Return of Ordnance captured at Baba Wali after the Action with Sirdar Ayub Khan on 1st September, 1880.

1. Ordnance iron B. L. rifled 9-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 4 ft. 7 in.; calibre 3.14 in.; rifling polygroove; grooves 37. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted with tangent sights on both sides, and muzzle sight, the former inclined towards each other, having Vernier cross-heads, and being graduated in Persian numerals.\*
2. Ordnance iron B. L. rifled 9-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 4 ft. 7 in.; calibre 3.11 in.; rifling polygroove; grooves 38. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted with tangent sights on both sides, and muzzle sight, the former inclined towards each other, having Vernier cross-heads, and being graduated in Persian numerals.\*
3. Ordnance iron B. L. rifled 9-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 4 ft. 7 in.; calibre 3.07 in.; rifling polygroove; grooves 37. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted with tangent sights on both sides, and muzzle sight, the former inclined towards each other, having Vernier cross-heads, and being graduated in Persian numerals.\*

Fitted with tangent sights on both sides, and muzzle sight, the former inclined towards each other, having Vernier cross-heads, and being graduated in Persian numerals.\*
6. Ordnance iron B. L. rifled 9-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 5 in.; length of bore 4 ft. 7 in.; calibre 3.10 in.; rifling polygroove; grooves 38. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted with tangent sights on both sides, and muzzle sight, the former inclined towards each other, having Vernier cross-heads, and being graduated in Persian numerals.\*
1. Ordnance bronze M. L. S. B. 6-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 2 in.; length of bore 4 ft. 11 in.; calibre 3.69. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted for tangent sight. Sight itself deficient.
2. Ordnance bronze M. L. S. B. 6-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 5 ft.; calibre 3.69 in. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted for tangent sight.
3. Ordnance bronze M. L. S. B. 6-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 5 ft.; calibre 3.60 in. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted for tangent sight. Carriage has two Madras wheels.
4. Ordnance bronze M. L. S. B. 6-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 4 ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; calibre 3.56 in. Persian scrolls and lion's head on top of gun. Fitted for tangent sight.
5. Ordnance bronze M. L. S. B. 6-pr. gun. Length of gun 5 ft. 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.; length of bore 4 ft. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$  in.

\* Nos. 1 and 6 guns are mounted on 6-pr. S.B. carriages, bearing the Agra mark. The other carriages are of Afghan make and all six unserviceable. Nos. 2 and 6 have got 2 Madras pattern wheels each, taken no doubt from the carriages captured at Khushk-i-Nakhud.
