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BERWICK-UPON-TWEED (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 1st day of July, 1881.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 16 of The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Preliminary.

1. This Order may be cited as THE BERWICK-UPON-TWEED (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1881.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the second day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately from the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

3. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

5. Animals may be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed from the District of any Local Authority named in the Schedule to this Order, with a licence in writing of the Local Authority of the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed.

6. Nothing in this Order affects the transit of animals through the District of the Local Authority of the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed by railway, without untrucking.

Offences.

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for

the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. The limits of the area which is described in the Order of Council dated the eleventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and is thereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, namely,—the urban sanitary district of Trowbridge, the parishes of North Bradley, West Ashton, Steeple Ashton, Keevil, Hinton, Semington, Whaddon, and Hilperton, and the tything of Staverton, in the county of Wilts,—are hereby extended so as to include the area described in the First Schedule to this Order, and the area described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The area described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

5. Each of the following areas (namely),—

(1.) From Chilvester Hill along the east side of the road to the Dumb Post at Bremhill, thence along the south side of the road through Bremhill to Lowbridge, from Lowbridge along the south bank of Fisher's brook to the south-east point of an inclosure called Leech Mead, and thence by a straight line to the point at which the boundary of the borough of Calne crosses the road from

Calne to Hillmarton, and from such last mentioned point along the inner side of the highway (parts of which are known by the names of Frog Lane, Wood Street, and Curzon Street, respectively) to Chilvester Hill aforesaid, in the county of Wilts:

On the 12th November, 1880, DR. LOWSON, of Huddersfield, was called to attend Matilda Elizabeth Higginbottom, the child of Police Constable Higginbottom of that town, who was suffering from laryngeal diphtheria, when he performed the operation of tracheotomy. On the following morning, finding the child livid, and breathing with very great difficulty, and tracing that a large quantity of mucus was accumulated in the trachea, he applied his lips to the wound, and, at imminent risk to his own life, afforded relief by suction. Throughout the day he continued to suck out mucus by means of a pipette. Notwithstanding this display of heroism the child died on the third day after the operation. The bill of health should specify the sanitary condition of the country in which it is issued, and should specially mention the presence or absence there of diseases which call for sanitary precautions. It should also give the names of the vessel and of her captain, together with exact particulars of her tonnage, the nature of her cargo, the numbers of her crew and passengers, and the hygienic and sanitary state of matters on board at the time of departure. The bill of health will be accepted only if obtained within forty-eight hours of leaving the port of departure.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

2. The following areas (namely),—(1.) the whole of the Petty Sessional Division of Beacontree; (2.) the parishes of Borley, Bulmer, Great Yeldham, Sturmer, Foxearth, Ovington, Ridgwell, Toppestfield, and Stambourne, in the Petty Sessional Division of Hinckford North; (3.) the hamlet of Bures, in the Petty Sessional Division
