**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Wednesday, the 22nd of June next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at this Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

#### DERBYSHIRE (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

**A**T the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 13th day of *June*, 1881.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

#### PRESENT:

Lord President.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE DERBYSHIRE (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

#### Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved into the borough of Derby, or into the parish of Osmaston, in the Petty Sessional Division of Derby, in the county of Derby, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

5. Animals may be moved into the said borough or parish with a licence in writing of the Local Authority of the district into which they are moved.

*Exception in favour of Animals moved to the Royal Agricultural Society's Show, or by Railway through the Districts.*

6. Nothing in this Order applies to animals moved into the said borough or parish for purposes of exhibition at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show to be held at Derby on the thirteenth and following days of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

7. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the said borough or parish by railway, without untrucking.

*Offences.*

8. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

**THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES  
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.**

THE following areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):—

**Bedfordshire.**—The parishes of Biggleswade, Potton, and Sutton, in the petty sessional division of Biggleswade, in the county of Bedford.

**Buckinghamshire.**—(1.) The whole of the parishes of Cholesbury, and Hawridge, and such portions of the parishes of Buckland, and Drayton Beauchamp, as lie to the south-east of the bridle-way leading from Leylands Farm in the parish of Buckland to Oaken Grove Farm, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) The parish of Wotton Underwood, in the county of Buckingham.

**Cambridgeshire.**—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Bottisham, in the county of Cambridge.

(2.) The parishes of Chesterton, Histon, Milton, Waterbeach, Landbeach, Impington, and Cottenham, in the petty sessional division of Cambridge, in the county of Cambridge.

(3.) The parishes of Caxton, and Little Gransden, in the petty sessional division of Caxton, in the county of Cambridge.

(4.) The parish of West Wrattling, and so much of the adjacent parish of Balsham as is in the occupation of Thomas Burkis, in the petty sessional division of Linton, in the county of Cambridge.

(5.) The parishes of Burwell, and Wicken, and the hamlet of Burwell Reach, in the petty sessional division of Newmarket, in the county of Cambridge.

**Carnarvonshire.**—The parishes of Llanbeblig, and Llanfairisgaer, in the county of Carnarvon, and the borough of Carnarvon.

**Derbyshire.**—(1.) The district of St. Thomas' Brampton, which consists of parts of the several parishes, townships, or places of Brampton, Walton, and Newbold, in the petty sessional division of Chesterfield, in the county of Derby.

(2.) The petty sessional division of Derby, in the county of Derby.

(3.) The petty sessional divisions of Ashbourne, and Sudbury, in the county of Derby.

(4.) The parish of Crich, in the petty sessional division of Belper, in the county of Derby.

(5.) The petty sessional division of Swadlincote, in the county of Derby.

**Dorsetshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Turnworth, Winterbourne Clenston, Winterbourne Houghton, and Winterbourne Stickland, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, in the county of Dorset.

(2.) The parishes of Tarrant Keinston, and Tarrant Rawston, in the petty sessional division of Blandford, and the parishes of Preston-cum-Crawford, Tarrant Rushton, and Witchampton, in the petty sessional division of Wimborne, in the county of Dorset.

(3.) The parishes of Chaldon Herring, West Lulworth, and Winfrith Newburgh, in the petty sessional division of Wareham, and Overmoigne, in the petty sessional division of Dorchester, in the county of Dorset.

**Durham.**—(1.) So much of the county of Durham, as lies between the river Derwent as far as Lintz Ford on the south, the road leading to the Spenn on the west, Blaydon Burn stream on the north, and the river Tyne on the north-east, in the township of Winlaton.

(2.) That part of the township of Cockerton which is bounded on the south by the Cockerbeck, on the west by the beck or stream at the west end of the village of Cockerton, on the north by a back lane leading from the west end of that village to the West Auckland-road to the point where the Alma Hotel stands on that road, and on the east by the boundary of the borough of Darlington up to the Cockerbeck, in the south-east division of Darlington Ward, in the county of Durham.

(3.) The petty sessional division of the south-west division of Stockton Ward, in the county of Durham.

(4.) So much of the petty sessional division of the west division of Chester Ward, in the county of Durham, as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—on the south by a stream running to the north of Hedley Edge to New Cornsay, on the east by a road leading from New Cornsay to Clickern-in-Cross-road and thence by Rackwood Side to Browney Stream to Satlay and Cornsay-road on the north, thence on the west to Towlaw over a stream north of Hedley Edge.

