The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

HER Majesty was this day pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in the 4th and 8th sections of the 21st and 22nd Victoria, chapter 90, to nominate Alfred Henry McClintock, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, of Merrion-square, Dublin, to be, for five years, a Member of the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom, for Ireland, in the place of Dr. Alfred Hudson.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th of January, 1881, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas your Majesty was graciously pleased by an Order in Council dated 10 November 1866, under the authority of the Naval Savings Banks, Act, 1866, to establish Naval Savings Banks on board your Majesty's Ships, and at the Head Quarters of the Divisions of Royal Marines.

"And whereas we are of opinion that it would be expedient and for the benefit of Seamen of the Royal Navy to establish in addition thereto similar Banks in such of your Majesty's Naval Establishments on shore, as we may deem necessary, for the receipt of deposits from Seamen eligible to be depositors in Naval Savings Banks, subject to the following conditions, viz.,

"1. That the Interest to be allowed to Depositors in such Banks be fixed at the rate of £2 10. 0. per cent. per annum for every complete Pound deposited;

"2. That deposits be received in such Banks either by allotments or remittances from pay, or by cash personally tendered, from Depositors borne on the books of any of your Majesty's Ships and Vessels either at home or abroad.

"3. That the management of such Banks be vested in the Cashiers under the general supervision of the Superintendents of such Establishments.

"We do therefore beg leave to recommend that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to direct by your Order in Council, under the authority of the Act before quoted, that we may be empowered to open Savings Banks at such of your Majesty's Naval Establishments on Shore as we may think desirable, and further be authorised to issue from time to time such detailed Regulations for carrying the same into effect as we may deem necessary.

"The Lords Commissioners of your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence herein."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred

and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four; have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood out of the new parish of Saint James Heywood, out of the new parish of Birkle otherwise Bircle or Birile, and out of the parish of Middleton all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood of the said new parish of Saint James Heywood, of the said new parish of Birkle otherwise Bircle or Birile and of the said parish of Middleton which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed or indenture bearing date on or about the twelfth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty and made or expressed to be made under the provisions of 'The New Parishes Acts 1843, 1844, and 1856' or some or one of them between the Reverend John Spittal rector of the rectory of the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood, of the first part, the Reverend Edward James Geoffrey Hornby, rector of the rectory of the parish of Bury in the said county of Lancaster and diocese of Manchester and as such rector the patron of the said rectory of Saint Luke Heywood of the second part, the Right Reverend James Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester of the third part, and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the fourth part (which deed or indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said John Spittal did grant unto the minister of the said proposed district (intended as is mentioned in the said deed or indenture to be named 'The District of Saint Michael Bamford') so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the same Act then to the incumbent of such new parish and his successors certain rectorial tithe rents-charge amounting together to the sum of twenty-four pounds eleven shillings and eight pence which by the tithe commutation award for the township of Heap in the said parish of Bury were awarded and appointed in lieu of rectorial tithes arising from lands in the said township as the same rectorial tithe rents-charge are more particularly set forth in the schedule of the said deed or indenture.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an additional endowment for the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish a capital sum of two thousand three hundred and seventy pounds sterling has been contributed and paid over to the credit of the account of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at the Bank of England by certain persons and we have in respect of such sum undertaken to pay to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish the annual sum of seventy-nine pounds:

"And whereas the said John Spittal as the person granting the rectorial tithe rents-charge as aforesaid and the persons who have contributed and paid the capital sum aforesaid towards providing the additional endowment above mentioned have nominated the Bishop of the diocese of Manchester for the time being as the patron to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned.

"And whereas the said rectorial tithe rents-charge have been so granted as aforesaid and the said capital sum of two thousand three hundred and seventy pounds has also been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of the common fund created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned to the Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester for the time being as hereinbefore mentioned.

