

herely, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of Saint Luke, Ramsgate, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and to be receivable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the incumbent of the said vicarage shall be paid only upon the production to us on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year of a certificate under the hand of the Archbishop of Canterbury, that an Assistant-Curate, duly licensed by such Archbishop, has been employed within the parish of Saint Luke, Ramsgate aforesaid, during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parish and vicarage of Saint Luke, Ramsgate.
