THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

2. Notwithstanding anything in Articles 20 and 21 (*Area infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease*) of The Animals Order, a declaration such as is indicated in the form given in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect, made by the owner of the animals mentioned in the declaration, or by his agent authorized in writing for that purpose, may be substituted for the certificate of health of a Veterinary Inspector required by those Articles to be produced as a condition precedent to the granting of a licence for movement of animals in, into, or out of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease; and the forms of movement licence numbered (3) and (4) given in the First Schedule to The Animals Order may be varied accordingly.
