The petty sessional division of Cirencester, in the county of Gloucester, which was declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that petty sessional division shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area or part of an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

NORTHUMBERLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 27th day of April, 1881.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE NORTHUMBERLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the first day of May,

one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Prohibition of Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water into the District of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland from any district named in the Schedule to this Order.

5. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the District of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland by railway, without untrucking.

Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
