement with Brentford Gas Company, Renewal of Licenses for Licensed premises acquired by the Board. Special provisions as to acquisition of property Amendment and repeal of Acts).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Metropolitan Board of Works (who are hereinafter referred to as "The Board") intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following or some of the following among other purposes.

1 To enable the Board to construct a new bridge across the River Thames at Putney instead of the existing bridge known as Fulham or Putney Bridge to be situate immediately on the upper or west side of the aqueduct or structure carrying over the river the pipes of the Governor and Company of Chelsea Waterworks (hereinafter called "The Chelsea Waterworks Company.")

The said bridge will commence in the Parish of Putney and county of Surrey at or immediately to the west of the brick pier of the said aqueduct on the Surrey shore of the River Thames in that parish and will terminate in the parish of Fulham and county of Middlesex at or immediately to the west of the brick pier of the said aqueduct on the Middlesex shore of the River Thames in that parish.

2. To enable the Board to make and maintain in connection with the said new bridge the approaches and works following:—

Approaches in the County of Surrey and Parish of Putney.

- (a) An approach road commencing in High-street about 25 yards south of the junction of Albert-row or place therewith and terminating at the commencement of the new bridge hereinbefore described.
- (b) An approach road commencing in Windsor-street at a point about 30 yards east of the junction therewith of River-street and terminating by a junction with the approach road (a.) lastly hereinbefore described at or near the commencement of the said new bridge hereinbefore described.

Approach in the County of Middlesex and Parish of Fulham.

- (c) An approach road commencing at or near the point where High-street Church-street and Bridge-street meet and terminating at the termination of the new bridge hereinbefore described;

And to enable the Board to take down and remove the existing bridge over the Thames at Putney known as Fulham or Putney Bridge situate partly in the said parish of Fulham and partly in the said parish of Putney.

3 To extinguish all public or other rights in or over the approaches or roads hereinafter described and to vest the site and soil thereof (so far as it may not now be vested in them) in the Board viz.

- 1 So much of the towing path in the said parish of Putney as extends from a point opposite the commencement of the Approach road (b) hereinbefore described to the termination of the said towing path opposite the end of High-street.
- 2 So much of the road in the parish of Putney forming the approach to the existing bridge as is situate on the north or river side of the church of St. Mary Putney and between the existing bridge and the approach road (a) hereinbefore described.
- 3 So much of the road in the parish of Fulham forming the approach to the existing bridge as is situate between the existing bridge and a point 30 yards or thereabouts to the northward of the Old Toll House existing on the north or Middlesex side of the same bridge.
- 4 To enable the Board with or without the consent of the Chelsea Waterworks Company to take down and remove the said aqueduct or structure carrying their pipes across the River Thames near and to the westward of the said existing bridge of which aqueduct or structure one end is situate on the Surrey shore in the said parish of Putney near the end of High-street and the other end is situate on the Middlesex shore in the said parish of Fulham in or adjacent to the grounds occupied in connection with the house known as Thames Bank otherwise Ashton Lodge now in the occupation of Christian Henry Kayser and instead thereof to construct an aqueduct conduit or line or lines of pipe commencing by a junction with the existing conduit or lines of pipes of the Chelsea Waterworks Company in the said parish of Putney at or near the said brick pier of the said aqueduct carried thence along upon under or by the side of the said new bridge and approaches hereinbefore described or some part or parts thereof respectively and terminating in the said parish of Fulham by a junction with the said existing conduit or lines of pipe at or near the said brick pier of the said aqueduct in the said parish of Fulham and to make provision for the future maintenance and repair of the said conduit or pipes and to make connections between such conduit or pipes and the pipes of the said Company at or near both ends of the said aqueduct.
- 5 To enable the Board and the Chelsea Waterworks Company to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to such removal and as to the manner in which the said pipes shall be carried across the river in connection with the said new bridge and as to the future maintenance and repair of the said pipes.
- 6 To enable the Board to construct a new bridge across the River Thames instead of the existing bridge known as Battersea Bridge The said new bridge will be situate partly on the same site as and partly on the eastern side of and immediately adjacent to the said existing bridge and will commence in the parish of St. Mary Battersea in the county of Surrey at or near the Swan Public-house on the east side of Bridge-road, and terminate at or near the wall of the Chelsea Embankment at the point where it joins the existing bridge in the parish of St. Luke Chelsea in the county of Middlesex.