(5.) The townships of Penshaw, Newbottle, East and Middle Herrington, West Herrington, and Silksworth, forming the eastern portion of the petty sessional division of Houghton-le-Spring, in the county of Durham.

**Essex.**—(1.) The whole of the petty sessional division of Beacontree, in the county of Essex.

(2.) The parishes of Borley, Bulmer, Great Yeldham, Sturmer, Foxearth, Ovington, Ridgwell, Toppesfield, and Stambourne, in the petty sessional division of Hinckford North, in the county of Essex.

(3.) The hamlet of Bures, in the petty sessional division of Hinckford South, in the county of Essex.

(4.) The parish of Aveley, in the petty sessional division of Orsett, in the county of Essex.

**Gloucestershire.**—(1.) The petty sessional division of Tewkesbury, in the county of Gloucester, and the borough of Tewkesbury.

(2.) The parishes of South Cerney, Siddings

ton, and Preston, the tything of Chesterton in the parish of Cirencester, and the district of the Local Board of Cirencester, in the county of Gloucester.

**Huntingdonshire.**—(1.) So much of the petty sessional division of Ramsey as lies within the following boundaries (namely),—the Great Northern Railway on the west, Connington brook—"Baouch's Drain," on the north, and the parish boundaries of Woodwalton adjoining Higney fen on the east and south.

(2.) The borough of St. Ives, in the county of Huntingdon.

**Lancashire.**—The townships of Barton-upon-Irwell, Stretford, Heaton Norris, the hamlet of Mossley, the townships of Tonge, Royton, Chatterton, Thornham, Butterworth, the hamlet of Whitworth lower end, in the hundred of Salford; the townships of Eccles Hill, and Clayton-le-dale, in the hundred of Blackburn; and the township of Ditton, in the hundred of West Derby; in the county of Lancaster, and the boroughs of Accrington, Bolton, Burnley, and Salford.

**Leicestershire.**—The county of Leicester, and the borough of Leicester.

**Lincolnshire (Lindsey).**—(1.) The parishes of Barneby-le-Wold, Melton Ross, Kirmington, Croxton, Great Limber, Keelby, Searby-cum-Owmby, Grasby, Clixby, and Cadney-cum-Howsham, in the petty sessional division of Brigg, in the Parts of Lindsey.

(2.) So much of the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, as is bounded on the north by the road leading from Burgh to Ingoldmells Mill, commencing at the north-west corner of a field called the Far Meadow, the property of Mr. R. S. Stephenson, and proceeding eastwardly so far as the road leading from Ingoldmells Mill to Winthorpe, on the east by the last-named road so far as a cottage in the occupation of Henry Coupland, on the south by a line drawn from such cottage to the south-west corner of a field belonging to Mr. Robert Wright, (adjoining a field called the Far Four Acres belonging to Mr. Samuel Raithby,) and on the west by the fences on the west sides of the following fields all adjoining, namely,—a field belonging to Mr. Ashlin Cutforth, two fields called respectively the Six Acres and Seg Close belonging to Mr. Henry Searby, a field called the Seven Acres belonging to Mr. William Coupland, a field called Guide Post Three Acres belonging to Mr. Charles Acred, and the before-named field called the Far Meadow belonging to Mr. R. S. Stephenson, exclusive of the above-named boundary roads, and which area includes portions of the parishes of Addlethorpe, Ingoldmells, and Winthorpe.

**Norfolk.**—(1.) The hundred of Freebridge Marshland, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(2.) The hundred of Freebridge Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(3.) The hundred of Smithdon, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(4.) The hundred of Gallow, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(5.) The borough of King's Lynn, in the Western Division of the county of Norfolk.

(6.) The parish of Blofield, and the adjoining parishes of Bradestone, Brundall, Burlingham St. Andrew, Burlingham St. Peter, Lingwood, South Burlingham, Beighton, Strumpshaw,

Hassingham, Buckenham, Witton, Little Plumstead, and Hemblington, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk.

(7.) The parish of Reedham, and the adjoining parishes of Limpenhoe, Freethorpe, and Wickhampton, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk.

(8.) The parish of Great Melton, and the adjoining parishes of Marlingford, Little Melton, Cringleford, Hethersett, and Wrampingham, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk.

