IT having been represented to Her Majesty in Council, by the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, in a Memorial sealed with the seal of the said Governor and Company, and dated the 31st day of March 1881:—

(1) That, subsequently to the date of Her Majesty's Order in Council of the 3rd day of February 1866, certain Bankers in the said Memorial named, who, on the 6th day of May 1844, were issuing their own bank notes to the extent of sums amounting in the aggregate to the sum of £955,103, have ceased to issue their own bank notes;

(2) That the total of the authorized issues of bankers who, subsequently to the said 6th day of May 1844, have ceased to issue their own bank notes, including the above sum of £955,103, amounts to £2,675,440, whereof the proportionate part of two-thirds amounts to £1,783,625;

(3) That the aggregate increase of issues by the Bank of England of their own bank notes, authorized by Orders of Her Majesty in Council, under the provisions of the hereinafter-mentioned Act, during the same period, amounts to only £1,000,000; and

(4) That the difference between such aggregate increase of issues by the Bank of England, and the proportionate part of two-thirds of the aforesaid lapsed issues by other banks, is £783,625.

And the said Governor and Company having, thereupon, humbly made application to be authorized, under the provisions of the Act passed in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of Her Majesty, cap. 32, intituled "An Act to regulate the issue of Bank Notes, and for giving to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England certain privileges for a limited period," to increase the amount of securities in the Issue Department of the Bank of England, and to extend the issue of their own bank notes to an amount not exceeding the above-mentioned difference between the increase of issues by the Bank of England that has been already authorized, and two-thirds of the aggregate issues by other banks, that have lapsed, subsequently to the 6th day of May, 1844.

Now, therefore, it is this day ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the said Governor and Company shall be, and they are hereby, authorized and empowered to increase the amount of securities in the Issue Department of the Bank of England, to the extent of £750,000, beyond the total sum or value of £14,000,000 in the said Act mentioned, and of the further sums of £475,000, £175,000, and £350,000, authorized by Her Majesty's Orders in Council dated the 7th day of December, 1855, the 26th day of June, 1861, and the 3rd day of February, 1866, and thereupon to issue additional Bank of England Notes from the said Issue Department, in manner in the said Act mentioned, to the amount of £750,000.

WHEREAS by the 333rd section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority, by Byelaw made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, to do, within its districts, all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section:

And whereas the Trustees of the Harbours of Peterhead incorporated by "The Peterhead Harbours Act, 1873," being a Pilotage Authority within the meaning of the said Merchant Shipping Act, have, in exercise of the powers in them vested by that Act, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Byelaws (which

are set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed) for the government and regulation of the Captain-Pilot and Pilots of and for the Harbours of Peterhead, within the district and under the jurisdiction of the said Pilotage Authority, and for fixing and determining the remuneration to be paid to such Captain-Pilot and Pilots:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said Byelaws so set forth are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the Byelaws and Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

Byelaws, Regulations, and Rates for the Captain-Pilot and Pilots plying at the Port and Harbours of Peterhead.

Captain-Pilot.

I. He shall hold his appointment during the pleasure of the Trustees, and have the superintendence of all the other Pilots, according to the following Regulations, which he shall have full power to enforce, and which the other Pilots shall be bound to obey; and in every case where his orders are not obeyed, he shall immediately inform the Trustees thereof.

II. He shall not engage in any other employment, or hold an interest in any Steam Tug or Pilot Boat, but devote his whole time and attention to the duties of his office.

III. He shall cause the Shipping to be supplied with Pilots, according to their order, without partiality or favour; and he shall make out the Notes and cause the Rates of Pilotage, &c., to be collected according to the following Tables, and apportion the same among the Pilots who may have been employed. And in case he shall cause Rates of Pilotage to be collected at variance with the said Tables, or without having made or allowed the deduction provided for in Article Fourth of the following Regulations for Pilots, when such deductions shall fall to be made, he shall, on proof thereof, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Five Pounds Sterling.

IV. He is empowered, where there may be any great difficulty or danger in the Pilots getting out to the assistance of vessels in the Bay, to offer them such premiums for their attendance in these instances as he shall judge necessary.

V. In case he shall be called upon to furnish boats or men to the assistance of any vessel in want thereof, or in distress, and shall either refuse, remain absent, or neglect to comply with such request, he shall, on proof of such neglect, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Five Pounds Sterling.

