

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Lincolnshire, holden at Great Grimsby.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against William Westoby, of South Killingholme, and of Goxhill, both in the county of Lincoln, Farmer.

UPON the hearing of this Petition this day, and upon proof satisfactory to the Court of the debt of the Petitioner, and of the act of Bankruptcy alleged to have been committed by the said William Westoby having been given, it is ordered that the said William Westoby be, and he is hereby, adjudged bankrupt.—Given under the Seal of the Court this 23rd day of December, 1880.