(9.) The parish of Swardeston with Mangreen, and the adjoining parishes of East Carlton, Ketteringham, Intwood, Keswick, and Dunston, in the Southern Division of the county of Norfolk.

(10.) The parish of Bintry, and the adjoining parishes of Twyford, Foulsham, Foxley, North Elmham, Billingford, and Bawdeswell, in the Northern Division of the county of Norfolk.

**Northamptonshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Kellmarsh, Clipston, Great Oxendon, Little Oxendon, and Little Bowden, in the county of Northampton.

**REGULATIONS** respecting Competitive Examinations, held under the Order in Council of 12th February, 1876, for Boy Clerkships in the Lower Division of the Civil Service.

1. Competitive examinations of candidates for Boy Clerkships in the Lower Division of the Civil Service will be held from time to time at such places as may be deemed expedient.

2. These examinations are open, under such general restrictions as may be laid down, to all natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, being of the prescribed age and of good health and character. The undermentioned restrictions are at present in force:

(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible, viz.:—

(a.) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.

(b.) Persons who have previously succeeded at an examination for the same situation or class of situations.

(ii.) The following classes of persons will not be eligible unless they shall have produced to the Civil Service Commissioners before the date of the competition, the written permission of the authorities of their departments to attend the examination: viz. (a) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, (b) Apprentices and Engineer Students in Her Majesty's Dockyards.

(iii.) Persons who have been trained in Normal Schools at the public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Committee of Council on Education, Great Britain, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. A fee of 1s. will be required from every candidate admitted to the Examination.

4. Candidates must be over 15 and under 17 years of age on the first day of the Competitive Examination.

5. The subjects of examination will be as follows:—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions.
4. Copying MS. (to test accuracy).
5. English Composition.
6. Geography.

No candidate will be eligible who does not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his competency in Handwriting, Orthography, and Arithmetic.

The number of persons to be selected at each examination will be published as part of the notice of every such examination.

6. A list of the competitors will be made out, in the order of merit, up to this published number, if so many are found by the examination to be qualified for appointments in the Civil Service.

7. Each competitor named in a list will remain thereon until he attains the age of 19 years, unless in the meantime he has been appointed to a situation in some public office.

Boys on completing the 19th year of their age, or on receiving appointments, will be removed from the list.

8. From these lists the Civil Service Commissioners, on the application of Departments having vacancies, will supply, on probation, the requisite Clerks, whether for permanent or temporary duty. Selections will, as a general rule, be made by the Civil Service Commissioners according to the order of the names on the list; but the Civil Service Commissioners may select any Clerk who, in his examination, has shown special qualifications in any particular subject, if special application for such a Clerk be made by any Department.

9. No Clerk will remain more than one year in any Department unless at the end of that time the Head of the Department shall signify in writing to the Civil Service Commissioners that the Clerk is accepted by the Department. If he is not accepted, the Department will report to the said Commissioners the reasons for not accepting him; and such Commissioners will thereon supply another Clerk in his room, will decide whether the name of the rejected Clerk shall be struck off the lists as unfit for the Service generally, or whether he shall be allowed a trial in another Department.

10. Boy Clerks will not be retained as such in any Department after completing their 19th year; but they may, after two years (or, if admitted after 17 years of age, one year) of good service, to be certified in writing by the Head of their Department to the Civil Service Commissioners, compete under "Regulation II," among themselves, for so many Men Clerkships of the Lower Division as shall not exceed one fourth of the number of competitors.

Separate lists will be made out of the competitors successful in the limited competitions, and selections for appointments to Men Clerkships will (subject to Regulation 9) be made alternately from these lists and from the lists of competitors successful in the open competitions.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that a Competitive Examination for Boy Clerkships of the Lower Division of the Civil Service will be held in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, on Tuesday and Wednesday, the 12th and 13th July, under the above Regulations. The number of persons to be selected at this examination is 41.

When a vacancy occurs in any one of the cities above mentioned it will be offered to the Candidate highest on the list at the time, but he will not be required to accept it, and quit his place of residence, if he prefers to wait for the chance of obtaining an appointment at that place during his period of eligibility. All the vacancies to which this notice refers will, it is expected, be in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 2nd July, an "application" in the handwriting of the Candidate on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
