ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Friday next, the 7th instant, for Her late Royal Highness The Dowager Grand Duchess of Mecklenburg Strelitz; viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Friday, the 14th instant; viz. :—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Sunday, the 16th instant, the Court to go out of Mourning.

Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech, delivered by the Lords Commissioners, to both Houses of Parliament, on Thursday, January 6, 1881.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

I HAVE called you, at a period earlier than usual, to the resumption of your labours, as some affairs of more than common urgency demand your attention.

My relations with Foreign Powers continue to be friendly and harmonious.

The main question relating to the Frontier between Turkey and Montenegro has been settled.

The Powers are now engaged in communications which have in view the determination of the Frontier between Turkey and Greece.

Some important portions of the Treaty of Berlin, which have so long remained without fulfilment, continue to form an object of my anxious attention.

A rising in the Transvaal has recently imposed upon me the duty of taking military measures with a view to the prompt vindication of my authority; and has of necessity set aside for the time any plan for securing to the European settlers that full control over their own local affairs, without prejudice to the interests of the natives, which I had been desirous to confer.

I regret that the War in Basutoland still continues, notwithstanding the efforts of the Cape Government. It would cause me much satisfaction if a suitable occasion should present itself for

friendly action on my part with a view to the restoration of peace.

The War in Afghanistan has been brought to a close, and, with the exception of the Candahar force, my troops have been recalled within the Indian frontier. It is not my intention that the occupation of Candahar shall be permanently maintained; but the still unsettled condition of the country, and the consequent difficulty of establishing a Native Government, have delayed for a time the withdrawal of the army from that position.

Papers on the several subjects to which I have adverted, as well as further Correspondence on the Military Estimates of India, will be presented to you.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

The Estimates for the Services of the coming year are in a forward state of preparation, and will be speedily laid before you.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

There has been a gradual, though not very rapid, improvement in the trade of the country; and I am now able to entertain a more favourable expectation of the Revenue for the year than I could form at its commencement.

The anticipation, with which I last addressed you, of a great diminution of the distress in Ireland, owing to an abundant harvest, was realized; but I grieve to state that the social condition of the country has assumed an alarming character. Agrarian crimes in general have multiplied far beyond the experience of recent years. Attempts upon life have not grown in the same proportion as other offences; but I must add that efforts have been made for personal protection, far beyond all former precedent, by the police, under the direction of the Executive; I have to notice other evils yet more widely spread. The administration of justice has been frustrated, with respect to these offences, through the impossibility of procuring evidence; and an extended system of terror has thus been established, in various parts of the country, which has paralyzed almost alike the exercise of private rights and the performance of civil duties.

In a state of things new in some important respects, and hence with little of available guidance from former precedent, I have deemed it right steadily to put in use the ordinary powers of the law before making any new demand. But a demonstration of their insufficiency, amply supplied by the present circumstances of the country, leads me now to apprise you that proposals will be

immediately submitted to you for entrusting me with additional powers, necessary in my judgment not only for the vindication of order and public law, but likewise to secure, on behalf of my subjects, protection for life and property, and personal liberty of action.

Subject to the primary and imperious obligations to which I have just referred, I continue to desire not less than heretofore to prosecute the removal of grievance and the work of legislative improvement in Ireland as well as in Great Britain.

The Irish Land Act of 1870 has been productive of great benefits, and has much contributed to the security and comparative well-being of the occupiers of the soil, without diminishing the value or disturbing the foundations of property. In some respects, however, and more particularly under the strain of recent and calamitous years, the protection which it supplied has not been found sufficient, either in Ulster or the other Provinces.

I recommend you to undertake the further development of its principles in a manner conformable to the special wants of Ireland, both as regards the relation of landlord and tenant, and with a view to effective efforts for giving to a larger portion of the people by purchase a permanent proprietary interest in the soil. This legislation will require the removal, for the purposes in view, of all obstacles arising out of limitations on the ownership of property with a due provision for the security of the interests involved.

A measure will be submitted to you for the establishment of County Government in Ireland, founded upon representative principles, and framed with the double aim of confirming popular control over expenditure, and of supplying a yet more serious want by extending the formation of habits of local self-government.

Bills will be laid before you for the Abolition of Corporal Punishment in the Army and in the Navy.

You will be asked to consider measures for the further Reform of the Law of Bankruptcy; for the Conservancy of Rivers and the Prevention of Floods; for revising the constitution of Endowed Schools and Hospitals in Scotland; for the renewal of the Act which established Secret Voting; and for repressing the Corrupt Practices of which, in a limited number of towns, there were lamentable examples at the last General Election.

I trust that your labours, which will be even more than usually arduous, may be so guided by Divine Providence as to promote the happiness of my people.

of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as **The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881.**

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall operate notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3. This Order operates in and in relation to all areas for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease in England or Wales or Scotland, but not elsewhere.

Markets, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Public Sales in Infected Areas.

4. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale by public auction or other public sale of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) shall be held in an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, except as authorized by or under this Order.

5. Markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales for the sale or exhibition of fat animals intended for slaughter may be held in an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, with the licence of the Local Authority, on the following conditions; and every such licence shall specify the following as the conditions on which the licence is granted (namely):

- (a.) Cattle exposed for sale or exhibited in a market, fair, exhibition, or sale so licensed shall be marked by the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the cattle, at his own expense, by clipping a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left hind quarter of each of them.
- (b.) Animals so exposed for sale or exhibited shall be slaughtered within six days after such exposure or exhibition.
- (c.) Animals so exposed or exhibited shall not be afterwards exposed or exhibited in or at any other market, fair, exhibition, sale by public auction or other public sale of animals.
- (d.) Animals so exposed for sale shall not be moved alive out of the infected area.

6. If the Privy Council are of opinion on inquiry, with respect to any licence granted by a Local Authority under this Order, that the holding of the market, fair, exhibition, or sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

7. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) may be held with the licence of the Privy Council.

8. Nothing in the foregoing provisions shall be deemed to interfere with, or make a licence (either of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority) necessary for, a sale of animals being on a farm or premises not in a place infected with foot-and-

Movement in or into or out of Infected Areas.

9.—(a.) Animals not affected with foot-and-mouth disease may be moved in or into or out of such parts of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease as are not comprised in a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease, in accordance with the following Regulations, and not otherwise:

A.—Movement in.

(i.) The animals may be moved in those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not, to the best of his knowledge and belief, been exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease, or on a declaration such as is indicated in Form A in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect, made by the owner of the animals described in the declaration, or by his agent authorized in writing for that purpose.

(ii.) The animals may be moved in those parts of the area from one part of a farm or of farms in the same occupation to another part of that farm or of those farms, or from and to a farm or premises to and from a common or grazing-land which the occupier of the farm or premises is entitled to use for the animals, with a licence of the Local Authority (to be called an Occupation Licence) such as is indicated in Form B in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid; which Occupation Licence may authorize the movement from time to time of those animals for a period of fourteen days and no longer.

B.—Movement into.

(iii.) The animals may be moved into those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid.

C.—Movement into, from another District.

(iv.) If the animals to be moved into those parts of the area, under Regulation B, are to be moved out of the district of another Local Authority, whether that district is within the area or not, the licence must be a licence of the Local Authority out of whose district the animals are to be moved; and there must also be a licence of the Local Authority into whose district the animals are to be moved, indorsed on or referring to the first-mentioned licence; which second licence must be obtained before the animals are so moved.

D.—Movement out.

(v.) The animals may be moved out of those parts of the area with a licence of the Local Authority, on a certificate or declaration as aforesaid.

(vi.) The licence shall specify the place to which, and the person to whom, the animals are to be moved.

(vii.) The animals, after they are received at the place specified in the licence, shall not be

again moved except with a further licence of the Local Authority of the district in which that place is situate.

E.—Movement out, into another District.

(viii.) If the animals are to be moved into the district of another Local Authority under Regulation D, there must also be a licence of that other Local Authority indorsed on or referring to the first-mentioned licence; which second licence must be obtained before the animals are so moved.

(ix.) The animals, after they are received at the place specified in the licence of that other Local Authority, shall not be again moved except with a further licence of that other Local Authority.

(b.) Nothing in Regulation D or E shall authorize the granting of a licence by a Local Authority for the movement out of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease of animals that have been exposed for sale or exhibited in a market, fair, exhibition, or sale licensed by a Local Authority under this Order.

(c.) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to imply that a licence is necessary for movement of animals except where the movement is intended to be wholly or in part on a highway or thoroughfare, or on a railway, canal, river, or inland navigation.

10.—(a.) A licence granted under the last foregoing Article shall not be available except when accompanied by the certificate or declaration on which it is granted.

(b.) The person granting the licence shall, for the identification of the certificate or declaration produced to him, mark the certificate or declaration by signing his name thereon, with the date of its production to him.

(c.) The person granting the licence shall deliver the certificate or declaration with the licence to the person receiving the licence from him.

11. Where an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease comprises the whole or parts of the districts of more Local Authorities than one, then, notwithstanding anything in this Order, those Local Authorities, or any two of them, may, if they think fit, agree that animals may be moved out of the district of one of those Local Authorities agreeing into the district of another of those Local Authorities agreeing, without a licence of that other Local Authority, provided that in every such case the movement is into and out of such parts only of the area as are not comprised in a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Forms.

12.—(a.) The forms given in the Schedule to this Order, with such variations as circumstances require, may be used for the purposes of this Order.

(b.) The words set forth in Form E in the Schedule to this Order, or words to the like effect, shall be printed on the back of each licence issued in Form B, C, or D in the Schedule to this Order.

