THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Alexandria, reporting that the Egyptian Maritime and Quarantine Board, at a meeting held on the 5th instant, passed a resolution to the following effect:—

Passengers arriving from Syria in vessels with clean bills of health will be admitted to free pratique in Egypt after being subjected to a rigorous medical visit, and their personal effects duly disinfected. These operations are to be performed in the places appointed for such purpose (that is, on shore), and within 24 hours after the landing of the passengers. Non-susceptible merchandise may be landed (among which manufactured goods are comprised) and also susceptible goods which are accompanied by "certificates of origin," signed by Local or Consular Authorities, to prove the merchandise to have arrived from a non-infected district.

Vessels which have kept on board any susceptible goods not allowed to be landed will not be admitted to free pratique, and a note to that effect will be made on their bills of health. All operations of shipping, transshipping, and landing goods will be performed in quarantine.
