- (ii.) have not been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales; and
- (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

(b.) This Article shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, except as regards the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.