"And whereas the said annual grant of fifty pounds will be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said James, Bishop of the diocese of Manchester aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood, of the said new parish of Saint James Heywood, of the said new parish of Birkle, otherwise Bircle or Birile, and of the said parish of Middleton all which said portions are more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Michael Bamford.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts

or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Michael, Bamford, being:—

"All those several contiguous portion of the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood, of the new parish of Saint James Heywood, of the new parish of Birkle other Bircle or Birtle, and of the parish of Middleton, all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which said portions of such new parishes and of such parish are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood from the new parish of Saint James Heywood aforesaid at a point at the centre of Hooley Bridge which carries Bamford-road over the River Roch and extending thence first westward then northward and then north-westward along the middle of the said river for a distance of twenty-eight chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the point where the same river is joined by the stream called or known as Norden Water or Norden Brook which boundary divides the said new parish of Saint James Heywood from the new parish of Birkle otherwise Bircle or Birtle aforesaid and extending thence first south-westward then southward and then north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts thereby continuing to follow the course of the River Roch aforesaid and following in part the boundary which divides the ancient civil parish of Middleton from the ancient civil parish of Bury to the point where the said river is joined by the stream called or known as Tack Lee Brook and where the last-mentioned civil parish boundary leaves the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint James Heywood from the new parish of Birkle otherwise Bircle or Birtle aforesaid and extending thence that is from the last-mentioned point in the River Roch generally northward along the said civil parish boundary for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of Tack Lee Brook aforesaid and in part the course of the stream called or known as Gristlehurst Brook and passing under the Rochdale Bamford and Bury Trust-road to a point in the middle of the road leading from Birtle past the house called or known as Nigher Tack Lee to Top-o'-th'-Wood and extending thence that is from the said civil parish boundary first south-eastward then north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the Old Pack-road to Rochdale (now a bridle-road) for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to a point at the junction of the said last-described bridle-road with the footpath leading past the south-western side of Dobb Wood to the house called or known as Woodland Cottage such point of junction being upon the boundary which divides the said civil parish of Middleton from the civil parish of Bury aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the said civil parish boundary for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the last-described road to the point at the stream called or known as Cheesden Brook where the same civil parish boundary is joined by the boundary which divides the said new parish of Birkle otherwise Bircle or Birtle from the new parish of Saint James Ashworth in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first south-eastward then northward and then again south-eastward along the

last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of Cheesden Brook aforesaid to the point at the junction of the same brook with the stream called or known as Norden Water or Norden Brook aforesaid where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint James Ashworth from the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood aforesaid and extending thence generally northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of sixty-seven chains or thereabouts thereby following for the most part the course of the last-named stream to the point a little to the south of the weir at the head of the leat or goyt which supplies the Ashworth Woollen and Cotton Mill where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood from the new parish of Saint Paul Norden in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first generally eastward and then north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of forty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Paul Norden from that detached portion of the parish of Middleton aforesaid wherein Kenyon Fold is situate, and continuing thence still north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction in the middle of that part of the said Rochdale Bamford and Bury Trust-road which is called or known as Wheelbarrow-lane with the boundary which divides the last-described portion of the said parish of Middleton from the new parish of Saint Clement Spotland in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Clement Spotland from that detached portion of the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood wherein the houses called or known as Meadow Croft are situate and extending thence first south-eastward then southward then again south-eastward and finally south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty-two chains or thereabouts to its junction in the River Roch aforesaid near the Broadalgh Fulling Mill with the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood aforesaid from the new parish of Saint Martin Castleton Moor in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eleven and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following the course of the River Roch aforesaid to the point near the Meadow Croft Fulling Mill where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Martin Castleton Moor from that detached portion of the said parish of Middleton wherein Kenyon Fold is situate as aforesaid, and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts thereby continuing to follow the course of the River Roch aforesaid to the point opposite to the hill called or known as Crimble Brow where the said last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Martin Castleton Moor from the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood aforesaid and extending thence first southward then westward then northward then north-westward then again westward, and then finally south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of fifty-eight

chains or thereabouts thereby following in part the course of the River Roch aforesaid to the point a little to the east of the junction of the said river with the stream called or known as Miller's Brook where the said last-mentioned boundary is joined by the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood from a certain small detached portion of the parish of Middleton aforesaid and extending thence first south-westward and then north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts thereby still following the course of the River Roch aforesaid to the point where the same boundary leaves the said river, and extending thence, that is, from the said boundary first northward then north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said River Roch for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to the first-described point at the centre of Hooley Bridge aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Heywood from the new parish of Saint James Heywood aforesaid at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the four several cures namely the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood the new parish of Saint James Heywood the new parish of Birkle otherwise Birle or Birtle and the parish of Middleton out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken :

