THE accompanying Despatch has been received by the Earl of Kimberley from Sir George Cumine Strahan, K.C.M.G., Administrator of the Cape of Good Hope:—

November 30, 1880.

IN continuation of my Despatch No. 101 of the 23rd instant, I have the honour to inform your Lordship that the following casualties in the Colonial Forces have since been reported, viz.:—

On the 20th, Mr. Saunders, Commandant, Basuto Police, killed at Leribe.

On the 22nd, Private Ebden, D.E.O.V. Rifles, wounded in foot at Mafeteng.

Two men, Ferreira and Olsen, woodcutters, have also been reported murdered at Isomo Drift on the 22nd instant.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 4th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £1,605,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 3th day of January, 1881, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 8th April or 8th July next, respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 5th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Saturday, the 8th proximo.