7 To enable the Board to make and maintain in connection with the said new bridge the approaches and works hereinafter described.

Approach in the County of Surrey and Parish of St. Mary Battersea.

- (d) An approach road adjacent to and on the east side of Bridge-road commencing by a junction with Bridge-road about 30 yards south of Wellington-lane and terminating at the commencement of the new bridge lastly hereinbefore described.

Approaches in the County of Middlesex and Parish of St. Luke Chelsea.

- (e) An approach road formed in part by altering the level of Beaufort-street from a point about 40 yards north of the junction therewith of Lindsey-row and in part by continuing Beaufort-street partly over the site of the approach to the existing bridge and partly over the Chelsea embankment up to and terminating at the termination of the new bridge lastly hereinbefore described.

- (f) An approach road formed by altering the level of the roadway and footway of the said Chelsea embankment from a point 80 yards or thereabouts east of Beaufort-street to and terminating in the approach road (e) lastly hereinbefore described at or near the termination of the new bridge lastly hereinbefore described.

- (g) An approach road formed by altering the level of Lindsey-row commencing about 80 yards west of Beaufort-street and terminating in the approach road (e) hereinbefore described where Lindsey-row joins Beaufort-street.

And to enable the Board to take down and remove the existing bridge over the Thames at Battersea known as Battersea Bridge situate partly in the said parish of St. Mary Battersea and partly in the said parish of St. Luke Chelsea.

8 To enable the Board to alter the bridge across the Thames known as Vauxhall Bridge partly in the parish of St. Mary Lambeth in the county of Surrey and partly in the parish of St. John the Evangelist Westminster in the county of Middlesex by removing the two central piers and converting the three central arches into one span or opening and to reconstruct or partially reconstruct the said bridge accordingly.

9 To dredge and deepen the bed of the river beneath and near to such central span or opening to strengthen alter and enlarge such of the other piers of the bridge as it may be necessary or convenient to strengthen, alter and enlarge for the purposes aforesaid and to alter the carriage and footways over the said bridge.

10 To enable the Board to reconstruct or partially reconstruct and to widen and alter the Swing Bridge in the county of Kent which crosses Deptford Creek partly in the parish of St. Alphage Greenwich and partly in the parish of St. Nicholas Deptford and connects Bridge-street in the said parish of St. Alphage Greenwich with Creek-road in the said parish of St. Nicholas Deptford To make provision as to the times at which and the manner in which the said bridge shall be from time to time opened, and to enable the Board to make and enforce regulations with respect thereto and to provide and maintain or contribute towards maintaining all such machinery and apparatus as shall be required for opening and closing the said bridge And to repeal the Act 43 Geo. III cap 131 relating to the said bridge or any

part or parts thereof and to relieve the Board from any obligation (under that Act or otherwise) to provide a ferry during the alteration of the said bridge To enable and require the Greenwich District Board of Works to undertake the opening working maintenance and repair of the said bridge or some part or parts thereof or to pay or contribute to the costs and expenses thereof so far as they may not be provided for by the Board and if necessary to amend or repeal Section 24 of the "Metropolis Toll Bridges Act 1877" relating to the opening or removing of the drawbridge or swing bridge at Deptford Creek and the expenses thereof.

11 To enable the Board to make in connection with the aforesaid bridges and works all such viaducts embankments piers wharves walls fences drains stairs buildings and all such works and conveniences as they may deem proper to provide barge beds and other conveniences for loading or unloading goods in substitution for any which may be interfered with under the powers of the Bill To enable the Board to construct over each of the said bridges and the approaches thereto such carriage-way and foot-ways as they may think proper.

12 To enable the Board to deviate laterally and vertically from the line and levels of the intended works shown upon the deposited plans and sections hereinafter mentioned to underpin prop up and otherwise strengthen walls buildings and property near to or which may be affected by any of the proposed works without being required to purchase the same to stop wholly or partially during the execution of any works affecting any of the said existing bridges the traffic over the same and to provide for such traffic by the erection of temporary bridges stages ferries or other works.

