The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notwithstanding anything in The Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1881, the provisions of that Order shall, from and immediately after the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, extend throughout Wales, as well as throughout England, except to—

- (i.) Foreign animals wharves in Wales; and
- (ii.) Areas in Wales for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (for which areas provision is made, as regards markets, fairs, exhibitions, and public sales, by The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881, and The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order (Amendment) of 1881).

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the area which is described in the Order of Council dated the eleventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and is thereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, namely—that portion of the parish of Headington, in the county of Oxford, lying on the north side of the Old Stokenchurch Turnpike Road;—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the Schedule to this Order, except the lines of railway within that last-mentioned area, as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through that last-mentioned area, without being untrucked within it, (with which transit nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere); and the area described in the Schedule to this Order, except as aforesaid, is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

THE Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has appointed Thomas Henry Huxley, Esq., Doctor of Laws, Professor of Natural History, &c., to be an Inspector of Salmon Fisheries, in the room of Francis Trevelyan Buckland, Esq., deceased.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds were prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the 8th section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State :

And whereas the Justices acting in and for the Parts of Holland, in the county of Lincoln, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited shall be varied in the Parts of Holland, in the county of Lincoln, so as to be from the 15th day of March up to and inclusive of the 31st day of August, in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows :—

The time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited, shall be varied in the parts of Holland, in the county of Lincoln so as to be from the 15th day of March up to and inclusive of the 31st day of August, in each year.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.

BYE-LAWS AS TO HOUSES LET IN LODGINGS.

Southam Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Southam Union, in the Counties of Warwick and Northampton;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Southam Union, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—Every able-bodied male pauper who may receive relief within the Union, and may be relieved out of the Workhouse, with the approbation of the Local Government Board, according to Article VI of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 21st day of December, 1844, in force in the Union, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government shall require.

ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government

Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with his services.

THE United States Government has given notice, that on 1st February, 1881, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Tillamook Rock, off Tillamook Head, near Columbia River.

The light will be a flashing white light of the first order, showing a flash every five seconds, elevated 133 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 17 miles.

NOTE.—Tillamook Rock is situated about one mile from the main land, with an isolated rock just above water about midway between it and Tillamook Head. The least water close to either of these rocks is 15 fathoms, but strangers should not attempt the passage, as the currents are strong and irregular.

Vessels approaching Columbia River Bar from the southward, can pass westward of Tillamook Rock with safety at the distance of half a mile. After passing the rock at this distance, vessels should keep seaward of the line joining Tillamook Rock and Cape Disappointment Lights.

FOG SIGNAL.—During thick and foggy weather a steam fog siren on Tillamook Rock will give blasts of five seconds' duration at intervals of one and a half minutes.

COLUMBIA RIVER ENTRANCE.
