Captain Victor J. Yorke, Herschel Native Contingent, killed, April 6; Pathlala Drift. Lieutenant, Royal Anglesea Militia; address, Erdig, Wrexham, North Wales.

Trooper Krohn, Kimberley Horse, Left Wing, suicide, April 10; Thlotse Heights.

Captain L. L. Vincent, 1st Cape Yeomanry, scalp wound, April 11; patrol near Mathlabati Camp.

Private A. Matthews, P.A.V.G., bullet wound in left side, April 11; patrol near Mathlabati Camp.

Private R. Emerson, P.A.V.G., bruise from spent bullet in the back, April 11; patrol near Mathlabati Camp.

Trooper W. Fellowes, Buffalo Mounted Volunteers, flesh wound through calf of left leg, April 11; patrol near Mathlabati Camp.

Trooper Tronko, Mafeteng Contingent, bullet wound in right arm, April 11; patrol near Mathlabati Camp.

Trooper Pieter Erasmus, Transvaal Horse, killed in action, April 10; Thlotse Heights. Transvaal; parents reside in Pretoria.

Private Timotia, Leribe Levy, inflammation of the lungs, April 18; Thlotse Heights. Born in Leribe District; under the Chief Nuia,

Private J. Sells, P.A.V.G., inflammation of the bowels, April 22; Mathlabati Camp.

Private Thomas Smith, Cape Town Rifles, fever, April 22; Mafeteng.

Private Alexander Pinkerton, Cape Town Rifles, fever, April 30; Mafeteng. Next of kin, Mr. W. Wallace, 26, Robertson-street, Glasgow, Scotland.
