By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order, except the lines of railway within that area as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through that area, without being untrucked within it, (with which transit nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere,) is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale of animals shall be held in the said area except with the licence of the Privy Council.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

4. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

THE Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Mr. William Turner to superintend the transfer of Lascars or other persons at the Port of Cardiff, and to grant the Certificate required under Section 23 of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment-Act, 18 and 19 Vic., cap. 91.

The fee to be paid for every Lascar or other person in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

ASIA MINOR—GULF OF SMYRNA.

(1.) *Yani Kedese Lights—Alteration in Colour.*

THE Turkish Government has given notice, that on the 15th November, 1880, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the lights exhibited from the light-vessel moored off the extremity of Yani Kedese (Pelican, Hermus, or Keder) Spit, northern side of entrance to Smyrna Harbour:—

The two green lights are discontinued, and in lieu thereof, two fixed white lights placed vertically are exhibited, which should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles—the upper light is elevated 49 feet above the sea.

(2.) *Sanjak Spit Lights—Alteration in Colour.*

Also, that on 15th November, 1880, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the lights exhibited from the light-vessel moored at the extremity of Sanjak (Sandjak) Spit, northern side of entrance to Smyrna Harbour:—

The two green lights are discontinued, and in lieu thereof, two fixed white lights placed vertically are exhibited, which should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles—the upper light is elevated 49 feet above the sea.

BLACK SEA.

ASIA MINOR—NORTH COAST.

Also, with reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 191 (6), (7), and (8), of 13th December, 1879, on the intended exhibition of certain lights on the north coast of Asia Minor:—

Further notice has been given, that on 15th November, 1880, the following lights would be exhibited.

(3.) *Fixed Light on Vona Point.*

This light is exhibited from a position 54 yards from the extremity of Vona Point.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 131 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

Position, lat. $41^{\circ} 8' 0''$ N., long. $37^{\circ} 48' 15''$ E.

(4.) *Fixed Red Light on Tchiva Point.*

These lights are exhibited from the extremity of Tchiva (Iris) Point.

The two lights are fixed red lights placed vertically—the upper light is elevated 49 feet above sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles.

Position, lat. $41^{\circ} 20' 40''$ N., long. $36^{\circ} 38' 15''$ E.

(5.) *Fixed Lights on Cape Bafra.*

These lights are exhibited from Cape Bafra (Baffra) or Halys Point, the northern extremity of the islet formed by the two arms of the River Kysyl Irmak (Kazil Limak).

The lights are fixed white lights placed vertically—the upper light is elevated 49 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

Position, lat. $41^{\circ} 44' 0''$ N., long. $35^{\circ} 59' 0''$ E.

COAST OF TRIPOLI.

Also, that the lighthouses undermentioned are in course of construction on the coast of Tripoli, and from which it is intended lights will be exhibited as follows:—

(6.) *Intended Light at Lebidah.*

The light to be exhibited at Lebidah (Omz or Homs) should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

Position approximate, lat. $32^{\circ} 40' 0''$ N., long. $14^{\circ} 16' 0''$ E.

(7.) *Intended Light on Cape Misratah.*

The light to be exhibited on Cape Misratah should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 15 miles.

Position approximate, lat. $32^{\circ} 23' 0''$ N., long. $15^{\circ} 12' 0''$ E.

Further notice will be given of the date on which these two lights (6 and 7) will be exhibited.
