I HAD the honour to inform your Lordship by telegraph that the self-denying Protocol had been signed by the Representatives of the Six Powers on the 21st instant.

THE Governments represented by the Undersigned, in order to prove the entire disinterestedness with which they pursue the execution of all the stipulations of the Treaty of Berlin, undertake not to seek in any arrangements which may be come to in consequence of their concerted action for the execution of the said Treaty in regard to the Montenegrin question, and eventually the Greek question, any augmentation of territory, any exclusive influence, or any commercial advantage for their subjects which those of every other nation may not equally obtain.

SIR, *Foreign Office*, October 2, 1880.

IN the instructions which, by the command of the Queen, I had the honour of addressing to your Excellency on your proceeding as Her Majesty's Special Ambassador to Constantinople, I called your Excellency's attention to the pressing character of the question relating to the Montenegrin frontier.