(c.) Forms of declaration given in the Order of Council (No. 564) of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, which have been before the making of this Order prepared and are already printed for use by a Local Authority, may be used, as far as they are suitable, and with the requisite adaptations, for the purposes of this Order.

Offences.

13.—(a.) If a head of cattle required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be marked is not so marked, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(b.) If an animal required by this Order, or by a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, the owner thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the company or person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(d.) If an animal is sold, or exposed, or put up for sale, or exhibited, in contravention of this Order, or of a licence of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority thereunder, or if a company or person hold a market, fair, exhibition, or sale in contravention of this Order, or fail to comply with any of the conditions, provisions, or regulations of a licence for the holding of a market, fair, exhibition, or sale, the seller of the animal, and the auctioneer putting the same up for sale, and the person exposing the same for sale or exhibiting

the same, and the company or person holding the market, fair, exhibition, or sale, or so failing, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Revocation.

14.—(a.) Articles 20 and 21 (*Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease*) of The Animals Order, and the Order of Council (No. 564) of the thirteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, are, as from the commencement of this Order, hereby revoked; but nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under those Articles or Order before this Order takes effect, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Articles or Order.

(b.) As from the commencement of this Order, all the regulations relating to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals contained in the Orders of Council declaring areas to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease then in force are hereby revoked; and in lieu thereof the provisions of this Order relating to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals shall apply to the holding of markets, fairs, exhibitions, or sales of animals within those areas; and all licences for the holding of markets, exhibitions, or sales of animals granted by the Privy Council or by a Local Authority under those Orders or any of them, in force at the commencement of this Order, are hereby revoked.

(a.) shall be slaughtered within ten days after such exposure ; and

1. This Order may be cited as **The Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1881.**

This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

3.—(a.) This Order extends throughout England, except to—

- (i.) Foreign animals wharves in England; and
- (ii.) Areas in England for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (for which areas provision is made, as regards markets, fairs, exhibitions, and public sales, by The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881); and
- (iii.) The Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, in the Metropolis, save so far as this Order relates to the exposure or exhibition for sale in another market of cattle marked as in this Order required (provision being made for the Metropolitan Cattle Market by The Metropolitan Cattle Market (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Temporary Order of 1881).

(b.) This Order does not extend to Wales or Scotland.

Regulations as to Markets, Fairs, Exhibitions, and Public Sales.

4. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale by public auction or other public sale of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) shall be held except as authorized by or under this Order.

5. Markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales for the sale or exhibition of fat animals intended for slaughter may be held with the licence of the Local Authority on the following conditions; and every such licence shall specify the following as the conditions on which the licence is granted (namely):

- (i.) Cattle exposed for sale or exhibited in or at a market, fair, exhibition, or sale so licensed shall be marked by the owner, consignee, or other person exposing or exhibiting the cattle, at his own expense, by clipping a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left hind quarter of each of them.
- (ii.) Animals so exposed for sale or exhibited shall be slaughtered within six days after such exposure or exhibition.
- (iii.) Animals so exposed or exhibited shall not be afterwards exposed or exhibited in or at any other market, fair, exhibition, sale by public auction or other public sale of animals.

6. If the Privy Council are of opinion on inquiry, with respect to any licence granted by a Local Authority under this Order, that the holding of the market, fair, exhibition, or sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

7. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, markets, fairs, exhibitions, and sales by public auction or other public sales of animals (whether or not being fat animals

intended for slaughter) may be held with the licence of the Privy Council.

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

2. The limits of the area which is described in the Order of Council dated the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and is thereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, being part of the county

of Surrey, are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, except the lines of railway within that last-mentioned area, as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through that last-mentioned area, without being untrucked within it, (with which transit nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere); and the area described in the Schedule to this Order, except as aforesaid, is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. No market, fair, exhibition, or sale of animals shall be held in the area described in the Schedule to this Order except as follows:

Markets, exhibitions, and sales of animals may be held with the licence in writing of the Local Authority.

Animals exposed for sale or exhibited in such markets, exhibitions, or sales so licensed shall be slaughtered within ten days after the holding of the market, exhibition, or sale (as the case may be), and every licence so granted by the Local Authority shall specify such slaughter as the condition on which the licence is granted.

4. If any animal so required to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the purchaser or owner thereof or his agent (as the case may be) shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.**Order of Secretary of State continuing Special Exception.**

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M. and ending at 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

(1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the

period of employment not less than two hours, of which half an hour shall be after five o'clock in the evening; and

(2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than 5 days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in any 12 months.

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section;

And whereas it was proved to the satisfaction of the Right Honourable Sir Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that in the non-textile factories of the classes mentioned in the schedule hereunder it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby;

And whereas the said Sir Richard Assheton Cross did, by order made 13th December, 1879 under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly, to continue until 31st December, 1880;

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that it is expedient further to continue such order;

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order that the said exception continue, unless previously revoked, until 31st December, 1882.
