REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary than an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

Sublime Porte, Le 3 Février, 1881.

DANS le but d'obvier aux nombreux inconvénients qui résultent de la non-application rigoureuse du règlement sur les passeports, la S. Porte a décidé de prendre des mesures propres à mettre fin aux contraventions de plus en plus fréquentes qui se produisent.

Il importe de combiner l'action des Autorités Impériales avec le concours des diverses compagnies de navigation à vapeur qui embarquent dans les ports Ottomans des passagers à destination de l'étranger.

Le ministère impérial vient en conséquence prier l'ambassade de Sa Majesté Britannique de donner à qui de droit les ordres nécessaires pour que les capitaines des bateaux anglais desservans, les échelles de l'empire n'aient pas à embarquer à l'avenir les gens non-munis de passeports, ni ceux qui ni les auront pas fait viser par le consulat du pays où ils se résident.

(Translation.)

In order to obviate the very great inconvenience arising from the fact that the regulations respecting passports are not rigorously enforced, the S. Porte has decided to take measures calculated to put an end to irregularities which are becoming more and more frequent.

It is important that the Imperial Authorities should act in concert with the various steam navigation companies which receive on board their ships in Ottoman ports passengers bound for foreign countries.

The Imperial Cabinet requests therefore the Embassy of Her Britannic Majesty to be so good as to give categorical orders in the proper quarter

that the captains of the English vessels calling at the ports of the Empire shall not receive on board any passenger who is not provided with a passport, or who has not obtained the visa of the consul of the country whither he is going.

**IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS (IRELAND)
ORDER, 1881, No. II.**

By the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council of
Ireland.

COWPER.

WHEREAS the Importation of Animals (Ireland) Order, 1881, will cease to have effect from and after the 28th day of February, 1881, and it is expedient that further measures should be taken to prevent the introduction of Foot-and-Mouth Disease into Ireland.

Now, We, the Lord Lieutenant-General and General Governor of Ireland, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council in Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in Us vested under the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the "Importation of Animals (Ireland) Order, 1881, No. II."

II. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the 28th day of February, 1881, and shall cease to have effect from and after the 31st day of March, 1881, except as regards the recovery of any penalty incurred thereunder before that day, and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Animals (Ireland) Order.

III. It shall not be lawful to import into or land in Ireland any animals from that part of the United Kingdom called England and Wales.

EXCHEQUER BILLS.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice to the holders of Exchequer Bills issued under the authority of the Act 29 V., c. 25, and dated the 11th March, 1877, 11th March, 1878, 11th March, 1879, and 11th March, 1880, respectively, that the Interest thereon for the half year ending on the 11th March, 1881, will be payable at the Bank of England, on and after the 11th March, 1881; and that the Interest of such Exchequer Bills for the following half year, to 11th September, 1881, will be at the rate of two and a half per centum per annum.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds were prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the 8th section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices for the county of Essex, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Essex, so as to be from the 1st day of April to the 1st day of August, so far only as concerns Curlew, Dunbird, Godwit, Oxbird, Snipe, Widgeon, Wild Goose, and Woodcock.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild birds is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Essex so as to be from the 15th day of March to the 1st day of August, so far only as concerns Curlew, Dunbird, Godwit, Oxbird, Snipe, Widgeon, Wild Goose, and Woodcock: Provided that this Order shall be in force until the 1st September, 1881, and no longer.