Pilots.

I. No person shall act as a Pilot without being Licensed by the Trustees; and the License must

be renewed during the first week of January every year; and every person applying for a License shall lodge his application with the Clerk at least six days before the Licenses are granted.

II. The Pilots must give ready obedience to all the orders of the Captain-Pilot, and comply with his directions in every particular.

III. The Boats to be used by the Pilots shall be of a proper size, and otherwise to the satisfaction of the Captain-Pilot; and the Crew of each Boat must consist of not less than Five men, one of whom at least must be a licensed Pilot. The Master or Chief Pilot of each Boat must cause his own Name, and the Number of his Boat, to be painted thereon, in large and distinct characters.

IV. If a Pilot shall take charge of a Vessel without his Boat being manned as aforesaid, there shall be deducted for each man deficient on entering the Harbour One-tenth part of the pilotage, and at the same rate for each man deficient on leaving the Harbour.

V. The Pilots must be in attendance at the Harbours during two hours before and two hours after high water in each tide, in readiness to be employed in piloting, and when desired they shall attend with their Boats two hours before High-water, to take charge of vessels going to sea, or having occasion to move from one part of the Harbours to another, and on intimation being given by the Captain-Pilot to any Pilot he shall be bound to attend at the Harbours at any other time that his services may be required. There shall be at all times one Pilot on the look out, and this duty shall be discharged by the Pilots who may be resident at Peterhead at the time, according to such rotation or selection as the Captain-Pilot may from time to time determine.

VI. The Pilots, whether at sea or not, shall be obliged to pay proper attention to all vessels in want of their assistance; and after taking charge of them, shall not leave them until brought into proper Moorings, to the satisfaction of their Commanders, or until they are directed by the Captain-Pilot.

VII. Pilots shall afford assistance to Her Majesty's Ships before all others; and shall employ themselves in piloting vessels into and out of the Harbours of Peterhead in preference to any other service.

VIII. Every person acting as Master, or having the charge of any ship or vessel either going out of or coming into the said Harbours, or either of them, shall be bound and obliged, before leaving or entering the said Harbours, to take on board a Pilot belonging to the said Harbours, licensed as aforesaid; and in the event of such Master or other person refusing or neglecting so to do, he shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Five Pounds Sterling, to be recovered by the said Trustees, and to be applied for the purposes of the said Act, and that over and above the dues hereby made exigible from such Master or other person had he taken a Pilot on board, and which dues shall be payable to the Pilot who shall offer his services, notwithstanding such services shall have been refused, provided that the Pilot has complied with these regulations.

IX. In case it shall appear to the Trustees, after due inquiry, that any Pilot has been guilty of such misconduct or neglect of duty, as in their opinion shall render it expedient that he shall not longer continue to act as a Pilot, they shall have power, by a resolution to that effect, to declare his license to be forfeited, and such Pilot shall, within Twenty-four hours after such resolution is intimated to him by the Clerk to the Trustees, deliver up to the Clerk the license held by him to

be cancelled, and shall not thereafter be entitled to act as a Pilot until a new license shall be granted to him by the Trustees, who shall have power to refuse to grant the same should they consider it expedient to do so.

X. Any person acting as a Pilot without being licensed, or after his License has expired or been forfeited, shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Five Pounds Sterling.

A deduction of one-third of the amount of these charges shall be made therefrom, in the case of Vessels entering the Harbours for safety or convenience.

These charges include Pilotage Inwards and Outwards.

For each Tide's work within the Harbour, for every description of Vessel, each Man two shillings.

If employed to transport Vessels from the one Harbour to the other by the Junction Canal for the purpose of their going to sea, each man employed shall be entitled to be paid one shilling.

XII. No additional allowance shall be made to a Pilot taking charge, within the limits defined by the following bearings, of a vessel making signals for a Pilot, viz., within a line passing through the eastern extremities of the rock of Dunbuy and the promontory of Buchanness, and projected northwards until it intersects a line projected eastwards passing through the southern extremity of Mormond Hill and the Farmhouse of Kinloch.

