The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in

order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is

to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

41 Vict., c. 16, s. 42.

PERIOD OF EMPLOYMENT, 8 A.M.—8 P.M.

Order of Secretary of State extending Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, Section 42, contains a special exception to the effect that in the factories and workshops, or parts thereof, to which the exception applies, the period of employment for young persons and women, if so fixed by the occupier and specified in the notice, may, except on Saturday, begin at 8 A.M. and end at 8 P.M., and on Saturday may begin at 8 A.M. and end at 4 P.M., or where it begins at 7 A.M. may end at 3 P.M.; and the period of employment for a child in a morning set may begin at the same hour, and the period of employment for a child in the afternoon set may end at the same hour:

And whereas this special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction, that the non-textile factories and workshops of the classes, or the parts thereof, mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, by reason of the customs and exigencies of the trades carried on therein, require the extension thereto of this exception:

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend the said exception to factories and workshops of such classes.
