The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty, as hereinafter directed, cause with respect to his own diocese a statement in writing of the facts and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices,

sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing bearing date the second day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty in the words and figures following that is to say:

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan de hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend George Lord Bishop of Salisbury as the Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Calstone Wellington in the county of Wilts and the rectory of Blackland in the same county having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice we enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Henry Charles Keith Petty Marquess of Lansdowne being the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Calstone Wellington the same being now vacant and Douglas John Kinneir Macdonald of the Close Salisbury in the county of Wilts Esquire and James Patrick Hadow, of No. 25 Cambridge-square, in the county of Middlesex Esquire being the patrons or persons entitled upon the nomination and by the direction of Elizabeth Macdonald of Calstone Wellington aforesaid Widow to present to the said benefice of Blackland the same being now vacant have signified their consent in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the afore-

said representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Salisbury our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consents in writing of the several patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only And for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall after the benefices shall have been united into one benefice present to such united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say the said Marquess of Lansdowne his heirs and assigns shall be entitled to the second fourth sixth eighth tenth and every like alternate turn or right of presentation for ever and the said Douglas John Kinneir Macdonald and James Patrick Hadow the trustees under indenture of settlement of the twenty-seventh of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine their heirs and assigns shall be entitled to the first third fifth seventh and ninth and every like alternate turn or right of presentation for ever.

"As witness our hand this second day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty. . . *A. C. Cantuar.*"

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered that that the rectory of Calstone Wellington situate in the county of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury and the rectory of Blackland situate in the same county and diocese shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council is pleased to give directions and declare that the course and succession in which the respective patrons for the time being shall present or nominate to the said united benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say:—The said Marquess of Lansdowne his heirs and assigns shall be entitled to the second fourth sixth eighth tenth and every like alternate turn or right of presentation for ever and the said Douglas John Kinneir Macdonald and James Patrick Hadow the trustees under the indenture of settlement of the twenty-seventh of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine their heirs and assigns shall be entitled to the first third fifth seventh and ninth and every like alternate turn or right of presentation for ever. *C. WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of

Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighteenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas situate at Garstang in the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Garstang in the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Garstang as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Thomas Garstang.'

"And with the like consent of the said James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Garstang as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Thomas Garstang, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester wherein the present incum-

bent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the east by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Calder Vale on the north partly by the new parish of Saint Peter Scorton and partly by the new parish of Saint Luke Winmarleigh all in the county and diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining sides that is to say on the south-west and on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Winmarleigh from the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town aforesaid at a point at or near to the Winmarleigh Railway Station where the line of the Garstang and Knot End Railway crosses the road leading from Helm Farm past the said railway station, Three Lane Ends and Brook House into Longmore-lane and extending thence that is from the said boundary first southward and then generally south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of seventy-two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Longmore-lane aforesaid at or near to which point of junction a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. St. T. D. C. 1880 No. 1' has been placed and extending thence eastward and in a direct line for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. St. T. D. C. 1880, No. 2,' and placed at or near to the point where Kettle-lane joins the road leading from Cockerham to Church Town and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned boundary-stone south-eastward to and along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. St. T. D. C. 1880, No. 3,' and placed on the eastern side of the said last-described road at or near to its junction with the roadway leading past Hag Wood to Kirkland Hall and extending thence that is from the last-described point eastward to the last-mentioned boundary-stone and continuing thence due eastward and in a straight line for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Wyre upon the boundary which divides the township of Kirkland in the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town from the township of Barnacre with Bonds in the same parish and extending thence generally south-eastward along the said township boundary for a distance of one mile and six chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of the River Wyre aforesaid to the point where the said river is joined by the River Calder and where the said township boundary joins the boundary which divides the said township of Barnacre with Bonds from the township of Catterall in the parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town aforesaid and extending thence generally eastward along the last-mentioned township boundary for a distance of one mile and twenty-one and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the River Calder aforesaid to the point at the northern end of the Catterall Basin of the Preston and Lancaster Canal where the same township boundary strikes the said canal and extending thence north-eastward along the same township boundary thereby following the course of the canal aforesaid for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to the point at the canal feeder where the said township boundary diverges from the said canal in a south-easterly direction and continuing thence still north-eastward along the middle of the same canal for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Wray-lane over the said canal and extending

thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts thereby passing under the line of the Lancaster and Preston Railway to the boundary at the junction of the said last-named lane with Sandholme-lane opposite to the house called or known as Ringing Hill which boundary divides the said parish of Saint Helen Garstang otherwise called or known as Church Town from the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist Calder Vale aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter thirty-nine have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (which said church and cure are hereinafter called the said benefice) of Norton-juxta-Malton in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas the said advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Norton-juxta-Malton is now vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in Arthur Howland Jackson of Malton aforesaid Gentleman.