XIII. The Pilots shall be obliged to give immediate attention to the signals of Vessels calling for orders or any like purpose. For any vessel calling in the bay for orders, and not entering the Harbours, requiring the services of a Pilot Boat there shall be paid to the crew of such boat the sum of Twenty Shillings, which shall include the service of taking off orders. If, after the expiry of twelve hours from the time the services of a Pilot Boat are so required, any pilot is detained on board such vessel, he shall be entitled to his provisions while on board, and be paid Two Shillings and Sixpence for each tide during which he shall be so detained after the expiry of the said twelve hours; and if, after the expiry of such twelve hours, the service of the Pilot Boat shall be required between the Vessel and the Harbour, Two Shillings per man in the Boat shall be payable for each passage of the Boat from the Harbour to the Vessel and back.

XIV. Pilots, for landing Passengers from Vessels passing, shall be entitled to be paid, if they are taken on board within the limits specified in Article XII, for one Passenger Six Shillings, and for each additional passenger in the same boat Two Shillings and Sixpence; and if taken on board at a greater distance from the shore as may be agreed on.

XV. If a Pilot, after taking charge of a Vessel

in the Bay, shall, by stress of weather, be detained on board, and prevented from going into Port, he shall be entitled to his provisions while on board, and be allowed Two Shillings and Sixpence for every tide he is so detained.

XVI. All charges for extra trouble to be settled by the Captain-Pilot.

XVII. A Pilot demanding or receiving, under any pretence, higher Rates than those above-mentioned, shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Ten Shillings, besides returning the overcharge, and, in the option of the Trustees, his License shall be declared forfeited.

XVIII. Masters or Owners of Vessels refusing to pay according to the foregoing Rates of Fare shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding Five Pounds Sterling.

XIX. The Pilots are all furnished with Licenses and a copy of these Regulations, which they shall carry about with them on all occasions when they are employed as Pilots; and they shall be obliged to produce them when called upon to do so, otherwise the Masters of Vessels shall not be obliged to receive them, or pay the dues of pilotage.

XX. All penalties enacted by the foregoing Regulations shall be recovered and applied in manner directed by the Acts of Parliament applicable thereto.

XXI. Pilots engaged in the herring fishing shall not be entitled to act as Pilots during the time of their engagements.

XXII. All persons concerned shall, besides, be bound to observe, and shall be conducted by and liable in, the whole Clauses, Enactments, Forfeitures, and Penalties, that are contained in, and may be sustained and incurred under "The Peterhead Harbours Act, 1873," "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and Acts amending and incorporated with the same.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things, enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall enquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of

"the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion: and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

And also "That whenever two or more benefices which have at any time been united into one benefice shall be disunited and become separate benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of benefices of which such united benefice consisted, or to one or more of such benefices only, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons), to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively, as to Her Majesty in Council shall seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe land, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments or any part thereof may not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice."

And whereas on the 4th day of September, 1880 Richard, Lord Bishop of Chichester made a representation to the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury,

"I, Richard, Lord Bishop of Chichester, do hereby represent to your Grace, that it appears to me that the disunion of the rectory and parish churches of Stedham with Heyshed alias Heyshott, in the county of Sussex and my diocese of Chichester, by the separation of the said rectory of Stedham from the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand this fourth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty.
"R. Cicestr."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop having enquired into the circumstances of the case it appeared to him on such enquiry that the said union might be usefully dissolved. The said Lord Archbishop therefore six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry to Her Majesty in Council caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed to the principal outer door of each of the said parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested to show cause against the proposed disunion. No such cause having been shown within the period limited by the said Act, and the patron having consented to the proposed disunion; the said Lord Archbishop hath pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the said Act duly certified the enquiry and the patron's consent to Her Majesty in Council. And the said Lord Archbishop did recommend with the consent of the patron of the said united benefice (such consent being signified in writing under the hand of such patron) that each of the said rectories should retain its original endowments and emoluments and that the charges on the present united benefice of seventeen pounds eighteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and one pound fifteen shillings and ten pence half-penny for yearly tenths should be apportioned so that the said rectory of Stedham should be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence half-penny for yearly tenths and that the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott should be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence for yearly tenths. The certificate of the said Lord Archbishop containing such recommendation bearing date the 16th day of March, 1881, is in the words following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Richard Lord Bishop of Chichester as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the united benefice consisting of the rectory and parish of Stedham and the rectory and parish of Heyshed alias Heyshott in the county of Sussex having represented unto us that the disunion of the rectory and parish churches of Stedham with Heyshed alias Heyshott by the separation of the said rectory of Stedham from the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott might be made with advantage to the interests of religion we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved and that Nathaniel Phillips Simes of Strood Park Horsham in the county of Sussex Esquire being the patron or person entitled to present to the said

