Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 27th day of April, 1881.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

##### *Preliminary.*

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 2 ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

##### *Prohibition of Movement.*

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland.

##### *Offences.*

5. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

#### Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE NORTHUMBERLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the first day of May,

one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

#### Prohibition of Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water into the District of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland from any district named in the Schedule to this Order.

5. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the District of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland by railway, without untrucking.

If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