"And whereas Robert Hartley Bower of Welham near Malton aforesaid Esquire and Thomas Preston of Norton aforesaid Esquire have (as the said Arthur Howland Jackson by his execution of this present scheme as hereinafter mentioned doth acknowledge) paid to the said Arthur Howland Jackson for his own use and benefit and as the price of the said advowson and perpetual right of patronage a certain sum to wit the sum of five hundred pounds upon condition that he the said Arthur Howland Jackson shall transfer the same advowson or perpetual right of patronage for the whole of his said estate and interest therein to the Archbishop of York for the time being and his successors and shall for that purpose and to that intent execute this scheme as hereinbefore and hereinafter is mentioned.

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William now Archbishop of York is willing to accept for himself and his successors in

the See of York the said proposed transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said William Archbishop of York has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas a sum of one hundred pounds sterling has been paid over to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England by the said William Archbishop of York to be held by us for the benefit of the said benefice of Norton-juxta-Malton but upon condition that the transfer of the patronage of the same benefice which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed shall be made and the said William Archbishop of York has further undertaken if such last-mentioned transfer of patronage be effected to offer and provide a further benefaction of the value of five hundred pounds in aid of the endowment of the said benefice and in order to obtain from us the said Commissioners an equivalent grant out of the common fund under our control; and, under the circumstances aforesaid, it appears to us that the said transfer of patronage will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or chapelry of Norton-juxta-Malton being the parish or cure in or in respect of which the said right of patronage and advowson arises and exists.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Arthur Howland Jackson in whom as aforesaid the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of the said benefice of Norton-juxta-Malton is now (subject as aforesaid) vested and with the consents of the said Robert Hartley Bower and Thomas Preston as the purchasers of the same advowson or perpetual right of patronage as aforesaid (in testimony whereof each of them the said Arthur Howland Jackson Robert Hartley Bower and Thomas Preston has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said William Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Norton-juxta-Malton now vested in the said Arthur Howland Jackson as aforesaid (subject to the purchase of the same by the said Robert Hartley Bower and Thomas Preston as aforesaid) shall be transferred from the said Arthur Howland Jackson and (according to their estate and interest therein) from the said Robert Hartley Bower and Thomas Preston to the said William Archbishop of York and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Archbishop of York and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her

Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows; viz.:

In the churchyard of the parish of Epworth, in the county of Lincoln, to the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the churchyard of the parish of Wymondham, in the county of Norfolk, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the churchyard of the parish of Barrow, in the county of Suffolk, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In Bickerton Churchyard, in the county of Chester, to the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Welwyn, in the county of Herts, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Owston, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

The building and tower are painted white, lantern red.

The eastern high light, which, kept in line with the low light, leads through the channel southward of Tincum Island, is a fixed red light, elevated 100 feet above high water, and visible through an arc of 120° ; it is exhibited from an iron tower, 80 feet high, painted black, and showing above the trees.

These leading lights in line intersect in deep water the line of Schooner Ledge Leading Lights, and

vessels can pass directly from the one to the other taking care not to proceed beyond the intersection. Proceeding up the river, the lights should be kept in line until Fort Mifflin Bar Low Leading Light is visible, when the course should be altered two points to port.

The western high light, which, kept in line with the low light, leads through the Cut over Fort Mifflin Bar, is a fixed red light, elevated 53 feet above high water, and visible through an arc of 120°; it is shown from a frame structure with frame tower attached; the house and tower are painted white; lantern black. These leading lights should be kept in line, when proceeding down the river, until Tincum Island High Leading Light is visible, when the course should be altered one and a half points to starboard—proceeding up the river, they should be kept in line to the point of intersection with the Schuylkill Leading Lights.

The illuminating apparatus of each of these three lights is catadioptric, or by reflectors and lenses, of the fifth order.
