HOOGHLY RIVER ENTRANCE—THE SAND-HEADS. 1.) Light Regulations for Pilot Brigs.

THE Government of India has given notice, that from 1st July, 1881, the pilot brigs at the Sandheads, Hooghly River Entrance, will, when under way and cruizing, show the usual red and green side lights.

When hove to, engaged in supplying or taking out a pilot, and thus not under command, the side lights will be obscured, and the white mast-head light exhibited.

On the near approach of a vessel a white light will be shown over the brig's stern.

When pilot brigs are at anchor, the usual anchor-light will be hoisted at the starboard foreyard arm.

The maroons or flare-up-lights will, as heretofore, be burnt by the brigs every quarter of an hour from sunset to sunrise, whether under way or at anchor.
