**T**HE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, hath been graciously pleased, by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and Regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and to grant unto His Majesty Alexander the III., Emperor and Autocrat of All the Russias, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, and invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if His Imperial Majesty had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act, (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas by an Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eighteen hundred and fifty-four, burials, with

certain exceptions, were directed to be discontinued from the time specified therein in certain churchyards and burial-grounds in the parish of Teignmouth (which time as regards the churchyards was subsequently postponed to a later date) and which said directions were in the words following:—

"TEIGNMOUTH.—Except in existing vaults, in which each coffin shall be imbedded in charcoal, and separately entombed in brickwork, burials to be wholly discontinued in the churchyards of East and West Teignmouth from and after the first of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five. In the burial-grounds of the Christian Brethern, of Zion Chapel, and of the Wesleyan Chapel, no grave to be opened except in ground which is not within five yards of any building, and which has not before been opened; and only one body to be buried in each grave."

And whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Privy Council that the said Order be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice aforesaid is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

That after the word "grave" at the end of the above-quoted paragraph relating to burials in the parish of Teignmouth, as contained in the said Order in Council of the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, the following words be added, viz.: "Provided that this prohibition of interment shall not apply to the re-interment in any vault constructed in the burial-ground of Zion Chapel, but outside the chapel, of any bodies removed by licence of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State from any vault inside the said chapel."

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after

reciting that "Whereas, in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said archbishop may approve, and the said archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect; and such Order, being registered in the registry of the diocese, which the Registrar is hereby required to do, shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever, including the Incumbent or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, if he or they shall have consented thereto in writing under his or their hands."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells do hereby represent to your Grace that there are in the county of Somerset and my diocese of Bath and Wells the vicarage and parish church of Kilton and the vicarage and parish church of Stogursey with the chapelry of Lilstock annexed the boundaries of which chapelry are well known and defined.

"That the annual income of the said benefice of Kilton is about one hundred and ninety-five

pounds and according to the last census the population thereof was 136 and is now about that number.

"That the annual income of the said benefice of Stogursey with Lilstock is about three hundred and fifteen pounds and according to the last census the population of Stogursey was 1489 and the population of Lilstock was 74 and the population of the last-mentioned places respectively are now about the same as at the date of the late census.

"That the chapelry of Lilstock contains about 714 acres.

"That there is in the said chapelry of Lilstock a church or chapel distant from the parish church of Stogursey about three miles or thereabouts in which church or chapel Divine service is performed by the incumbent of Stogursey or his curate.

"That baptisms marriages churchings and burials have been from time immemorial and are now solemnized and performed in the church or chapel of the said chapelry and in the burial-ground belonging thereto.

"That the said chapelry of Lilstock is contiguous to the said parish of Kilton and the church or chapel of the said chapelry is about half a mile from the church of Kilton and about three miles from the parish church of Stogursey.

"That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Kilton belongs to me in right of my bishoprick and the Reverend Samuel Shedden is the incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church and the patronage of the vicarage of Stogursey with Lilstock belongs to the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the county of Bucks and the Fellows of the same College and the Reverend Frederick Meade King is the incumbent of such last-mentioned benefice.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 the said chapelry of Lilstock may be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Stogursey and be united and annexed to the said vicarage and parish of Kilton for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the said vicarages of Kilton and Stogursey with Lilstock I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consents by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said chapelry of Lilstock shall be separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Stogursey and be united and annexed to the parish of Kilton aforesaid for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the said chapelry shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Kilton and the incumbent of Kilton shall have the exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said chapelry.

"That the following lands and tithe rent-charges or payments in lieu of tithes now belonging to the said vicarage of Stogursey with Lilstock shall henceforth be transferred to the said vicarage of Kilton and shall for ever hereafter belong be paid to and be received and recoverable by the

vicar for the time being of the said parish of Kilton but that none of the other endowments belonging to the said vicarage of Stogursey with Lilstock shall be affected by the proposed separation but shall continue to be payable to the vicar of Stogursey as heretofore.

“ Glebe Lands now belonging to the vicarage of Stogursey with Lilstock to be transferred to the vicarage of Kilton.

“ That the vicar of Stogursey for the time being shall not hereafter be liable to repair or contribute to the repair of the chancel of the said church or chapel of Lilstock but with this exception the vicar of Stogursey for the time being shall remain subject to all such liabilities as he would have been liable to if the scheme hereby proposed had not been carried into effect.

“ That the vicar of Kilton for the time being shall hereafter be liable to repair the chancel of the said church or chapel of Lilstock.

“ That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments (if any) for churchings marriages burials and ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said parish of Kilton in respect of any inhabitants who may reside within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall belong to the incumbent clerk and sexton of the said parish of Kilton.

