**H**ER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, on a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education, to appoint Loftus Thomas Monro, Esq., M.A., late Scholar of Queen's College, Cambridge, to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

**W**HEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that upon the completion of any new lighthouse (in which term are included floating and other lights exhibited for the guidance of ships) Her Majesty may by Order in Council fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount thereof, and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions, in, by, and subject to which the Light Dues authorized to be levied by the said Act are paid and collected:

And whereas the Corporation of Trinity House, of Deptford Strond, have placed at the southern end of Haisbro' Sand a light-vessel called the "Would" light-vessel, and a light is already exhibited therefrom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that, from and after the date of the present Order, there shall be paid in respect of the said light-vessel, for every ship, whether British or Foreign, which may pass or derive benefit therefrom, a toll of four-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an over-sea voyage, and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton of the burden of every such vessel for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage.

The said Toll shall be levied subject to the

regulations and exemptions contained in the Consolidated Tables of Light Dues sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables sanctioned by Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned; and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of sixty per centum mentioned in such last-named Order in Council of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force.
