NOTICE TO MARINERS. (No. 214.)—MEDITERRANEAN. ASIA MINOR-GULF OF SMYRNA.

(1.) Yani Kedeese Lights-Alteration in Colour. THE Turkish Government has given notice, that on the 15th November, 1880, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the lights exhibited from the light-vessel moored off the extremity of Yani Kedeese (Pelican, Hermus, or Keder) Spit, northern side of entrance to Smyrna Harbour:-

The two green lights are discontinued, and in lieu thereof, two fixed white lights placed vertically are exhibited, which should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles—the upper

light is elevated 49 feet above the sea. (2.) Sanjak Spit Lights—Alteration in Colour.

Also, that on 15th November, 1880, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the lights exhibited from the light-vessel moored at the extremity of Sanjak (Sandjak) Spit, northern side of entrance to Smyrna Harbour :-

The two green lights are discontinued, and in lieu thereof, two fixed white lights placed vertically are exhibited, which should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles—the upper light is elevated 49 feet above the sea.

The lights are fixed white lights placed vertically the upper light is elevated 49 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a

distance of 10 miles.

COAST OF TRIPOLI.