13 To enable the Board for the purposes of the said works to alter and interfere with the bed and foreshore of the River Thames and to cross, divert stop up and interfere with and to make junctions and communications with streets roads passages and places also to cross divert stop up and interfere with sewers drains mains pipes culverts tunnels steps areas cellars windows spouts telegraph and other apparatus and to extinguish all public and other rights in or over any portions of streets roads ways and paths which may be used for the purpose of any of the new works and to make regulations affecting vessels navigating the river Thames or Deptford Creek during the execution of the works and to execute and do all such works matters and things as may be deemed expedient for the purposes of the Bill.

14 To enable the Board to purchase by compulsion or agreement all such lands houses and other property as may be required for the purposes of or in connection with the said bridges and works or the approaches thereto or any of them or as will be included within the limits to be defined upon the deposited plans and also to acquire and exercise easements and rights in and over any such lands houses and other property or in and over the River Thames or Deptford Creek and the banks bed soil and foreshore thereof whether for permanent or temporary works or purposes and to vary and extinguish any such easements or rights and all such other rights easements and privileges as may be necessary in the attainment of any of the objects of the Bill.

15 To enable the Board to purchase so much only of any property as may be required for the purposes of the intended Act and to exempt the Board from the liability imposed by the 92nd

Section of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845" and if deemed expedient from the provisions of the said Act with respect to the sale of superfluous lands.

16 To enable the Board and their officers to enter survey and value at any time, buildings shown on the deposited plans and to make provision as to the appointment of an Umpire under Section 28 of the "Lands Clauses Consolidation Act 1845" by the Board of Trade and for ascertaining separately the value of premises required by them and the amount of compensation for loss or damage awarded in respect thereof.

17 To enable the Board to sell convey lease and otherwise dispose of any lands houses and property or any easement right or privilege in or over the same which may be acquired or vested in them under the powers and may not be required for the purposes of the Bill and to sell and dispose of any building paving or other materials removed in the execution of the proposed works and to execute all such other works and exercise all such other powers as may be incidental or necessary to any of the objects of the Bill.

18 To prohibit the breaking up or interference with the new bridges hereinbefore mentioned or the approaches thereto or the road or footway over the same for laying down any main or pipe or other work except with the consent of the Board and subject to such terms and conditions as to payment and otherwise as the Board may determine.

19 To authorize the Board for the purposes of the intended Act and in relation thereto to appoint Committees and to apply for the purposes of the intended Act any of the moneys belonging to them or under their control or which they may be authorised to raise or receive for the purposes of the intended Act.

20 To charge upon the respective Vestries and District Boards of Works of the several parishes and districts as mentioned in Schedules A and B of the "Metropolis Management Act 1855" in which the proposed bridges and approaches will be situate the maintenance and repair of such part or parts thereof respectively and of the carriage and footways over the same as may not be undertaken by the Board.

3. To control and regulate the speed of steam vessels, steam-tugs, and steam launches on the said river, and to compel the owners of sailing vessels and barges to employ or use steam-tugs upon the said river, or any part thereof, and if Parliament should so determine to prohibit or limit to certain hours the use of steam-tugs and steam launches on the said river, or any part thereof.

4. To repeal, alter, or enlarge the powers and provisions of the several Acts now in force upon the river Thames with respect to the compulsory employment of pilots, watermen, and lightermen, and to make the owners of all vessels, barges and boats of every description liable for any acts and trespasses committed by them or their officers and servants, and for the breach of any bye-laws, rules, and regulations from time to time in force upon the said river.

6. To give Metropolitan Police Magistrates and County Justices jurisdiction over offences committed upon the said river, and to enable such Magistrates and Justices to hear and determine any cases arising under the intended Act, or any other Act relating to the said river, and to alter or repeal the whole or any part of any Act which enables any company, body, or person to hear and determine such cases, and generally to provide for the administration of justice in connection with the said river.

7. To repeal, alter, or enlarge any of the provisions of "The Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 to 1876," so far as the same are applicable to the River Thames, and to the powers thereby given to the Board of Trade in respect of such navigation.
