

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the London Bankruptcy Court.

In the Matter of Francis O'Brien, of 43, Parliament-street, in the city of Westminster, trading under the style of F. O'Brien and Co., Banker, and person receiving other men's moneys or estates into his trust or custody, adjudicated a Bankrupt on the 10th day of April, 1877.