“ That the owners and occupiers of any lands and hereditaments within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall not hereafter be liable to contribute to the maintenance and repair of the parish church of Stogursey or to the expenses incidental to the due performance of Divine service therein but shall be so liable (subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act 1868) for or in respect of the said parish church of Kilton.

“ That the owners and occupiers of lands and hereditaments within the limits of the said chapelry of Lilstock shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Stogursey but shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of Kilton to accommodation in the

church of Kilton and in the church or chapel of Lilstock.”

And whereas the said Bishop of Bath and Wells

hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme, hath certified the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, dated the eighth day of March 1881, which report is in the words and figures following :—

“To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

“We the undersigned Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council that the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells has represented unto us (amongst other things)

“That there are in the county of Somerset and diocese of Bath and Wells the vicarage and parish church of Kilton and the vicarage and parish church of Stogursey with the chapelry of Lilstock annexed the boundaries of which chapelry are well known and defined.

“That there is in the said chapelry of Lilstock a church or chapel distant from the parish church of Stogursey about three miles.

“That the said chapelry of Lilstock is contiguous to the said parish of Kilton and the church or chapel of the said chapelry is about half a mile from the church of Kilton.

“That the patronage of the said vicarage and parish church of Kilton belongs to the said Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells in right of his Bishoprick and the Reverend Samuel Shedden is the incumbent of the said vicarage and parish church and the patronage of the vicarage of Stogursey with Lilstock belongs to the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the county of Bucks and the Fellows of the same College and the Reverend Frederick Meade King is the incumbent of the said last-mentioned benefice.

“That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry of Lilstock may under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish church of Stogursey and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said vicarage and parish church of Kilton.

“That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and the incumbents of the benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

“The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to your Majesty in Council to the intent that your Majesty in Council may in case your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

3. The petty sessional divisions of Altrincham, Chester Castle, Daresbury, Edisbury, Leftwich, Nantwich, Prestbury, Stockport, and Wirral, in the county of Chester, and the boroughs of Birkenhead, Macclesfield, and Stockport, except as follows :—the foreign animals wharves at the



Wallasey landing-stage and the Woodside landing-stage at Birkenhead; and the lands and buildings at Birkenhead approved by the Privy Council for the landing or lairage of foreign animals; and such landing-places in those divisions or in the borough of Birkenhead, as are at the date of this Order used for the landing of animals from Ireland, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area or areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The townships of Barton-upon-Irwell, Stretford, Heaton Norris, the hamlet of Mossley, the townships of Tonge, Royton, Chatterton, Thornham, Butterworth, the hamlet of Whitworth lower end, in the hundred of Salford; the townships of Eccles Hill, and Clayton-le-dale, in the hundred of Blackburn; and the township of Ditton, in the hundred of West Derby; in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Accrington, Blackburn, Bolton, Burnley, Bury, and Salford, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area or areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

The petty sessional divisions of Halesowen, Northfield, Oldbury, and Stourbridge, in the county of Worcester, which were declared to be an area or areas or parts of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are, except so much of the parish of Yardley, in the county of Worcester, as lies south of the main road from Birmingham to Coventry, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those petty sessional

divisions, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area or areas or part of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. So much of the parish of Yardley, in the county of Worcester, as lies south of the main road from Birmingham to Coventry, and the borough of Dudley, shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be an area or areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease. *C. L. Peel.*

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—The area for the time being included in the said Canterbury Union shall, until We otherwise prescribe, be included in, and form part of, the said Kent Audit District.

ARTICLE II.—It shall be the duty of the said George Gibson, as the District Auditor for such District, to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their officers in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the first above cited Order, namely :—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the said Canterbury Union.
- (2.) The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in that Union.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 11th day of February, 1881, the Local Government Board ordered that the several Parishes therein mentioned should, from and after the 26th day of February, 1881, be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and form the Canterbury Union, in the city and county of the city of Canterbury:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order that the provisions of the General Orders hereafter recited shall henceforth apply to and be in force in the Canterbury Union, namely:—

1. The General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, declaring the amount to be allowed to Clerks of the Peace for the taxation of Bills due to Solicitors in respect of business performed on behalf of any Parish or Union.

2. The General Order of the Poor Law Board dated the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, prescribing the Form of Contract to be entered into for public Vaccination.

3. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, prescribing the Forms of the Notices of requirement of Vaccination to be given by Registrars of Births, and the Forms of Certificates relating to Vaccination to be given by Public Vaccinators and Medical Practitioners.

4. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing regulations with respect to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Boards of Guardians, the tenure of office, duties, and remuneration of such Officers, and the institution and conduct of the proceedings under the Vaccination Acts, and the costs incurred in such proceedings.

5. The General Order of the Local Government Board dated the eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, prescribing Forms of Proceedings in Bastardy, upon the application of Guardians of the Poor.

6. The General Orders of the Local Government Board dated respectively the twenty-second day of March, and the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, prescribing regulations with respect to the proceedings of Guardians under the Elementary Education Act, 1876.
