The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary than an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order, except the lines of railway within that area as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through that area, without being untrucked within it, (with which transit nothing in this Order shall be deemed to interfere,) is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one ; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Consolidated Order. Outdoor Labour Test.

Pickering Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Pickering Union, in the North Riding of the county of York ;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes and places comprised in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Pickering Union, as follows :—

ARTICLE 1.—Every able-bodied male pauper who may receive relief within the Union, and may be relieved out of the Workhouse, with the approbation of the Local Government Board, according to Article VI of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the 21st day of December, 1844, in force in the Union, shall be relieved in the following manner ; that is to say :—

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person ; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

ARTICLE 4.—The word "Parish" in this Order means any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made, or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned ;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with his services.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the said town of Folkestone, according to the last Census, exceeds two thousand persons ;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said town, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Friday, the 20th day of August, 1880, it was resolved,—

“ That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her present Majesty (13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57), intitled ‘ An Act to prevent the holding of ‘ Vestry or other Meetings in Churches ‘ and for regulating the Appointment of ‘ Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and ‘ put in force in the township of Folkestone, ‘ with regard to that portion of it only which ‘ relates to the appointment of a Vestry ‘ Clerk, and that the amount of salary to be ‘ assigned to the Vestry Clerk be £40 per ‘ annum for the performance of the duties ‘ specified in clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, and 14 of ‘ Section 7 of the said Act.’ ”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said town have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolutions :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us

by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intitled “ An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry “ or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulat- “ ing the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said town of Folkestone ;

ARTICLE II.—The duties of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and of this Order shall be as follows :

To give notice of and attend the Meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend Meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers, when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the accounts of all Charity Moneys which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorized or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry Books and the Parish deeds and documents, and the Rate Books and Accounts which are closed, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of Four pence for every seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said Parish, at all reasonable times, to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies or permit such inspection.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said town shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act and of this Order a salary at the rate of Forty Pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as the Local Government Board may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of “ The Apportionment Act, 1870,” and shall be paid quarterly on the usual Quarter Days in each year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said town.

Cambridgeshire to Wit.

WHEREAS at a Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, holden at the Shirehall, in and for the county of Cambridge, on Thursday, the 6th day of January, in the year of Our Lord 1881, before Arthur Sperling, Esq., Chairman, and Edward Hicks, Esq., M.P., Robert Gregory Wale, Henry Williams Pemberton, and Henry Perkins, Esqrs., and others, their companions, Justices of Our Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the peace within the said county, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdeeds in the said county done and committed, a Provisional Order was made in the words following (that is to say):—