And whereas the patrons of all the four said cures, and the incumbents of three of the same cures, namely the new parish of Saint Luke Heywood the new parish of Saint James Heywood and the parish of Middleton have respectively signified their assent to such scheme :

And whereas the incumbent of the remaining cure that is to say the incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Birkle otherwise Birle or Birtle has offered certain objections or observations to or upon the said scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has notwithstanding such objections or observations as last mentioned been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves, as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

**IPSTONES.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Ipstones, in the county of Stafford ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves, as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

**CARDIGAN.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Cardigan, in the county of Cardigan ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves, as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves, as are now existing in the churchyard and as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows, widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

**JEFFREYSTON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Jeffreyston, in the county of Pembroke ; and also in the churchyard, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz., widows,

widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

**WESTWOOD.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Westwood, in the county of Wilts; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**ST. MARK, NEW SWINDON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of St. Mark, New Swindon, in the county of Wilts; and also in the churchyard, after the first of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**HARLEY.**—Forthwith wholly in the old churchyard of Harley, in the county of Oxford, except as follows:—

In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, only on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**LLANBADARN-VAWR.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Llanbadarn-Vawr, in the county of Cardigan; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:—

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in, and, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

**BOVINGDON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the Box-lane Independent Chapel, in the parish of Bovingdon, in the county of Hertford; and also in the chapelyard, except for the burial of Mr. William Steward and Mr. George Tomlin, the Trustees of the chapel, at their decease.

**TWERTON-ON-AVON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Twerton-on-Avon, in the county of Somerset; and also in the churchyard, after the first of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**ST. MARY MAGDALENE, LAUNCESTON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of St. Mary Magdalene, Launceston, in the county of Cornwall; and also in the upper and lower churchyards thereof, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyards, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**HELSTON.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Helston, in the county of Cornwall; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard,

and are free from water, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

**NEWLYN EAST.**—Forthwith, and entirely, in the parish church of Newlyn East, in the county of Cornwall; and also in the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein; viz., widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the nineteenth day of April next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said nineteenth day of April.

### THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (SALES IN INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1881.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of March, 1881.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as **The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Sales in Infected Areas) Order of 1881.**

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall be read and have effect as one Order with The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881.

3. Article 8 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1881 is hereby revoked; and that Order shall be read and have effect as if the following Article was substituted therein for Article 8 thereof; and the following Article shall be deemed to be Article 8 of that Order (namely):

8.—(a.) Nothing in the foregoing Articles 4, 5, 6, and 7 shall be deemed to interfere with or make a licence (either of the Privy Council or of a Local Authority) necessary for a sale, either public or private, of animals (whether or not being fat animals intended for slaughter) in any case where the sale is



held in accordance with the following conditions :

- (i.) That the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease :
- (ii.) That no animal on the farm or premises is affected with foot-and-mouth disease :
- (iii.) That every animal exposed for sale has been on the farm or premises not less than twenty-eight days immediately before the sale :
- (iv.) That no animal exposed for sale has been in contact with any animal brought on to the farm or premises within those 28 days.
- (b.) A movement licence for the movement of an animal exposed for sale as aforesaid shall not be granted except on a declaration such as is indicated in the form given in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, made by the occupier of the farm or premises on which the sale is held, or his agent authorized in writing for that purpose.
- (c.) The declaration required by this Article shall be in addition to and not in substitution for any other declaration or any certificate required by any Order of Council as a condition precedent to the granting of a movement licence.
- (d.) The Forms of movement licence (other than Occupation Licences) prescribed by any Order of Council may be used for the movement of animals in the cases provided for by this Article and be varied accordingly.
- (e.) A person or company moving or conveying any animal on a movement licence shall not be bound to inquire whether or not the additional declaration prescribed by this Article has been made in relation to that animal.
