

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**In the London Bankruptcy Court.**

In the Matter of James Mankey, of Pentonville Prison, Caledonian-road, in the county of Middlesex, a Bankrupt. Before Mr. Registrar Haslitt, acting as Chief Judge.
