HER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, on a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, to appoint Loftus Thomas Monro, Esq., M.A., late Scholar of Queen's College, Cambridge, to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

WHEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that upon the completion of any new lighthouse (in which term are included floating and other lights exhibited for the guidance of ships) Her Majesty may by Order in Council fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount thereof, and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions, in, by, and subject to which the Light Dues authorized to be levied by the said Act are paid and collected:

And whereas the Corporation of Trinity House, of Deptford Strond, have placed at the southern end of Haisbro' Sand a light-vessel called the "Would" light-vessel, and a light is already exhibited therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that, from and after the date of the present Order, there shall be paid in respect of the said light-vessel, for every ship, whether British or Foreign, which may pass or derive benefit therefrom, a toll of four-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an over-sea voyage, and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage.

The said Toll shall be levied subject to the

regulations and exemptions contained in the Consolidated Tables of Light Dues sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables sanctioned by Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned; and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of sixty per centum mentioned in such last-named Order in Council of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following; that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the district

parish of Saint John, Upper Holloway in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the district parish of Saint John Upper Holloway as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John, Bishop of the said diocese of London, and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Woodhouse Dearden, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said district parish of Saint John Upper Holloway (in testimony of which consents they the said John Bishop of the diocese of London and the said Henry Woodhouse Dearden have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said district parish of Saint John, Upper Holloway, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of such district parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Upper Holloway.'

"And with the like consent of the said John, Bishop of the said diocese of London and of the said Henry Woodhouse Dearden (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Peter situate within the limits of the district parish of Saint John Upper Holloway as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the said Henry Woodhouse Dearden shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent of the said vicarage of the district parish of Saint John, Upper Holloway as aforesaid all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Peter situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Henry Woodhouse Dearden, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Upper Holloway being:—

"All that part of the district parish of Saint John, Upper Holloway in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which is bounded on the south and on part of the west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mary Brookfield in the county and diocese aforesaid and on the remaining parts of the west partly by the parish of Saint Anne Brookfield Highgate Rise

and partly by the parish of Saint Michael Highgate both which lastly mentioned cures are in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint John Upper Holloway from the said parish of Saint Michael Highgate crosses the middle of the roadway at the top of Highgate Hill and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the roadway called Highgate Hill as aforesaid for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets Junction-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the point at the north-eastern end of the roadway called Cathcart Hill where the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint John Upper Holloway from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mary Brookfield aforesaid crosses the said Junction-road."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows; viz.:—

In Christchurch Churchyard, in the county of Monmouth, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
