AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of December, 1880.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order, except the lines of railway within that area as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through that area, without being untrucked within it, (with which transit nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere,) is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale of animals shall be held in the said area except with the licence of the Privy Council.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty.

4. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

An area comprising the County of Norfolk, and the Boroughs of King's Lynn, Norwich, Thetford, and Yarmouth

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:
