

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.**BYE-LAWS AS TO HOUSES LET IN LODGINGS.**

WHEREAS application has been made to the Local Government Board by the Trustees for the district and harbour of Maryport, in the county of Cumberland, acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said district, to declare by notice, to be published in the London Gazette, the enactment contained in the 90th section of the Public Health Act, 1875, to be in force within the said district.

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, do hereby give notice and declare, that the said enactment is in force within the district of Maryport aforesaid.

ADDITIONAL RULE as to Investigations into Shipping Casualties. 1880.

WHEREAS the Secretary of State has directed that such of the Assessors as were on the list immediately before the 31st March last, but were omitted from the new list then made as not complying with the technical qualifications required for the various classes into which the Assessors were thenceforward to be classified, should be replaced on the list in such class or classes respectively as upon consideration of their practical experience he has deemed appropriate.

Now under the authority of the above-mentioned Acts, I, the Right Honourable Roundell, Baron Selborne, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, hereby make the following rule, viz. :—

That for the purposes of the Rules of 20th December, 1879, and 19th April, 1880, made under the above-mentioned Acts, the said Assessors shall be deemed respectively to belong to the classes in which they have been placed as aforesaid by the Secretary of State.