united benefice if the same were now vacant consents to the proposed disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Chichester our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for dissolving the union of the said united benefice and for separating the said rectory of Stedham from the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott. And in accordance with the consent in writing of the patron of the said united benefice we recommend that each of the said rectories shall retain its original endowments and emoluments and that the charges on the present united benefice of seventeen pounds eighteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and one pound fifteen shillings and ten pence half-penny for yearly tenths shall be apportioned so that the said rectory of Stedham shall be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence half-penny for yearly tenths and the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott shall be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence for yearly tenths.

"As witness our hand this sixteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one. "A. C. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order and doth hereby order that the said united benefice consisting of the rectory and parish of Stedham and the rectory and parish of Heyshed alias Heyshott shall be disunited by separating the said rectory of Stedham from the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to assign and attach to each of such benefices respectively, when the same shall be disunited as aforesaid, the endowments and emoluments which originally belonged thereto. And Her Majesty is also pleased to divide and apportion between the said benefices the charges on the present united benefice of seventeen pounds eighteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and one pound fifteen shillings and ten pence half-penny for yearly tenths, so that the said rectory of Stedham shall be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings and six pence half-penny for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence half-penny for yearly tenths and the said rectory of Heyshed alias Heyshott shall be liable to eight pounds nineteen shillings for first fruits and to seventeen shillings and eleven pence for yearly tenths.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the seventeenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and four and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn some time part of the parish of Jarrow in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portion of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Jarrow have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein-mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-mentioned Act, to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as one shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-mentioned Act and to his successors a grant of two hundred pounds per annum and also so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district and shall have been approved by us and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district, and such district shall have thereupon become a new parish within the meaning of the said secondly mentioned Act to make and pay such further grant from the said fund as will suffice to raise the income from all sources, of the incumbent of the said new parish to three hundred pounds per annum.

"And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be made by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Barber Bishop of the said

diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn which is mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and which is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Oswald Hebburn.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Oswald Hebburn, being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn sometime part of the parish of Jarrow in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham which is bounded on the north by the boundary in the middle of the River Tyne which divides the said county of Durham from the county of Northumberland on the east by the new parish of Jarrow Grange in the said county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham aforesaid on the south by the parish of Jarrow aforesaid and on the remaining side that is to say on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Jarrow from the new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn aforesaid at a point near Bede's Well on the northern side of Bede's Burn in the middle of the footpath which leads from Monkton to Hebburn Red House and extending thence that is from the said boundary first north-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts and then westward along the middle of the same footpath for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction on the south-western side of Hebburn Red House aforesaid with the cross road leading from such house into the road which leads from Gateshead to Jarrow and extending thence that is from the last-described point on the south-western side of Hebburn Red House aforesaid first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the said cross road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Gateshead to Jarrow as aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'H. S. O. D. 1881' and placed at the junction of such road with the roadway leading to the house called or known as Cleg House and extending thence in a direction due north-west and in a straight line for a distance of one mile or thereabouts thereby passing close to and on the south-western side of the said Cleg House and also passing close to and on the north-eastern side of the house called or known as Cockcrow to the boundary in the middle of the said River Tyne which divides the said county of Durham from the county of Northumberland as aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the vicarage

of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert Hebburn out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications, viz.:—

RHOS-LLANERCHRUGOG.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Rhos-llanerchrugog in the county of Denbigh, and also in the churchyard thereof, except as follows:—

- (a) In such vaults and walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:—
- (b) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.:—widows, widowers, parents, children, brothers and sisters as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the sixteenth day of May next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said sixteenth day of May.

In the churchyard of the parish of Epworth, in the county of Lincoln, to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the churchyard of Burton Latimer, in the county of Northampton, to the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In Bickerton churchyard, in the county of Chester, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Criccieth, in the county of Carnarvon, to the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Nassington, in the county of Northampton, to the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Yarwell, in the county of Northampton, to the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

In the parish churchyard of Holt, in the county of Denbigh, to the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.
